



Since 2003, Omaha rockabilly musician Larry Dunn has organized annual events to collect and deliver Christmas toys for the needy children of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota. Money also is donated to the emergency heating

fund to help the elders during the cold winter months. Pine Ridge's Lakota Sioux community is one of the most poverty stricken communities in the United States. Less than a day's drive from Omaha, families struggle in third-world conditions. The children of the reservation are desperately in need of hope and cheer, especially during a time of cold, harsh winds and the immense desolation of winters on the reservation. The majority of gifts for the children are collected at benefit concerts put on by area musicians. This year the toy drive is focusing on one large benefit concert in place of several small ones. Every dime raised goes toward buying additional gifts and stockings. The Toy Drive for Pine Ridge covers all administrative fees, the cost of transporting the toys to the reservation, and any additional travel expenses. The Toy Drive for Pine Ridge is a 501c3 non-profit organization and all donations are tax deductible.

Mato Nanji and Indigenous began playing local Omaha bars, and Nanji now is recognized as a major talent and accomplished guitarist in the blues-rock world. The latest recording by Indigenous, Vanishing Americans, is a tribute to Mato's late father and his band. Released May 21, 2013, the CD promptly found its place on iTunes Top 10 Blues Chart. Blues Rock



Review said on June 5: "Each song is brought together with heavy and powerful guitar riffs akin to those of Carlos Santana and Jimi Hendrix, while bellowing, raspy vocals turn a talented guitarist's vision into a relatable song for many, just as any praiseworthy blues album should."

Nanji was born and raised on the Yankton Lakota Reservation in South Dakota. Mato's father, the late Greg Zephier, Sr., was a well-known and highly respected spiritual advisor and spokesperson for the International Indian Treaty Council. In addition to this leadership role, he was an accomplished musician and a member of the musical group, The Vanishing Americans, which he formed with his brothers in the '60's. With the experience, love and wisdom of their father to guide them, Mato, his brother, sister and cousin formed the band Indigenous while in their late teens and they began touring extensively across the country. In 1998, they released their award winning debut album, *Things We Do.* The title track's video, directed by Chris Eyre (*Smoke Signals*), won the American Indian Film Festival Award and was shown at the prestigious Sundance Film Festival.

Since then, Nanji has released over ten acclaimed recordings. In addition to his Indigenous 'day job', Mato Nanji has been a member of the annual Experience Hendrix Tour Band since 2002. Playing alongside original Jimi Hendrix band members Billy Cox and the late Mitch Mitchell, the tour roster includes some of today's blues greats including Chris Layton and Tommy Shannon (Double Trouble), Jonny Lang, Kenny Wayne Shepherd, Eric Johnson, and Robert Randolph. Following their 2012 Experience Hendrix Tour, Nanji collaborated with two of his fellow EHT band mates, David Hidalgo (Los Lobos) and Luther Dickinson (North Mississippi Allstars), delivering the hard-driving, blues-infused 3 Skulls and the Truth.

Currently touring as in support of *Vanishing Americans* as a power-trio with musicians Derek Post and Charles Sanders, Mato's performance at the Toy Drive for Pine Ridge concert offers local fans a chance to enjoy a long-overdue appearance by this Midwest favorite.



Some artists take pride in the complexity — and even the inaccessibility — of their music, but that's not Nikki Hill's style.

The St. Louis blues and R&B singer doesn't care for pretension of any kind and says her job is to entertain by any means possible. Hill's music doesn't dabble in philosophy; the only question it attempts to answer is: "Will this make people dance?"

"I don't need my music to be an intellectual thing," said Hill, who will perform tonight at Bloomington's Castle Theatre. "It satisfies on a deeper level. We try to put on a show that is entertaining, first and foremost, and is the kind of thing the audience can't see every day. But making people move and dance is the No. 1 priority for me."

Hill speaks like a performer who has been doing her thing for ages, but in reality, she's still fairly new to the St. Louis music scene. She followed her guitar player husband, Matt Hill, to the Midwest from her home in Durham, N.C., with the thought of a music career in mind. She turned that thought into a full-time job in less than a year. As of today, she's only been performing publicly for less than two years, but in that time, she's become a respected member of St.

Louis' ever-thriving blues community with many appearances at venues such as the Blues City Deli and B.B. King's Jazz, Blues and Soups.

"The music scene in St. Louis leans heavy toward blues, urban R&B and blues-rock kind of groups," she said. "We latched onto that immediately, and it fit us really well."

"Rock" is the preferred term that Hill uses as a catch-all for her music, but she draws on many other influences from the world of American roots music. More than anything, she likes to think of the band's overall sound as being inspired by American tradition.

"The basis of American music is blues, jazz, country, gospel and rock music," she said. "We try to touch and blend all of that into a celebration of American music."

The link between all those seemingly disparate inspirations is the "energy and execution, the intensity of emotions," according to Hill. When she recorded her debut EP, which was released in June 2012, the singer strove to keep in mind everything she loved about singers such as Little Richard or Mavis Staples and make it her own, writing all her own material.

"For me, when I listen to my favorite singers ... it makes me forget about my troubles and feel like I know them personally," she said. "It's really tough trying to live up to that with your own songs, but the work is well worth it. Every successful moment means 1,000 times more because you're doing it yourself. Nothing valuable comes without putting some effort into it."

Hill is thankful for the ongoing resurgence of classic R&B and soul in American popular music, and although she thinks of herself as significantly more "old-school" than the so-called neo-soul singers rising into the spotlight, she knows it has helped her turn heads and capture attention.

"It's really nice seeing the mainstream attention with classic R&B, and I hope the fans continue to grow with it and evolve it," she said. "But with myself, we're just trying to entertain, survive and make good music."



Join Us For The Official IBC Send-Off Party For JOSH HOYER & THE SHADOWBOXERS

As the winners of the Nebraska Blues Challenge they will be going to the International Blues Challenge in Memphis January 21st through the 25th.

This is the 30th annual IBC, with nearly 200 bands representing Blues societies from all over the U.S. as well as some International bands.

This is one of their last shows before they head to Memphis, come out and check out what they're taking to the big dance on Beale Street. This is a Big band, staying in Memphis Hotels isn't cheap, as they say let's help them put some gas in the tank.





When we think of Blues, we think of Chicago, Memphis, Clarksdale, St. Louis; Israel definitely does not come to mind. The Ori Naftaly Band is out to change that with their new album, *Happy For Good*. Issued on their own label (The Ori Naftaly Band), the album clocks in at just over 40 minutes and does not disappoint.

The Ori Naftaly Band is Ori Naftaly – guitars, Yam Regev – drums, Eran Szendri – bass, Keyboards – Niv Hovav, and Eleanor Tsaig – vocals. Production by Ori Naftaly is excellent, and the mix by Yaacov Moreno is spot on, giving the music depth, and a rich texture.

Standout tracks on the album include "Set Me Free," which is slow, smooth, delicious, and features a smokey vocal from Eleanor Tsaig. "Envy" begins with a nice bass lead-

in, and when the rest of the band kicks in, they transport us back to the '70s for some guitar filled, funky grooves. "Taxi Driver" has a more country flavor, with a fast pace, and some fine guitar picking from Naftaly. "Dreamin', Pleadin', Wonderin'" is a slow, heady blues that will have you woozy with its slow club vibe, and jazzy Stevie Ray Vaughan influenced guitar lines. This is truly a masterful performance! The title cut, "Happy For Good," is a feel good, vibrant piece, that doesn't get lost in pop sound and polish, and the guitars give it a garage jam quality that fits the song perfectly. "I Feel Fine" is what Stevie Ray Vaughan might have sounded like if he had taken a more funk and jazz infused direction. The combination of organ rifts, bass lines, and steady drumming, along with bluesy guitar lines that have a jazzy edge, all topped off with Tsaig's great soulful vocal, take this cut over the top.

If this is what blues is like in Israel, we want more! This is a solid album that is full of texture, soul, and righteous blues. Bring this album home today, throw on a good set of headphones, and get lost in it. You won't regret it.





Ana Popovic Can You Stand the Heat

Ana Popovic's new cd, "Can You Stand the Heat", was recorded in Memphis. The band includes the Bo-Keys on horns, John Williams on bass from Al Green's group, Tony Coleman on drums from B. B. King's group, and Harold Smith on rhythm guitar also from B. B. King's group.

Most of the cuts are originals, and they are recorded in an old school funk style. This is an evolution for Popovic, but she still displays the scorching guitar style she is known for, with the horns on many cuts giving the cd a Memphis soul feel.

This cd will not displease Popovic's old fans, and it should garner her new followers while displaying a more soulful side. It demonstrates her development as a singer, showing she can be subtle, as on slow songs like Robert Palmer's, "Every Kind of People".

Popovic is exploring expanding her repertoire. She has been successful. There is growth as an artist, and she shows she can experiment while still keeping all the fire that drew fans to her in the first place.


