

## **Brandon Miller Band CD Release Party!**


Thursday, August 6th @ 6 pm (\$10) • Stocks n Bonds, Omaha

Music has always been a part of Brandon Miller's life. From an early age, his dad would let him explore his record collection of Led Zeppelin, Genesis, Aerosmith and other classic rock legends. Miller spent countless days and nights trying to recreate the sounds of his musical heroes. After sculpting his sound for years, he formed the Brandon Miller Band, a powerful, guitar-driven blues-rock trio. Having released two, fullength albums and sharing the stage with artists like Jonny Lang, Foghat, Night Ranger and Eddie Money; Brandon Miller brings a

fiery passion to the guitar that is unlike any other.

Brandon grew up listening to classic rock from the 60s and 70s because of his parents' love for music. Listening to the rock n roll stories of disc jockeys from a famous Kansas City radio station just stirred the fire of his love for music even more. When he first began elementary school, his older brother had begun playing guitar. Brandon would sneak into his brother's room to grab his guitar just to play around with it. Driving his brother mad because of his always wanting to play, Brandon received his first guitar for Christmas when he was seven.

Shortly after he turned thirteen in seventh grade, the music bug bit him deeply and over the summer his talent exploded. He would sit and practice for hours upon hours. Some



days he would practice up to ten hours, and soon he was recreating what before he couldn't. He began going to blues jam sessions around Kansas City where he began to gain popularity with his audiences in large part due to his young age and immense talent. Quickly he realized that his age always presented some problems when clubs and bars would not let him into play until they witnessed his precocious ability first hand. At these jams, he met some of the most influential musicians in his career. With these musicians, he discovered his true love blues.

He could be found during his middle school years not listening to what was popular at school dances or on the pop radio stations, but listening to legendary blues artists such as Robert Johnson, Albert King, Freddie King, Howlin Wolf, Muddy Waters, John Lee Hooker, and many more. One artist stuck out the most, Stevie Ray Vaughan. Listening to how he put all of his emotions into his playing inspired Brandon to do the same to spread the blues and bring it back to Kansas City.

Brandon currently performs with his own band as well as the Danielle Nicole Band.

Brandon is touring in support of his new CD Virtue and Vice which will be released on July 31st.

Swampboy Blues Band blends music and life with a spontaneity that is contagious! Whether playing traditional Blues, Country, or Americana, Swampboy Blues Band's music is unique and accessible; with originality and a familiar flair.

Swampboy, Timothy Koehn, lends his talents on guitar and vocals. A Wisconsin native raised on music, Timothy has been playing his unique blend of blues for over a decade in the Omaha metro area. After spending a year writing and playing music in Lake Charles, Louisiana in 2005 and 2006, Tim returned to Omaha and the Swampboy Blues Band had its beginning.

As host of SWAMPJAM, (an open jam that has moved around Omaha over the last seven years), Timothy has played mu-

sic with hundreds of local musicians and with numerous touring bands coming through town. Since then Timothy has performed in and around Nebraska, Iowa, Wisconsin and Colorado.

Sondra Clarke is a vocal powerhouse with a voice that conveys the feel of a smoke-filled juke joint. Don't let this self-proclaimed soccer mom fool you; her bluesy, jazzy voice is infused with her Midwest roots but hearkens back to her Alabama and Carolina family roots. In Sondra's own words, "Music is the air I breathe; my expression of joy and sorrow; Music is life."

Jerry Steinke on Bass Guitar/Vocals is a local veteran of the Omaha Music scene. Jerry was a member of "B and the Hot Notes" and "David Barger and the Jam Masters" and countless other projects. Jerry has been in bands that opened for Steppenwolf, The Clash, Los Lobos and Wayne Cochran. Jerry has been playing Bass for over 50 years.

Greg McWhorter is on percussion. He hails from such renowned local bands as "The Johnsen Brothers."

Frank Lightell on the Saxophone is a classically trained musician and holds a bachelor of fine arts in music from the University of Nebraska. Frank has performed as a soloist with the Omaha Symphony Orchestra and with artists from "Tom Scott" to the "Radio City Rockettes". Frank has been a member of a number of local groups over the years, including "The Confidentials", "Finest Hour", "The Mighty Jailbreakers" and "Blue House."

Asked to describe the music Brody Buster performs night in and night out, no matter how he is doing it with his band or his one-man band, it's always "Kick-Ass Countrified Roots Rock & Roll!"

When Brody Buster was 7 years old, he picked up one of his mother's old harmonicas and began to teach himself how to play this wonderful instrument. Yet, did he know in a short time he would be jamming on Beale Street in Memphis, Tennessee. He shared the stage with the who's who of the blues world and musical legends during the 8-year stretch. Playing worldwide as well being a featured performer at BB King's Blues Club on a regular basis. He took the blues world by storm and has played with Quincy Jones, Chaka Khan, Keb Mo, Lee Oskar and many other greats.

Blues Legend BB King took high interest in Brody's talent in doing so let this young blues prodigy join him several times over a few years. BB King was quoted saying that, "Despite his young age, Brody Buster is one of the greatest harmonica players of our time."

Buster, who has settled in Lawrence, has grown as a multi-talented artist and continues to make his style of countrified Roots Rock-n-Roll for the masses. Brody found himself back in Memphis, Tennessee in 2017. This time he brought his shine to the International Blues Challenge for the Kansas City Blues Society as a solo performer. Yet, he had no expectation in winning this blues music competition that host over 150 performers from around the world.



He had been toying with this new project he called the one-man band. It's Brody, his Electric Guitar, Harp, Snare and Kick-drum "Kickin Ass" with his high-energy Countrified Roots Rock-n-Roll music. So, he showed the masses in Memphis that he still has what it takes to be an "ELECTRI-FYING" musical talent. This now adult multi-talented musician made his way to the finals then stole the show...Quoted by Rick Booth "the most talented musician he saw there". In the last few years Brody has released many band and solo CD's so, he looks forward to getting back in the studio to make more great music and build on this next journey in his musical career. In 2017, he toured the U.S and Canada highlights at the Montreal Jazz Fest, Tremblant International Blues Festival, Bronze Blues and Brews in Oregon, Tall City Blues Fest in Texas, Paola Blues Fest and countless venues.

Thank you guys. Omaha in particular is a place I am bummed to miss. We love Omaha, you guys are real music fans there. And such cool people.


## WELCOMING A NEW SECRETARY AS OFFICER FOR BSO
