




What's New with BluesEd?

As a founding member of the critically acclaimed progressive roots outfit Moreland and Arbuckle, vocalist/harmonica player Dustin Arbuckle has been working hard on the road for over a decade. After 15 years, 7 albums, and hundreds of shows across 23 countries, Moreland & Arbuckle have


chosen to amicably go their separate ways.

As one door closes, another opens, and Arbuckle is now ready to explore a wide range of music with his two new projects, Haymakers and Dustin Arbuckle & The Damnations. A musician of vast appetites, he's long held an appreciation for traditional American music in the vein of Charley Patton as well as the cross-pollinated sounds of The Band or Stax-style soul.

The Kansas native marks hearing the Leadbelly classic "Gallows Pole" as his earliest music memory, becoming an astute devotee of the blues by the time he'd reached his teens. "That turned out to be a jumping off point, though," he says. "I always loved Howlin' Wolf, but as I got older and started opening my mind to a wider range of music, I'd turn around and listen to the Allman Brothers Band, then Johnny Cash, Sam & Dave, or Tom Petty & The Heartbreakers."

Arbuckle is eager to take to stages with Haymakers and The Damnations. "This is a time to shake things up a bit and see what comes out," he says. "The direction the music will go in isn't set in stone and that's a cool place to be at the moment." "I think this will open new possibilities for songwriting too," he says. "It feels like anything could happen."



James Harman was born and raised in Anniston, Alabama where he quickly picked up on the blues and soul music being played on juke boxes and the radio. He sang in the church choir until age 16 when his family moved to Panama City Florida, where he found himself surrounded by like-minded blues lovers. Wearing a fake moustache, young James slipped into a still segregated nightclub to see Little Junior Parker's show. He was totally overtaken by the blues and soon became a regular, known as "That boy who sings like a man" by patrons.

While still in his teens, he started playing juke joints and dance clubs throughout the South. His performances became legendary-he was "tapped" by talent scouts, signed and taken to Atlanta, Georgia in 1964 to begin his recording career at age 18.

While living in Miami Harman was befriended by fellow record collectors Henry Vestine, Alan Wilson and Bob Hite of Canned Heat, who persuaded him to move to California, promising to help him get re-started. Harman made his move to SoCal in 1970, and true to their word, Canned Heat insisted on Harman's Icehouse Blues Band as their opening act for many big shows. The Icehouse Blues Band soon became regulars at venues such as The Golden Bear, The Ash Grove, The Troubadour and The Lighthouse, which all booked real blues artists.

Harman was soon in demand for his own shows, as well as backing every living blues artist who was touring without a band. He also opened hundreds of shows for artists who did have their own band. Icehouse Blues Band was a real working blues band. In 1978 James tired of using band names and started billing his act as James Harman Band.

Some alumni include Phil Alvin, Bill Bateman, Gene Taylor,

David "Kid" Ramos, Michael "Hollywood Fats" Mann, Stephen Taylor Hodges and Jeff "Big Dad" Turmes. All of these players did long stints in the Harman Band. James is often cited as a band leader who gave many now famous Bluesmen their start.

Nathan James has been James Harman's regular band guitar player since 1997 when he was 19 years old... he turned 37 in 2015 and he's still Harman's favorite! Nathan is also James' recording engineer and co-producer on his own projects, as well as projects they produce for other artists.

Through his long career starting in the early 60's James Harman has built up an enormous song catalog and had 20 of his original songs used in movies and television. He has been nominated for 20 prestigious W.C. Handy (Blues Foundation) awards. He was inducted into the Alabama Music Hall of Fame, and is the harmonica player of choice on many ZZ Top releases, as well as performing live with them on many international TV shows.

Harman was nominated for a Grammy Award, and won two Blues Music Awards for his contribution to the Blind Pig release, "Remembering Little Walter" in 2014. He is a one of a kind song writer, producer, musician, showman, vocalist and internationally known bluesman.

In 2015 his Electro-Fi release "BONETIME" was nominated for an unprecedented five BMA awards: SONG OF THE YEAR, ALBUM OF THE YEAR, TRADITIONAL ALBUM OF THE YEAR, HARMONICA PLAYER and TRADITIONAL BLUES MALE ARTIST OF THE YEAR.



ROBERT KIMBROUGH SR. BLUES CONNECTION

Let's Make This Show a RedOut for the Month of HART!



Robert Kimbrough Sr. continues the Cotton Patch Soul Blues style created by his father, the legendary Junior From Kimbrough. an early age, Robert was steeped in the sounds and life of North Mississippi and its distinctive style of blues. Growing up, Robert listened first-hand to Mississippi blues royalty that played with his father at home, at Junior's Juke Joint Club, and the ever frequent

weekend house party and porch jam session. The blues was simply part of everyday life as a Kimbrough. Robert continues his father's musical tradition, along with some of his siblings. You can often find many of them sharing the stage on any given night in Mississippi. The Kimbrough name, along with the Burnside name, is part of a blues dynasty that remains strong today, bringing people from all over the world to see and hear them play.

The Cotton Patch Soul Blues style that Robert plays is a straight link to the music that his father originated in North Mississippi. It is a deep soul sound that can be linked back to his ancestors coming from the cotton fields, singing and 'hollering' as they worked in the tall rows of Mississippi cotton. This distinct and somewhat underground style of blues is rooted in hypnotic, rhythms and dance-able grooves. The Black Keys released an entire album in 2006 of Junior Kimbrough cover songs called Chulahoma: The Songs of Junior Kimbrough. Up until the mid Eighties, the only way to hear this music was to visit a church-turned-blues-den founded by Junior Kimbrough in Chulahoma, MS that unfortunately burned down in 2000.

Robert Kimbrough Sr. Blues Connection can be seen on the Mississippi blues series "Mojo Hands and Moonshine," Episode 2: Paul MacLeod Has Left The Building. In this episode, blues impresarios Roger Stolle and Jeff Konkel visit the site of Junior Kimbrough's burned down Juke Joint and interview Robert Kimbrough about Junior Kimbrough's music and the music tradition that Robert is carrying on.

Robert released his first CD, Willey Woot, in 2016 and quickly followed that with "What I'm Gon' Do? Where I'm Gon' Go From Here?" He released his third full-length CD, My Frog, in 2016 as well as a live CD, Live From The Hut \mid The

Sons & Friends of Junior Kimbrough, playing with family and friends who were close to Junior Kimbrough.

Robert released his fourth self-produced CD, I Been Fixed, in September 2018. Robert continues the Cotton Patch Soul Blues sound on this release sometimes playing all instruments.

Robert recently held the Second Annual Kimbrough Cotton Patch Blues Festival in Holly Springs, MS: a three-day blues festival with an exhibition at Rust College on The Life and Legacy of Junior Kimbrough, a Cotton Patch Blues Musicians Workshop featuring instructional sessions by those that played with Junior Kimbrough, live performances by many great Hill Country and Cotton Patch Blues artists and a special Kimbrough Cotton Patch Kölsch microbrew beer. This event is held at a bona fide juke joint in Holly Springs, MS dubbed The Hut.

Robert is always busy playing all the big festivals including Juke Joint Fest, North Mississippi Hill Country Picnic, Blues Rules Crissier in Switzerland, Lucerne Blues Festival in Switzerland, Prairie Crossroads Blues Fest in Champaign, IL and continues to share his rare form of crowd-pleasing blues all over the world.



Danielle Nicole's album "Cry No More" has been nominated at the 2019 Grammy Award for Best Contemporary Blues Album! Be sure to catch the Grammys on Sunday February 10th and come out for the show at Chrome Lounge.

Founding member, lead singer, and bass player of Kansas City blues-rock band Trampled Under Foot, Danielle Nicole stepped out on her own in 2015 with her debut album "Wolf Den." In 2018, Nicole returns with a follow-up release "Cry No More" on Concord Records.

"I grew up playing the blues, and the blues is still a big part of what I do. But now I'm reaching out more and trying different things. It still sounds like me, but I'm stretching out a lot more than I have previously."

Nicole's distinctive, inventive bass work which resulted in her becoming the first woman to win the Blues Foundation's 2014 Blues Music Award for Best Instrumentalist, Bass is the product of years of intensive roadwork. Although she had no

experience with the instrument when she became Trampled Under Foot's bassist, now she can't imagine life without it.

"When I started doing my solo thing," she continues, "someone asked me if I was gonna hire a bass player. No, of course not! I originally picked up the bass to keep Trampled Under Foot a family band, but I really fell in love with it. It was a huge challenge, and it still is. But I really love being part of the groove and getting to sing on top of that. I had learned some stuff on acoustic guitar before I started playing bass, but I never really felt connected to it the way I do with the bass. It's empowering, walking onto a stage full of grown men who can play their asses off, and it's 'OK, I'm gonna play this bass, we're gonna do this, and it's gonna rock."

Rounding out her band are longtime Danielle Nicole Band guitarist and multi-instrumentalist Brandon Miller, and her older brother Kris Schenebelen [Trampled Under Foot] on drums.

"I think that it's a good time for the kind of thing I'm doing," she states. "From my years of playing blues festivals, I've seen that younger and younger audiences are getting into the blues. I think that people want to hear authentic music again."


