

#### 2018 Blues Blast Music Awards Winner for Rising Star and Best Debut Album!

The love of blues grew in Heather's heart from a young age where she was fortunate enough to participate in the BluesEd program based out of her hometown, Omaha, NE. Through the program she gained knowledge of the business from national and international blues musicians. All of whom challenged her to put her skills to the test and see

how far hard work would take her.

Heather began to teach herself how to play guitar, eventually booking acoustic shows around Omaha. Her songwriting turned towards folk, but she couldn't seem to shake off her blues roots. After a few years of performing on her own she began to look for musicians with whom she could share her passion. The search brought her to Kansas City in 2015 where she wrote, toured, and recorded with another well known KC based band as the rhythm guitarist and vocalist. She spent two years traveling, gaining a swift cascade of fans across the nation and learning what all she could. Her dedication gained her momentum as a powerhouse vocalist and solid rhythm player before deciding it was time to step out into a spotlight of her own.

At the beginning of 2017, Heather made preparations to begin building an empire of her own, not only with a new instrument in tow, but a new band as well. After taking the time to tighten the inner workings of her music, the Heather Newman Band had their debut at legendary Knucklehead's Saloon. The blues trio continued making strides as the year progressed, eventually adding a fourth member to bring a new level to the Heather Newman Band. Heather released her first studio album, "Burn Me Alive" through Vizztone Label Group at the beginning of December 2017. With the strong leading melodies of Keith Ladd on guitar and Ryan Matthew on Piano/Organ, Heather's steady grooving bass lines lock in Cole Dillingham's deep rooted beats, this group produces a one of a kind medley of various styles such as soul, funk, blues, and rock, with a killer original set. Heather's ever flowing, sultry, emotional vocals makes every show exciting and unique, keeping her loving fans coming back for more.

### Blues In the Afternoon with Mike Jacobs marks 25 years

The BSO sends out a big congrats to Mike Jacobs for Keeping the Blues Alive at KIOS 91.5 for 25 years.



Mike Jacobs has hosted Blues in the Afternoon on KIOS-FM since its inception on October 4, 1994. Since that time, he has produced more than 500 shows and featured more than 8,000 songs.

The theme music at the beginning of the program, "Juke" by Little Walter, has become a familiar introduction to the weekly show.

Jacobs became interested in Blues when he was a student at Technical High School, which is where the KIOS studios are now located.

His interest in the music of Eric Clapton and the Rolling Stones led him to the Blues artists who inspired them and a deeper appreciation and understanding of the genre.

He honed his broadcasting skills as a student of the broadcasting program at Tech and was a member of its last graduating class (1984). Jacobs went on to study broadcasting at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, where he produced a Friday afternoon Blues program at the student run station KBLZ. In addition to working at KIOS-FM, Jacobs has also worked at several Omaha area commercial radio stations as on-air talent.

At the age of 53, Jimmy D. Lane has already led quite a full life. The musicians he knows makes for an impressive resume.

He has worked with Eric Clapton, Mick Jagger, Jim Keltner, Keith Richards, B.B. King, Van Morrison, Jonny Lang, Gary Moore, Double Trouble, Taj Mahal, Stephen Stills, Jeff Healey, Jimmie Lee Robinson, Lowell Fulson, and Snooky Pryor, Kim Wilson, Pinetop Perkins, Johnny 'Big Moose' Walker, Johnnie Johnson, Kim Wilson, Robert Plant, Jimmy Page, Harry Hypolite, George 'Wild Child' Butler, David 'HoneyBoy' Edwards, Weepin' Willie Robinson, Little Hatch, Nancy Bryan, Willie Kent, Henry Gray, Lazy Lester and Eomot RaSun. He has also worked with venerable blues greats such as Sam Lay, Hubert Sumlin, Carey Bell, Dave Meyers and his father, the legendary Jimmy Rogers.


Born July 4th, 1965 in Chicago, he grew up in a household where he became acquainted with a veritable who's who of Chicago bluesmen. Muddy Waters, Howlin' Wolf, Willie Mabon, Little Walter and Albert King, to name a few, would all stop by the house to visit the "old man." Coming from this environment has instilled in Lane the deepest respect for elder statesmen of the blues. "I feel blessed and fortunate, to have known all those cats, and I do not take it for granted."

In 1983, Lane had a life changing experience. "I was laying on the bed with the headset on, trying to figure out what to do with my life, and that song, "Hey Joe" (the Hendrix version) came on the radio and I heard that song like I've never heard it before".

At that time, Jimmy knew exactly what to do. He took his last \$59 to a pawnshop, bought a Harmony guitar and learned "Hey Joe" by ear. For the next four years he worked construction and roofing jobs, but would spend every other waking moment playing guitar. He would play along to blues as well as AC/DC and Journey records.

By 1987 Lane was good. He became lead guitarist of the Jimmy Rogers Band as well as forming his own band, Jimmy D. Lane and The Hurricanes and later Blue Train Running. Lane toured extensively with his dad's band while juggling his own solo career.

Today, Jimmy D. Lane continues touring and performing nationally and internationally...receiving an astounding re-



ception the world over. Lane is a passionate blues singer, songwriter and guitarist with a deep respect for "all those older cats who were there".

#### SEDASTIAN LANE Jimmy D. Lane's Son

Sebastian Lane is a fierce young guitarist whose roots dig deep into music history. He is the grandson of Blues Hall of Fame legend, Jimmy Rogers, who gained prominence as the guitarist for Muddy Waters before starting his independent career with Chess Records. Sebastian's father is

blues-rock hall of fame artist Jimmy D. Lane.

But, the truly fascinating thing about Sebastian Lane is that music is actually just his side hobby. His day job is balancing a future career in medicine. He is currently a medical student at The University of Nebraska Medical Center and will graduate with his M.D. in 2019.

Sebastian has played for several different artists throughout his career before deciding to focus on his own music where he now plays with the Sebastian Lane Band. This group is a modern age blues-rock group with the goal of keeping fun live music around and exposing the genre to their peers while playing music that every generation can appreciate. The group features Ben Curran on lead and rhythm guitar, Dain Armbrust on Bass, and Kevin Fries on drums. All of these musicians made their start through the Omaha Blues Society and their program called BluesEd. Ben currently studies guitar and was accepted into Berklee College of music. Both Dain and Kevin have made a name for themselves playing for several different Omaha and Lincoln based blues bands over the years.

### US AND THEM Us and Them Blues Band - BluesEd Representatives

Us and Them Blues Band was selected to perform at the 2017 International Blues Challenge Youth Showcase in Memphis as a part of the Blues Society of Omaha's BluesEd program. The 10 members of Us and Them are experienced and award winning musicians ranging in age from 11 to 17. They play an infectious show of Blues Rock emphasizing the traditional Blues values of soul, groove and improvisation.

The band is well known and popular in the Omaha metropolitan area and has performed at local festivals and venues such as Playing with Fire, Jazz on the Green, Chrome Lounge, The Ozone, and Bel Air Blues Festival, They have also played for benefits such as the Red Cross, Support the Troops, ALS Walkathon, Suicide Prevention Walk and many others.

Michael Charles began his musical pilgrimage over five decades ago in his homeland Melbourne, Victoria Australia.

While enjoying a successful musical crusade of touring, recording, and numerous television and radio appearances in his homeland, Michael received an invitation from Buddy Guy's management to appear at the infamous Legends in Chicago, Illinois USA. Graciously accepting the honor, Michael Charles traveled the twelve thousand five hundred miles and took the stage with Mr. Buddy Guy. After numerous trips back and forth, Michael Charles made the monumental and life changing decision to make America his new home. Charles worked the whole Chicago blues circuit performing with Mr. Buddy Guy, Phil Guy, James Cotton, Eddy Clearwater, Junior Wells, George Baze, as well as touring with blues legend, Jimmy Dawkins.

Through the next twenty plus years, and now a **eight times Grammy nominated artist**, Michael Charles enjoyed being featured in numerous television and radio broadcasts and several music magazines, along with gracing countless stages and pages including Chicago Blues Fest, Philadelphia Jazz and Blues Fest, Windy City Live Television, WGN TV, JBTV, The Chicago Tribune, The Chicago Sun Times, and The College Music Journal.

In October of 2015 Michael Charles received the extreme honor of an induction into the Blues Hall of Fame. Michael has received endorsements from Vertex and LR Baggs and in Canada from Godin / Seagull Guitars. Michael Charles' discography is comprised of thirty-two releases including a double CD thirty year anthology released in 2014 and the live CD "Concert at the Nest", released in the winter of 2015. In 2016 an Australian film producer started work on a documentary chronicling the musical career of Michael

Charles. The DVD will be released in spring of 2018.

At this time Michael Charles is traveling his eleventh consecutive tour in 2018, the A to Z Tour, which will once again take him to the far corners of the USA, Canada, and Australia. The 2018 Tour promises a multitude of concerts and publicity appearances as MC performs a whole new list of cities, festivals, and nightspots and revisits some favorite venues from the last ten tours.

As always and with all Michael Charles's performances and recordings, his guitar is kept forefront and is the driving force behind his music.

# COCO MONTOYA



Returning to Alligator with his new album, Hard Truth, Montoya delivers one career-topping performance after another, the music immediately ranking among the best he's ever recorded. Produced by drummer Tony Braunagel (Eric Burdon, Curtis Salgado, Taj Mahal, Bonnie Raitt), the album features eleven songs, each delivering a hard truth of its own. From the radio-friendly, gospel-inspired celebration of love, "I Want To Shout About It," to the haunting "Devil Don't Sleep" to the icy-hot cover of Albert Collins' "The Moon Is Full," Hard Truth covers a lot of emotional ground. Montoya's unpredictable guitar playing and smoking soul vocals blend effortlessly with a backing band featuring renowned musicians including bassist Bob Glaub (Bob Dylan, Bruce Springsteen, Jerry Lee Lewis), keyboardist Mike Finnigan (Jimi Hendrix, Etta James, Taj Mahal), guitarists Billy Watts (Eric Burdon) and Johnny Lee Schell (Bonnie Raitt), and Braunagel on drums. Slide guitar master Lee Roy Parnell guests on "Lost In The Bottle."

Henry "Coco" Montoya was born in Santa Monica, California, on October 2, 1951, and raised in a working class family. Growing up, Coco immersed himself in his parents' record collection. He listened to big band jazz, salsa, doo-wop and rock 'n' roll. His first love was drums; he acquired a kit at age 11. He got a guitar two years later. "I'm sure the Beatles had something to do with this," Montoya recalls. "I wanted to make notes as well as beats." But guitar was his secondary instrument. Montoya turned his love of drumming into his profession, playing in a number of area rock bands while still in his teens and eventually becoming an in-demand drummer.

In 1969, Montoya saw Albert King opening up a Creedence Clearwater Revival/Iron Butterfly concert at the Shrine Audito-



rium in Los Angeles. He was transformed. "After Albert got done playing," says Montoya, "my life was changed. When he played, the music went right into my soul. It grabbed me so emotionally that I had tears welling up in my eyes. Nothing had ever affected me to this level. He showed me what music and playing the blues were all about. I knew that was what I wanted to do."

Then fate took over. In the early 1970s, Albert Collins was booked to play a matinee at the same small club in Culver City, California

where Montoya had played the night before. The club owner gave Collins permission to use Montoya's drums. Montoya continues the story: "I show up to pick up my equipment and I see that someone had been playing my drums and I got a little angry with the club owner. So Albert called me up at the club and was real nice and apologetic. I went down to see his show and it just tore my head off. The thing that I had seen and felt with Albert King came pouring back on me when I saw Albert Collins."

A few months later, Collins desperately needed a drummer for a tour of the Northwest and he called Coco. "When he called," recalls Coco, "I figured we'd rehearse for a few weeks before the tour. Instead, he told me he'd pick me up in three hours." During the tour, Albert took Montoya under his wing, teaching him about blues music and life on the road. After the tour ended, Montoya remained in the band for five more years. It was during this time that Coco began doubling on guitar. And Albert went out of his way to teach him. "We'd sit in hotel rooms for hours and play guitar," remembers Montoya. "He'd play that beautiful rhythm of his and just have me play along. He was always saying, 'Don't think about it, just feel it.' He taught me to tap into an inner strength. What a great gift he gave me." As Montoya's guitar playing improved, his relationship with the blues legend kept growing. "He was like a father to me," says Coco, who often crashed at Collins' home. When he declared Montoya his "son," it was the highest praise and affection he could offer. In return, Montoya learned everything he could from the legendary "Master of the Telecaster." Montoya often pays tribute to his mentor, recording a Collins song on almost every album he's made. But he will only cover an Albert Collins song if he can make it his own. "One of the things Albert taught me is to interpret a song your own way," Montoya says. "He was never impressed with people who would imitate him note for note."

Back home on Alligator with **Hard Truth**, Montoya will hit the highway, playing his heart out night after night for fans hungry for the real thing. Still an indefatigable road warrior, Montoya continues to pack clubs and theaters around the world, and brings festival audiences to their feet from New York to New Orleans to Chicago to San Francisco. Across the globe, he's performed in countries including Australia, Belgium, Switzerland, Germany, Norway, England, Brazil, Argentina, Spain, Mexico, Ecuador, Italy, Poland, Russia, Czech Republic and Canada. *Vintage Guitar* says, "Coco just keeps getting better and better... rockin' blues with guitar that cuts straight to the heart of the matter. His guitar playing is funky and blistering; it's perfect. Whatever he plays, he does it with fire and passion rarely seen in this day and age."




The celebrated guitarist has played on records by Clarence Clemmons, Franke & The Knockouts, Joe Lynn Turner and STARZ, and produced the 60's hit act, "THE SHADOWS OF KNIGHT". Live he has played guitar and been the music director for Steve Winwood, Lou Gramm and Country artists Jimmy Wayne, Rodney Atkins and Steve Holy.

Bobby has played or headlined BAMFEST,

The Charleston Blues Festival, Smokin' In Steel, Summerfest, Charlotte Speed Street, Blues Brews & BBQ, Blues At The Beach, Bayfront Blues Festival, Deltaville Seafood Festival, Willow River Blues Fest, Ambassador Blues Fest, Colonial Beach Blues Festival, and Southern Maryland Blues Festival.

The guitarist's last five CD's ("Holdin' Ground"," Bobby Messano Live In Madison", "that's why i don't sing the blues", "Welcome To Deltaville" and "Love & Money") have garnered 26 Grammy 1st Round ballots in 8 categories and airplay on over 275 Blues shows. "that's why i don't sing the blues" was on the American Blues Scene's Blues Top 5 Chart for 24 weeks and was named 2012 TOP BLUES/ROCK ALBUM (USA) by Blues Underground Network.

Between 2012 and 2016, Bobby played over 400 shows in 32 states to over a half million people. On December 22nd




2012, the artist was inducted into the "BLUES HALL OF FAME". His CD's are heard daily on "Sirius/XM's B.B. King's Bluesville and "LOVE & MONEY" which was released in April 2015 was nominated for a prestigious Blues Blast Award for "Best Rock-Blues Album" in August 2015. It debuted on the Billboard Blues Chart at # 7, peaked at #1 and spent a total of nine weeks in the Top 10. It was also #7 on the Billboard Heat Seekers Chart and Top 40 on both the Billboard Rock and Indie Charts. "Love & Money" also ended 2015 at #44 on the Roots Music Report Chart.

Bobby's newest CD "BAD MOVIE" was released on April 15,2017 and debuted at #1 on Sirius/XM BB King's Bluesville and has been in the Top 20 on SIX Roots Music Reports

charts since it's release. It is a collection of fifteen incredible songs written with major co-writers Jon Tiven , Larry Weiss and Steve Kalinich and features the amazing "Come To Your Senses" written by Queen founder Brian May and Jon Tiven and the haunting duet "Water Under The Bridge" with Bobby and Alecia Elliott (2001 AMA Nominee) "BAD MOVIE" offers a unique perspective of personal traumas and a country in a state of flux and the reviews have been outstanding.

Born and raised in St. Louis, Jeremiah Johnson is the voice of Mississippi River blues blending with the struggles of everyday life. He began learning guitar at age 6, drawing inspiration from his rich St. Louis blues heritage and legendary guitarists, like Alvin Lee, Eric Clapton and Hank Williams Sr. and Jr. With these influences, Johnson began building his musical foundation.

After relocating to Houston, TX, in 1999, Johnson finished in first place for three consecutive years at the Houston Regional Blues Challenges, sponsored by the Houston Blues Society. Johnson returned to St. Louis in 2009, and merged Texas style with STL blues to create the unique sound you hear today. The 10 years Johnson lived and performed in Texas changed his musical style in ways you can still hear in his music today.

In 2011, Johnson was the proud winner of the St. Louis Blues Society IBC Challenge and went on to the semifinals to represent St. Louis in Memphis, TN. One year later, Sirius XM's B.B. King's Bluesville picked up the Jeremiah Johnson Band, where they can be heard nationwide, and they have been playing his music ever since. You can also hear Jeremiah Johnson on Touch Tunes Jukeboxes in bars/clubs across the US and on radio stations around the world.

In 2014 Johnson recorded *Grind*, produced by Devon Allman, and featuring Grammy award winner Yonrico Scott on drums. Grind has been featured on SiriusXM's B.B. King's Bluesville, and on the international radio show "Confessing the Blues", broadcasting on 50 stations in 10 countries worldwide. Grind reached the #8 slot on the Billboard Blues Charts the week of November 7th, 2015.

Johnson follows the success of Grind with a self-produced release, *Blues Heart Attack*, released worldwide on July 22, 2016. This unique record is a blend of Johnson's entire

musical career. "It's a combination of our earlier works, and then Grind," he explained. "There's horns and keyboard reminiscent of Brand Spankn' Blues, but also some heavy guitar driven tracks. It's the evolution of everything in a Blues Heart Attack." Special guest performers include Tom 'Papa' Ray on harmonica, and Nathan Hershey on keys. Blues Heart Attack reached #5 on the Billboard Blues Charts following its release in 2016.

Jeremiajh Johnson's new CD release Straitjacket was produced by Mike Zito and is on the Ruf Records label. This 12 song CD is packed full of the Blues Rock with a twist of Country slang you have come to expect from The JJB.

Johnson performs with Benet Schaeffer (drums), Frank Bauer (sax & backing vocals), and Tom Maloney (bass), bringing the Jeremiah Johnson Band to its highest level to date. It's safe to say this is going to be a huge year for the band. 2018 is going to rock!

#### $\star$ $\star$ 2018 BLUES MUSIC AWARD WINNER – BEST ROCK BLUES ARTIST $\star$ $\star$



There may not be a more honest bluesman than Mike Zito, whose 15th album 'First Class Life' comes out May 11 on Ruf Records. The rocking yet poignant title track explores his journey from addiction to sobriety and then musical recognition; he is a two-time 2017 Blues Music Award nominee. "Second chance at a first class life," he sings, recalling the hard times. The Texas-based musician smiles and continues, "I grew up poor in St. Louis, and now I'm travelling the world to sing my songs."

Zito's star has been on the rise of late both solo and as a member of the Royal Southern Brotherhood, with bandmates Cyril Neville, Devon Allman, Charlie Wooton and Yonrico Scott.


As is fitting for a man with the word "Blues" tattooed across his picking hand, 'First Class Life' focuses squarely on blues with heart and chops to spare, not to mention wit and openness. The punchy "Time For A Change" conjures the tension in the world today while the exquisite Memphis-style song, "The World We Live In," which recalls BB King in its world-weariness. The electrified blues bounce of "Dying Day" finds Zito swearing lifelong allegiance to his wife. "Old Black Graveyard" sets the scene of a Bluesman's final resting place and its disrepair, along with some possible supernatural influences, with Zito's masterful slide guitar flourishes driving it home.

Yet the record's darker moments are offset by cuts like "Mama Don't Like No Wah Wah," the funky crash-bang-wallop gem written with Ruf labelmate Bernard Allison about the late legend Koko Taylor. "Bernard told me about his first gig as guitarist for Taylor," laughs Mike. "Koko didn't like any effects on the guitar, she wanted it to sound natural. When Bernard made an attempt to use an effect on his guitar after playing with her for months, he got caught. 'Mama don't like no wah wah' is what he was told. That's a song to me!"

The two guitar slingers trade off, trying to one up each other atop a funky blues groove, including Allison pulling out his forbidden wah wah pedal. The tongue-in-cheek "Back Problems" is a showcase for Zito's wit as a songwriter.

In addition to the press and Blues Music Award love, Zito has earned praise from fellow artists. Anders Osborne says, "I love Mike Zito! He's got that rare kind of voice that resonates in your soul. All his hardship, life experiences and kind heart oozes out of every note he sings. His guitar playing dances delicately between a contemporary blues virtuoso and an old fashion soul man. Mike continues to impress me with his straightforward and honest songwriting. His joy and grace shine through on every record he makes. "

The toy drive started in 2003 with Larry Dunn – an Omaha musician also known as Lash LaRue – a friend and a small pick-up truck. Dunn had become acutely aware of the extreme need of the residents after spending time on the reservation.

The U.S. Census Bureau lists Pine Ridge as the most poverty-stricken area in the United States. It isn't unusual to see frost on the inside of reservation homes during the harsh South Dakota winters. Food and heat are often scarce.

Medical care is limited and without easy access. Dunn also learned that because of all this, very often the children of Pine Ridge had no holiday gifts. Each year has added more concerts and other events, such as a radiothon and concerts outside Omaha. Because of the growth of the Toy Drive, Dunn expanded its reach on Pine Ridge -- providing resources to a medical clinic on the reservation, resources for the elders, including a heating fund, and educational resources for schoolchildren in Pine Ridge.

What began as one person's wish to provide for children growing up in poverty became an official non-profit organization. An organization that has relied heavily on community donations to assist the residents of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation.

# Heather Newman Wins Two 2018 Blues Blast Music Awards




Congrats to the Heather Newman Band who took home both awards they were nominated for in tonight's Blues Blast Music Awards!

I recently caught Orphan Jon and the Abandoned at the Chrome. I told Jon English that I had never heard a Rip Cat band that I didn't like. He humbly responded that he hoped I wouldn't be disappointed. I wasn't! They put on a very entertaining show.

The cd has a very cool vibe. Many songs have a sort of North Mississippi feel with a hypnotic groove. The musicianship is outstanding throughout with the wonderful slide and over-

all guitar work of Bruce Krupnik in particular standing out.

The lyrics are by Jon English with his wife Carrie co-writing "Memories of Me and You". They are very heart felt. English had been abandoned as a young child and has taken his experiences to show how a person can have such a rough



start and make something positive as a result.

The first cut, "Backbone", has a bit of country blues and gospel feel with some really cool slide work. The third number," Dance For Me Girl", is a slow blues/rock song that I like a lot.
