#### $\star$ $\star$ 2018 blues music award winner – Best rock blues artist $\star$ $\star$



There may not be a more honest bluesman than Mike Zito, whose 15th album 'First Class Life' comes out May 11 on Ruf Records. The rocking yet poignant title track explores his journey from addiction to sobriety and then musical recognition; he is a two-time 2017 Blues Music Award nominee. "Second chance at a first class life," he sings, recalling the hard times. The Texas-based musician smiles and continues, "I grew up poor in St. Louis, and now I'm travelling the world to sing my songs."

Zito's star has been on the rise of late both solo and as a member of the Royal Southern Brotherhood, with bandmates Cyril Neville, Devon Allman, Charlie Wooton and Yonrico Scott.

As is fitting for a man with the word "Blues" tattooed across his picking hand, 'First Class Life' focuses squarely on blues with heart and chops to spare, not to mention wit and openness. The punchy "Time For A Change" conjures the tension in the world today while the exquisite Memphis-style song, "The World We Live In," recalls BB King in its world-weariness. The electrified blues bounce of "Dying Day" finds Zito swearing lifelong allegiance to his wife. "Old Black Graveyard" sets the scene of a Bluesman's final resting place and its disrepair, along with some possible supernatural influences, with Zito's masterful slide guitar flourishes driving it home.

Yet the record's darker moments are offset by cuts like "Mama Don't Like No Wah Wah." the funky crash-bang-wallop gem written with Ruf labelmate Bernard Allison about the late legend Koko Taylor. "Bernard told me about his first gig as guitarist for Taylor," laughs Mike. "Koko didn't like any effects on the guitar, she wanted it to sound natural. When Bernard made an attempt to use an effect on his guitar after playing with her for months, he got caught. 'Mama don't like no wah wah' is what he was told. That's a song to me!" The two guitar slingers trade off, trying to one up each other atop a funky blues groove, including Allison pulling out his forbidden wah wah pedal. The tongue-in-cheek "Back Problems" is a showcase for Zito's wit as a songwriter.

In addition to the press and Blues Music Award love, Zito has earned praise from fellow artists. Anders Osborne says, "I love Mike Zito! He's got that rare kind of voice that resonates in your soul. All his hardship, life experiences and kind heart oozes out of every note he sings. His guitar playing dances delicately between a contemporary blues virtuoso and an old fashion soul man. Mike continues to impress me with his straightforward and honest songwriting. His joy and grace shine through on every record he makes. '

2018 MINNESOTA BLUES HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE FOR "BLUES PERFORMER"

TOP 50 "CONTEMPORARY BLUES ALBUM OF THE YEAR" (STAY ABOVE WATER) 2017 ROOTS MUSIC REPORT

Singer-songwriter, pianist Scottie Miller has been inducted in to the Minnesota Blues Hall of Fame for both Contributions to Blues Music and Heritage (for his instructional book Rock Keyboards published by Hal Leonard), and in 2018 as Blues Performer (their highest honor). He founded the Scottie Miller Band in 2000, and has just released his tenth CD "Stay Above Water."

He has also been the touring keyboardist for three-time Grammy nominated singer Ruthie Foster (Blue Corn Re-







cords) since 2008. He is featured on her Blues Music Award winning CD/DVD "Live At Antone's", and recently performed to a sold-out audience at Carnegie Hall in NYC. Scottie met Ruthie while on tour as the keyboardist for Rock n' Roll Hall of Fame legend Bo Diddley. Scottie's original brand of music is steeped in blues, and covers a wide pallet of styles including Barrelhouse Piano Blues, rock, funk, soul, jazz, classical, Americana and singer-songwriter.

Scottie recently co-wrote a song "I Was Called" with Ruthie Foster that is featured on the August 2017 release by sixtime Grammy Award winning gospel group The Blind Boys of Alabama. Produced by Steve Berlin (Los Lobos). "Almost Home" was recorded over four different sessions with four different GRAMMY-winning producers in four different cities. The album is composed primarily of original songs, which focus on the remarkable journey of the band's two surviving original members, long-time leader Clarence Fountain, and current leader Jimmy Carter. It features songwriting contributions from an exceptional collection of artists including Valerie June, North Mississippi Allstars, Phil Cook, John Leventhal, Marc Cohn, Ruthie Foster, Scottie Miller and more. Leventhal (Rosanne Cash, William Bell) recorded with the Blind Boys and their band in New York City, Vance Powell (Chris Stapleton, Jack White) in Nashville, Chris Goldsmith (Charlie Musselwhite, Ben Harper) in Seattle, and Los Lobos' Steve Berlin (Faith No More, Buckwheat Zydeco) at FAME Studios in Muscle Shoals.

# REV. JIMMIE BRATCHER'S MAN! IT'S CHRISTMAS w/ The Church House Blues Band

The Blues – it's all about the soul of a man. Who better to play the blues than a man who lost it all only to regain it again? That's what The Reverend Jimmie Bratcher is about! A man who gave up his love of the blues for a higher calling, only to have the blues come back to him as his higher calling 20 years later. A boy who went to Memphis to follow a dream that over 25 years later is realized every time he steps on the stage in blues clubs like Club Isaac Hayes in Memphis or The Ground Zero in Clarks—dale Mississippi.

### They call Jimmie Bratcher "The Electric Rev."

Not only because his lightning-strike performances crackle with high-voltage guitar playing and emotionally charged vocals. Or because Bratcher makes the hairs rise on the arms of the crowds he entertains in the map of clubs, festivals, bike rallies, churches and prisons that he calls "the road."

But because the ascending blues star is literally a preacher, as comfortable testifying in the pulpit about the power of Jesus as he is in smoky bars celebrating the vigor of the blues.

Bratcher's shows — regardless of location — are worry-free zones, where the healing, good-time mojo of rockin' blues sets hearts and minds, and maybe even souls, free. His album Secretly Famous is fueled by the same attitude. The disc's dozen tracks are packed with humor, romance, joy and the thrill of finding the same at every turn, plus some real-life reflection.

And they're all buoyed by Bratcher's gravel dappled tenor voice and his gritty, muscular and deeply rooted guitar playing, supported by his versatile longtime rhythm section of drummer Dave Autry and bassist Craig Kew.

Bratcher's passion for raw-but-exacting electric guitar sounds began in the '60s, when he fell under the spell of Eric Clapton, his first six-string hero. But there was a circuitous journey he needed to undertake to become a bluesman himself.

As a kid Bratcher developed eclectic taste, culled from his large musical family — who would have sprawling jam sessions at frequent get-togethers in his native Kansas City, Missouri — and the sounds on the era's progressive FM radio. "I was the guy who owned both Axis Bold As Love and Johnny Cash at Folsom Prison," he attests. The first truly pivotal event in Bratcher's musical life occurred at age 12 when his father recognized his creative yearning and determined to get him an electric guitar.

"We didn't have any money, but we did have a 1958 DeSoto in the driveway," Bratcher recounts. "My father placed an ad in the Kansas City Star that read, 'Will trade 1958 DeSoto for an electric guitar and amplifier.' "That instrument was the 1964 Gibson SG Junior that Bratcher played on Secretly Famous. He also still owns the amp, too — a Gibson Falcon.

The toy drive started in 2003 with Larry Dunn – an Omaha musician also known as Lash LaRue – a friend and a small pick-up truck. Dunn had become acutely aware of the extreme need of the residents after spending time on the reservation.

The U.S. Census Bureau lists Pine Ridge as the most poverty-stricken area in the United States. It isn't unusual to see frost on the inside of reservation homes during the harsh South Dakota winters. Food and heat are often scarce.

Medical care is limited and without easy access. Dunn also learned that because of all this, very often the children of Pine Ridge had no holiday gifts. Each year has added more concerts and other events, such as a radiothon and concerts outside Omaha. Because of the growth of the Toy Drive, Dunn expanded its reach on Pine Ridge -- providing resources to a medical clinic on the reservation, resources for the elders, including a heating fund, and educational resources for schoolchildren in Pine Ridge.

What began as one person's wish to provide for children growing up in poverty became an official non-profit organization. An organization that has relied heavily on community donations to assist the residents of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation.



The Lincoln, Nebraska, soul shouter, and his band of merry soulsters, Soul Colossal, deliver a sound so big, so funky, so wring-the-sweat-out-of-you energetic that it reaches through the speakers and shakes you until you start moving to its groove."

Night after night at their live shows, Josh Hoyer & Soul Colossal leave it all on the table, bringing crowds palpably authentic music. This is a real working band; music for the people, by the people. You hear the veracity in Hoyer's voice. You hear the strife of a guitar amp being pushed to its limits. You hear keyboards hammering notes home while emboldened horns soar over the top of a rhythm section akin to a freight train. The raucous funk and smooth soul emanating from the stage dutifully pays homage to the past soul giants while simultaneously charging forward, piloting themselves into the modern era. This is soul music.

Hoyer formed Josh Hoyer & Soul Colossal in 2012 in famed blues town Lincoln, Nebraska. The award-winning five-piece band includes some of the area's most revered and accomplished musicians. Joining Hoyer (keyboards/vocals) is Blake DeForest (trumpet), Mike Keeling (bass), Benjamin Kushner (guitar), and Larell Ware (drums). Inspired by the sounds of Stax, Motown, Muscle Shoals, New Orleans, Philly and San Francisco, the band continuously crosses musical boundaries both in style and era, and joins forces each show with a common goal – to have the crowd dancing so much they forget even their smallest troubles.

On January 26th, 2018, Hoyer released The End of the Night, a 3-song EP and solo side project with veteran Nashville songwriters Jay Knowles (Harry Connick Jr, Blake Shelton), and Jon Coleman (Trace Adkins). In the spring of 2018, Josh Hoyer & Soul Colossal recorded their fourth full length record, Do It Now, which was released in Europe in August 2018, concurrent with a 35-city tour spanning 7 countries. Do It Now is slated for a US release on January 18th, 2019.

In 2017, Josh was featured as a contestant on NBC's The Voice, and the band completed their first European tour; a 27-city stint capped with a live album release from their show in Brussels, Belgium. The hard working band completed several national tours from 2015–2017, playing more than 150 shows in 32 states each year, including opening for George Clinton, Charles Bradley, Booker T Jones, and Muscle Shoals Revue. Their year-round touring schedule took them from coast to coast, including several major summer music festivals.

In 2016, the magic of their live show caught the attention of producer Ken Coomer (Wilco, Uncle Tupelo), who joined with the band to record their third full-length album. Running From Love, was recorded at Nashville's historic Sound Emporium, and once again features Hoyer's trademark vocals and the band's signature groove.

Josh Hoyer & Soul Colossal and Silver Street Records are proud to announce the completion and release of the American Soul band's fourth studio album, 'Do It Now', a tentrack experience of raucous funk, smooth soul, blazing leads and the ground shaking voice of Josh Hoyer

'Do It Now' was released in Europe in August 2018 followed by the band's second European tour – a barnstorming romp of thirty shows in forty-five days across seven countries and thirty-seven cities.

Joyann Parker brings a full range of talent to her performances as an accomplished singer, pianist, guitarist and songwriter. She has performed for thousands at major venues and festivals across the country,

frequently sells out the most prestigious clubs in the Twin Cities and garnered national and international attention for her newest record, "Hard To Love."

Joyann is a 2018 Blues Blast Magazine Music Award nominee and Heritage guitars artist. She has opened for Grammy winner Robert Cray, taken the stage for Grammy nominee Elvin Bishop in a pinch, represented Minnesota at the 2015 International Blues Competition in Memphis, TN and won the award for 2016's Best Self-Produced CD from the Minnesota Blues Society.

After singing in church most of her life, Joyann Parker embraced the blues. A classically trained pianist with a degree in music from the University of Wisconsin–La Crosse, Parker loves the music's heartfelt honesty.

"I didn't know anything about blues until about four years ago," the Minneapolis-based singer, songwriter, band leader and multi-instrumentalist says. "But then it just clicked. I said, "This is what I am supposed to do."

On April 13, Parker released her new album, "Hard To Love." The project offers more evidence of the singer's new-found blues power. Parker co-wrote and co-produced the album's 13 songs with Mark Lamoine, guitarist in the band. The selections include the inspirational, gospel-linked "Home," the Memphis soul-style "Envy" and Motown-based "Dizzy."

Before Parker became a blues singer, she knew only such obvious examples as Eric Clapton's and Led Zeppelin's blues interpretations. The door to authentic blues and soul music



opened almost accidentally. After Parker sang Aretha Franklin's soul classic, "Chain of Fools," at a singing contest, she received an invitation to join a blues band. Accustomed to studying music formally, Parker consequently educated herself about the blues. "I started going to the blues jams in town, trying to figure out what it's all about," she says. "And that was it. It just clicked for me."

In 2015, Parker traveled to Memphis to be the Minnesota Blues Society's representative in the International Blues Challenge. The experience inspired her to write the songs that appear on Hard to Love. "After I went to the Stax Museum in Memphis, it was like somebody lit a fire under me," she says. "I thought, 'I love this music. I

want to write it.' I went home and wrote the songs. When I give myself time to be creative and I'm inspired, too, music just comes out of me."

Every song Parker writes comes from the heart. "But they're not all about me by any means," she says. "I believe part of being a songwriter is taking your story and weaving it with other people's stories. Together, they make a good story. And I don't write 'Oh, baby, oh, baby' lyrics. I can't do that. I write songs that somebody, somewhere may hear and then say, 'Oh. How does she know me?' People always come see me after a show. I love that. When a song I wrote affects people's lives, that's great for the songwriter in me."

Because she sings and composes songs that have emotional honesty, Parker is very much in the great American blues tradition. "I love the realism of blues so much," she says. "It's so earthy. Blues doesn't pull any punches. I can't help but be moved by that."

Parker wants anyone who doesn't know the blues genre to experience the indigenous American music that's been so influential on the world's music. "I've been performing for some younger crowds," she says. "They say they don't like blues. People in general say that. I tell them, 'I think you do.' And after I perform something for them, they say, 'Oh. I love that song.' I say, 'That's blues.' Every kind of music they like comes from blues. The music in a restaurant, in a movie or TV soundtrack, there's always a blues tune."



# CD Reviews



# **Buddy Guy** • The Blues is Alive and Well


At 82, Buddy Guy has released an album that is reflective, and at times, somewhat melancholy. Several of the songs on the cd are about his nearing the end of his life's journey. It is remarkable that Guy still sings and plays guitar at such a high level at this point in his career.

Although Guy can play with and exceed any of today's guitar slingers, this group of songs shows subtlety and nuance. There is a range of styles and the dynamics in the cuts show what a blues master he truly is.

My favorite number is the uptempo John Lee Hooker song "Ooh Daddy". "Cognac" is a very cool cut with guest guitarists Jeff Beck and Keith Richards. It is not too over the top as might be expected from the dueling trio. I do have a minor problem with "Whiskey for Sale" because of the annoying drum machine.

Overall, I highly recommend the cd. It is outstanding and should be appreciated by traditional blues lovers.
