Chambers hails from Houston, Texas. As a child, she always wanted to sing, but her dreams of enlisting in the Army and attaining a degree in radio and TV broadcasting took her on a slight detour.

Since completing her 71/2 year term with the US Army, Annika has blazed onto the Houston blues music scene. With her self-motivated career taking the city by storm, Annika has had the opportunity to work with many of the well-known talents in the area such as Brad Absher, Paul Ramirez, The Mighty Org, and many others.

Annika along with The House Rules Band entered the 2012 International Blues Competition making the final round, and giving her numerous opportunities to showcase her talent. After the competition, Annika took advantage of an opportunity to create a demo CD with Larry Fulcher of the Phantom Blues Band and Richard Cagle, both of whom were judges for the IBC Competition.

To everyone's surprise, this has turned into what will be a professionally produced album from Montrose Studios. The album "Making My Mark" features numerous Grammy award winning musicians and artists who graciously offered their time and patience to make this a project a success.

There is no preparation the world can take for the debut of



Annika Chambers' "Making My Mark." So take a moment and enjoy the Annika Chambers experience and make sure you do what she says when she says "Shake it for Me!"

Annika was awarded the 2013 Houston Press Award for Best Female Vocals. She was also nominated in the Best Blues category with several other great musicians of the city.


What's New with BluesEd?

ANTHONY GOMES

Anthony Gomes, #1 Billboard Blues Artist, is a triple threat force as a guitarist, vocalist and songwriter. Blues Revue Magazine recently declared that, "Gomes' formidable guitar chops and authentic singing place him in the forefront of modern blues." This,

along with his high-energy shows and dynamic stage presence, make him one of the top draws on the Rock/Blues circuit today. Gomes has headlined concerts in 17 countries and has had the honor of sharing the stage with B.B. King, Buddy Guy, Robert Plant, Joe Bonamassa, Heart, Jonny Lang and Kenny Wayne Shepherd.

Word of Gomes' electrifying performances has reached Eric Clapton, Morgan Freeman, John Goodman, Toby Keith, Jonny Lang, Ron White and Vince Vaughn who have all attended Gomes' concerts. After experiencing Gomes live, John Goodman referred to him as "a pure soul brother" and comedian Ron White declared his official endorsement of Anthony Gomes. Perhaps the greatest complement was offered by Morgan Freeman who jokingly professed that Anthony was, "not bad for a white boy."

In addition to performing, Gomes is an award winning blues history scholar, earning the University of Toronto's C.P. Stacey Award for the highest overall academic grade point average by a history major. Anthony completed his master's degree thesis on the racial and cultural evolution of blues music, graduating with high distinction.

Believing that music can inspire the human spirit, Anthony founded the Music Is The Medicine Foundation in 2010. This non-profit organization is dedicated to changing the lives of others through the healing power of music. Through private donations and winning sizable grants from State Farm Insurance and CVS Pharmacy, the foundation has funded songwriting scholarships, offered music education programs, and donated musical instruments to those in need.

Born in Toronto, Canada to a Portuguese father and a French-Canadian mother, Gomes began playing guitar in his early teens and was drawn to the blues sounds of B.B. King, Buddy Guy, Eric Clapton and Jimi Hendrix.

He relocated to Chicago in the late '90s to learn from the blues masters. During his brief stint as a sideman for Magic Slim and the Teardrops, Gomes put together his own group and won the first annual Buddy Guy's Legends "Best Unsigned Blues Band" competition in 1998. Later that year, Gomes released his debut CD, Blues in Technicolor, which introduced him as a guitar-slinger loaded with impressive



firepower.

On 2002's Unity, he accomplished the album's title with a heavy mix of styles leading Bandit Blues Radio to name it one of the "Top 30 Essential Blues CDs" of all time. Gomes was elevated to the top of the blues field just one year later when Blues-Wax Magazine named him "Artist of the Year," an award he would claim for several years in a row due to his endless commitment and touring. Music Is the Medicine (2006) peaked at number four on the Billboard Top Blues Albums chart, only to be

outdone by LIVE (2008) debuting at number one. In 2012, Gomes received critical acclaim for his release of Up 2 Zero. The album was named the "Best Blues CD of 2012" by A1 Blues.com and the Blues Underground Network voted the album "Best Blues Rock CD of 2012." The accolades continued in 2013 with the release of Gomes' gusty acoustic album ...Before The Beginning. Blues 411 honored the release with the "Jimi Award" for best Blues/Rock CD of 2013 and it continues to make many "Best Albums of the Year" lists.

Gomes shows no signs of slowing down with the 2015 release of Electric Field Holler, a guitar driven blues infused rock 'n' roll album that showcases Gomes' blistering six string work and whiskey soaked voice. "I feel like this will be our pinnacle year in terms of creativity and artistic achievement," says Gomes, "it's time to turn it up."

If it were possible to personify the essence of the jamband world its past, present, and future could be embodied by one Bruce Katz. A natural student of music since his childhood, he has spent his life learning and interpreting every major form of American music, much like Jerry Garcia once did. Day to day, he can be found recording or touring with a multitude of artists who have come to depend on his mastery of his art, as he moves amongst the rarified air that exists for artists such as Warren Haynes and Derek Trucks. And as an associate professor at the storied Berklee College of Music in Boston, he works with the coming generations, sharing hard-won wisdom from years of touring while modeling true devotion to the art form. In this regard, he has few peers; perhaps the future he's working toward will see a wiser, more devoted class of musicians.

Whether you've heard of Bruce Katz or not, his star continues to rise across eras and genres, and his light is currently shining brightly in the land of peaches and peace.

Besides leading the Bruce Katz Band, Bruce performs regularly with the Delbert McClinton Band, Jaimoe's Jasssz Band, John Hammond, and other artists as well. He was a member of the Gregg Allman Band from 2007–2013.

To paraphrase Warren Haynes, "all of our heroes are strange dichotomies," and Katz surely fits such a mold. For a man who wears so many hats so well, Katz speaks with earthbound wonder when recounting times spent with icons, and humble grace when describing himself and his ambitions. In conversation, his vernacular mixes free-love charm and the precision of man with acute care for facts and history.

Just as the young Bruce dug into his parents' records and found Bessie Smith, Fats Waller and so many treasures Katz

is now the gem waiting for the rest of the world to dig deep and make their own joyful discovery.

We are all very excited about our new album, "Out From The Center", released Sept. 16, 2016 on American Showplace Music. This album is rightfully titled "Bruce Katz Band featuring Chris Vitarello", as Chris really steps out singing on four tunes and writing and co-writing a number of the others.

I am also continuing my musical association with Butch Trucks, one of the founding members of the Allman Brothers Band.

I'm playing in both the Les Brers Band and Butch Trucks and the Freight Train Band, with both bands touring and playing great music. Chris Vitarello has also joined the Freight Train Band!

The toy drive started in 2003 with Larry Dunn – an Omaha musician also known as Lash LaRue – a friend and a small pick-up truck. Dunn had become acutely aware of the extreme need of the residents after spending time on the reservation.

The U.S. Census Bureau lists Pine Ridge as the most poverty-stricken area in the United States. It isn't unusual to see frost on the inside of reservation homes during the harsh South Dakota winters. Food and heat are often scarce.

Medical care is limited and without easy access. Dunn also learned that because of all this, very often the children of Pine Ridge had no holiday gifts. Each year has added more concerts and other events, such as a radiothon and concerts outside Omaha. Because of the growth of the Toy Drive, Dunn expanded its reach on Pine Ridge -- providing resources to a medical clinic on the reservation, resources for the elders, including a heating fund, and educational resources for schoolchildren in Pine Ridge.

What began as one person's wish to provide for children growing up in poverty became an official non-profit organization. An organization that has relied heavily on community donations to assist the residents of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation.

JAMES ARMSTRONG

Guitarist, singer and songwriter James Armstrong was born to play the blues. His mother was a blues singer. His father played jazz guitar. Born in Los Angeles, California, Armstrong formed his first band in the seventh grade and by the age of 17 he was touring the country. Today he travels the world and continues to infuse his voice and guitar playing with his unique personality and seasoned skills.

In his twenties James was the youngest guitar player to play in Smokey Wilson's legendary band. James also helped form a band in Southern California called Mama Roo. That collabora-

tion resulted in an album of the same name, and his first recording contract with Crescendo Records. In the early 90's James got plenty of exposure to his musical influences, including Albert Collins, who spent quality time with James and taught him a few tricks. Shortly after that he was discovered and signed by HighTone Records owner Bruce Bromberg who found Robert Cray, and Joe Louis Walker.

Then, just as he was about to tour with his critically acclaimed first album Sleeping With A Stranger, tragedy struck. The events surrounding a home invasion left Armstrong without the use of his left hand and arm, including permanent nerve damage. This threatened to end his career forever. But, thanks to the support of friends, fans and the blues community Armstrong came back two years later with a second album, Dark Night.

What Armstrong lost in the tragedy he gained in "a whole new respect for the music itself, the power in slow blues, how the silences between the notes are as important as



the notes". Armstrong also turned his efforts to perfecting his songwriting, vocal and slide guitar skills, all the while developing his gift for turning hardship into song. The results were a third album, Got It Goin' On. The CD garnered two WC Handy award nominations for best blues guitarist and for best song of the year with Pennies and Picks. The CD, Got It Goin' On, with its new grooves and surprises, was praised by critics for its part in redefining the blues and keeping the genre alive.

Over the years Armstrong has performed in many countries including North America, Europe, Scan-

dinavia, Asia and the Middle East. He has worked beside Albert Collins, Buddy Guy, Keb Mo, Chaka Khan, Coco Montoya, Walter Trout, Tommy Castro, Roy Brown, Shemekia Copeland, Charlie Musselwhite, Ricky Lee Jones, Joe Louis Walker, Mitch Mitchell (Jimi Hendrix's drummer), Peter Tork, and Jan & Dean, just to name a few.

His latest CD "Guitar Angels" was released on Catfood Records. In 2014 it was awarded "Best Traditional Release" by Blues411.


Seen live, Armstrong has a confident stage presence that combines grace with mischief. Few blues artists know how to play the crowd as James can, shifting dynamics from a whisper to a growl. Wherever he travels around the world his magnetism continues to hush a noisy rabble or entice a crowd to follow him out into the street or down the length of a beach.

MIKE ZITO

The natural habitat of any true musician is not a gleaming studio, glitzy showbiz party or five-star hotel; it's the road. And if multiple Blues Music Award winner Mike Zito had a dollar for every mile of tarmac he's burnt since his breakout in the early nineties, they'd be piled up to his chin. Revered for a sonic blast of electric slide quitar

and blistering blues vocals, Zito began touring the Midwest circuit at the age of eighteen and has since crossed twenty-plus countries, both on his own and with bandmates Cyril Neville, Devon Allman, Charlie Wooton and Yonrico Scott in Royal Southern Brotherhood. There's an undeniable romance about a life in motion and an enduring magic about the moment when house lights go down, the crowd roars and shadows take the stage. Throughout hundreds of shows and a handful of thrilling albums, Mike's devotion to that moment has made him a true standout of the North American blues scene.

Born in South St. Louis, Mo. Mike Zito grew up in a working class home with a dire love of music. It was his escape and way out. After a decade working in a local guitar shop, Mike learned his craft from the ground up playing in clubs 7 nights a week. He fell in love with the Blues of St. Louis and the stories of the country singers. His first self – released album "Blue Room" hit the streets in 1998 and he has made 12 albums total over the years. He signed and recorded with Eclecto Groove Records and Ruf Records. In 2012 he formed his own group, The Wheel. Mike has produced albums for Samantha Fish, Laurence Jones, Albert Castiglia and others. He tours extensively in the USA, Canada and Europe. He has been honored with multiple Blues Music Awards over the past 10 years. His love of life and pursuit of happiness is felt in every note he sings and plays.

Mike Zito will be releasing a new album Make Blues Not War on Ruf Records November 18th.

"I'm so proud of this new album," says Mike. "It's about the enjoyment I get when I listen to Johnny Winter and Muddy Waters, Stevie Ray Vaughan and Luther Allison. Their music makes me happy and reminds why I wanted to play guitar and play the blues. To be free and honest, loud and proud. I hope everyone enjoys listening to this album as much as I enjoyed making it..."

With the new album Zito will be touring with a new band. Mike Zito and the Wheel played their final shows in late October.

Katy Guillen and The Girls, out of Kansas City, MO, formed in September of 2012. The blues influenced roots rock trio is made up of Katy Guillen (guitar, vocals), Claire Adams (bass, vocals), and Stephanie Williams (drums). The group's sound is characterized by Guillen's searing, lively guitar licks; Williams' heavy, driving drums; and Adams' rock solid bass lines. Guillen's



soulful vocals backed by Adams' intense harmonies add a fierce punch to Guillen's songwriting. KG&G draw influences everywhere from rock and roll contemporaries like Heartless Bastards and the timeless guitar god Jimi Hendrix to sweet songstress Patty Griffin. They've been known to pack a blues and BB-Q roadhouse, just as easily as they will fill up a multi bill rock/alternative venue.

Despite her main musical influences, Lauren was classically trained throughout most of her life. Initially she planned on becoming an opera singer, but quickly realized that pop and soul was a better fit for her.

Having listened to those around her, telling her that music and the arts were difficult fields to have a career in, Lauren followed the safe path in life, making sure she had a "back-up" plan while working on her music and performing. BISCUIT MILLER AND THE MIX

Thursday, Dec. 29th @ 6 pm • 21st Saloon, 96th & L Street, Omaha

"Wishbone" is the eagerly awaited 3rd studio recording of 2012 Blues Music Award Winner for Bassist of the Year, Biscuit Miller. The title track was inspired by Biscuit's two grandsons Jordan and Josh who were excited about making a wish when they got their hands on the turkey wishbone during Thanksgiving dinner. Their excitement sparked an idea in Biscuit's ever creative mind, and he literally began singing and writing the song on the spot! He then jammed with his grandsons in his music room after dinner. That

special day with his family and the birth of a song were all the motivation Biscuit needed to get back into the studio to begin working on "Wishbone."

Biscuit and his band, The Mix, have been touring extensively ever since he won his first BMA in 2012, and had to squeeze in their recording sessions during breaks in the tour. Biscuit is known for his high energy shows and blazing million dollar smile. He is a born entertainer and is at home on the stage where he connects with his audience through a fun and funky approach to the blues. But don't let the fun and food songs fool you! This is a dedicated group of musicians with an amazing depth of talent.

Biscuit was introduced to the bass for the first time at the age of eleven when visiting his friend Datrick. It was sitting in a corner collecting dust when the young Biscuit picked it up and started playing it. The four string electric bass belonged to Datrick's older brother Darnell, who taught him a couple of songs. Biscuit took to it immediately and thus began a love affair with playing bass that has taken him places he could never have imagined. He formed his first band, Clever, with

childhood friend Ivan Wallace. They moved to Minneapolis in 1982. Soon after, a mutual friend, Joe Rowe introduced Biscuit to Sonny Rogers who taught him a lot about playing basic blues. During his time with Rogers, they recorded "They Call Me the Cat Daddy", which won Rogers a Handy Award for Best New Artist. Sadly, Sonny passed away before he was able to accept the award.

Biscuit then went on to play with other respected blues artists such as, Mojo Buford, formerly with Muddy Waters, and Lady Blue, backup vocalist for Ike and Tina Turner. One day, Biscuit received a phone call requesting him to come back home to sub for Chicago's own legendary Lonnie Brooks who needed a bass player for one night. That one night lasted for over ten years as Biscuit became the permanent bass player for the Lonnie Brooks Band.

In 2000 he formed Biscuit and The Mix to fill up some down-time. During this time, he also completed his first studio recording "Come Together". Biscuit frequently could be found sitting in with the up and coming blues guitarist Anthony Gomes. During one of these sessions, he was asked to join the



band full time and he spent the next five years touring with Anthony. During his time with Anthony Gomes, they released five CD's; Unity, Sweet Stringin' Soul, Long Way Home, Music is the Medicine, and Live at the Triple Door.

By 2009 Biscuit was fronting his own band, touring the country playing clubs and festivals, and gaining respect as a front man and bassist alike. Biscuit Miller has graced the covers of several publications, including the 2006 Blues

Fest Guide and the February/March 2010 edition of Big City Rhythm & Blues. In 2012 he was awarded his first Blues Music Award following the release of his second studio recording, "Blues With A Smile". Having received wide air play on Sirius XM Radio, "Blues With A Smile" is aptly named, as Biscuit is known around the world for his huge, heartfelt smile as well as his antics as a funky bassist turned front man.

When he is not busy touring or recording, Biscuit loves to spend time with his friends and family. His grandchildren are especially precious to him. Also precious to him are the rare occasions when he is able to sit down with his entire family over a home cooked meal. Like the one that happened the day "Wishbone" was born! Thanksgiving at Biscuit's house became a joyous celebration of life and music that will never end.

Whether you've been hangin' with Biscuit for years, or are a newcomer to the party, "Wishbone" is sure to please. So grab on – and make a wish!

During the early 2000's John played tour dates with notables Son Seals, Guitar Shorty, and Dr. Hector and the Groove Injectors. John was also the bass player for the Michael Burks

Band for several years and toured nationally and internationally with Michael. We are lucky and thankful to have John now with the Earl and Them band.

BRANDON SANTINI

There are many different opinions as to what the future of the blues harmonica will be. Memphis vocalist and harmonica player Brandon Santini is undeniably a worthy player to keep an eye on as the latest surge of young blues artists leave their footprint in blues history.



His name is worthy of conversations that include James Cotton, Kim Wilson, Dennis Gruenling, Charlie Musselwhite and other frontline harmonica players by combining his love and respect for traditional blues with a present, colorful style of playing that is often compared to James Cotton or Paul Butterfield.

Raised in the Piedmont region of North Carolina, Brandon purchased his first harmonica in 1997 at the age of fifteen when his mother took him to the local music store upon his request.

He founded the Blues Music Award nominated band Delta Highway in 2003 and relocated to Memphis where he absorbed the sounds and culture of the Delta and North Mississippi Hill Country, honing his craft night after night, sweating it out in local Beale Street clubs just like Robert Johnson, Muddy Waters, and B.B. King did decades before him.

Live & Extended! is Brandon's third album released in January 2015 by VizzTone Label Group. The scene is Quebec's upscale concert venue, le Petit Impérial, on a Sunday night in July, in the middle of the exuberant Festival D'été de Quebec. The packed house responds quickly as Brandon Santini and his tight touring band hit the stage with all the raw blues power and impact of the 1970s-era Paul Butterfield or James Cotton Blues Band. The band feels the energy and responds with over an hour of the hard-hitting harmonica-driven blues that's been causing fans and critics alike to tap Santini as one of the most quickly-rising blues stars of his generation.

For Brandon Santini, "It's all about the vibe of your surroundings. With a great live audience fueling you it's a lot more inspiring and allows you to give more to the audience." He has steadily built his fan base with two previous albums, and tours regularly. Noah Wotherspoon Band has released an aptly titled cd called Mystic Mud. It is an outstanding album. Cincinnati guitarist Wotherspoon is the 2015 Albert King Guitar Award winner. Wotherspoon is a gifted young man. He is an exceptional guitarist that has a forte for slide, but is

strong in all areas of blues guitar. His singing is heartfelt and strong, but not overpowering.

Wotherspoon and the band have been together since 2009. They placed second in the International Blues Challenge. Bassist Rob Thaxton and drummer Brian Aylor make for a very good rhythm section.

This is an album without filler. Each cut is memorable. The opening song, What's Gonna Become of Me, is a fine start with some very nice slide. The sixth song, Natural Fact, is a favorite of mine. It has a nice rock-a-billy feel.

I highly recommended this cd! The band displays their take on traditional blues without imitating the masters of the past.
