CD Reviews




Chris Cain · **So Many Miles**

Chris Cain is deserving of much more recognition. He is one of the best blues guitarists and singers working today. He records infrequently, and that may be part of the problem. This is his first cd in seven years.

The Robben Ford Band backs Cain on **So Many Miles**. The Ford Brothers have worked closely with Cain for many years, and it shows. They

work well together. Larry Carlton also guests on one track.

Cain has a very fluid, polished guitar style that makes his playing seem effortless. His music is blues that has a strong



eclectic.

This is a CD that helps evolve the blues without get-

ting too far from the heart of it. Cain is never over the top, but nuanced and subtle. I like this CD a great deal.

Big Head Blues Club • 100 Years of Robert Johnson

On May 8, way back in 1911, Robert Johnson was born in Hazelhurst, Mississippi. He went on to become one of the

founding forces of the blues genre and a recognized early influence in rock and roll. Its only fitting that someone throw a "Happy 100th Birthday" party for Robert (even though he' won't be blowing out the candles as he's been dead for the last 73 years). This particular celebration is credited to the Big Head Blues Club, and what a club it is! The main force is Big Head Todd and the Monsters. They are joined by special club members: BB King, Hubert

Sumlin, Honeyboy Edwards, Charlie Musselwhite, Ruthie Foster, Cedric Burnsides and Lightnin' Malcom.

Ten of Robert Johnson's twenty-nine recorded songs are featured on this CD. It's hard to imagine that Robert Johnson originally recorded this great selection of songs during two sessions in 1936 and 1937. I'm sure that doing an album of such well-known, and previously "well-covered", covers offers more than a few concerns. Todd and his fellow club members did an outstanding job of interpreting Johnson's songs into a modern sound while, for the most part, remaining true to the feeling of the classic original recordings. A good example is the opening track - Come On In My Kitchen. The addition of backing B3 organ and Charlie Musselwhite's harp solo enhance but do not detract from its original delta sound.

From the remaining tracks there are several particularly enjoyable selections. When You Got A Good Friend is a simple blues tune featuring Hubert Sumlin's guitar and backing vocals by Ruthie Foster. Ruthie returns for a duet with Todd on an outstanding version of Kind Hearted Woman. The backing piano and acoustic guitar work contribute to the vintage sound of

this track. Charlie Musselwhite provides smooth harp backing and fills to Todd's vocal at the start of <u>Last Fair Deal Gone</u>

<u>Down.</u> Although it starts with this easygoing sound, towards the end it changes tempo and the sound becomes almost frantic. Charlie's harp becomes more biting and forceful and then the song abruptly ends. <u>Cross Road Blues</u>, featuring B.B. King, is the only track that strays (probably too far) from the original Robert Johnson sound. This is a B.B.King song in its arrangement and the sound of his guitar and vocals.

The CD closes by getting back to the most simple of basics. Todd does a solo version of <u>All My Love In Vain</u> providing both the vocal and the acoustic guitar accompaniment.. It is very nicely done. Next is <u>Sweet Home Chicago</u> with just the duo of Honeyboy Edwards on guitar and vocals and Charlie Musselwhite accompanying. What a nice way to end this tribute.

100 Years of Robert Johnson is good listening. It might not be a favorite of all Big Head Todd and the Monsters fans but I think most of them would enjoy it. Its appeal will be more to Robert Johnson and blues roots fans.

The band consisting of Ethan Johns on guitar at times is smokin hot and Mr Jones vocals, other than a slow start on Dylan's "What good am I" are spot on terrific! A stellar line up of guest musicians such as Augie Meyers, Benmont Tench, Dave Rawlings and Gillian Welch, and Booker T Jones help

make this a great record. Be forewarned banjo haters, there is banjo on this record! I was lifted up by this record and

then gently put back down. My cat "Neckbones" called it "Pure Bliss". (Sometimes I worry about him) Toms version of Hookers "Burning Hell" is just a plain flat out foot stomper! So forget about Vegas and middle aged ladies throwing things at the stage, take a chance on something I thought I would never buy and please let me know what you think. (and be kind) So, kids "Its not Unusual" to love this record! (sorry about that)
