Slam Allen

Thursday, February 2nd @ 6 pm • 21st Saloon, 96th & L Street, Omaha

Slam Allen is one of the most dynamic and original blues and soul artists on the scene today. More than just a singer, writer, and guitar player, Slam connects with his audience like entertainers from a bygone era. Think Otis Redding, BB, Albert, and Freddie King, with a blend of Wilson Pickett, James Brown, Sly Stone and a little George Benson and Jimi Hendrix thrown in – making a Slam show a unique musical experience.



As a solo performer, Slam is the recipient of the prestigious Master Blues Artist award from the New York Blues Hall of Fame, a 2016 Blues Music Award Nominee and the proud endorsee of custom guitars by Gerhard's Guitarworks and boutique amplifiers by Soul Tramp Amplification.

Growing up, Slam played drums for the family soul band "The Allen Brothers" and later on, learned guitar from his Dad, Harrison Allen and his Uncle, Cecil Allen. As he progressed in their eyes, the family knew they had a special talent to nurture!

As he developed his own style, Slam went to Chicago to learn the ways of Traditional Chicago Blues. Once there, it didn't take long before the offer of a fill in gig for the legendary harpist, James Cotton – which led to Slam spending the next 9 years (2001 - 2010) as the lead singer, lead guitarist, and band leader for Mr. Cotton. Slam is also credited with writing and singing on Cotton's 2011 Grammy nominated comeback album, "Giant."

"Cotton was directly connected to Muddy Waters, who was a major factor in the blues world – as well as being one of my all time favorites. Playing with Cotton was such a great experience for me! There are things I learned from him that you can't learn from any

school. It was a great honor!" says Slam.

Now on his own, and internationally recognized as a seasoned touring veteran, Slam is dedicated to forging his own legacy in the blues and soul world. With seven original albums under his belt, Slam is here to bring back what the music world is lacking – the love and uplifting honesty that makes for a powerful and entertaining musical experience.

From B.B. King to Otis Redding, Slam has a way of making you feel the soul of the music. It's often difficult to tell if he's doing one of his originals or an old blues or soul cover. In the end it doesn't matter... Slam has a way of making all the music his own.

THIE NACE IBIROTHIERS

Seasoned professionals they've earned the respect of promoters, club owners, producers and peers for their dedication to their craft, easy going confidence and their refreshing lack of pretense. A testimony to their affability lies in the fact the Brothers David and Jimmy have been performing together over 32 years. Along with T.J. Erhardt who has been with the band 18 years, and their newest addition, groovemaster Paul Greenlease on Bass, they are stonger than ever.

In 1993 the title track "Club 15" was also on the compilation c.d. "Margaritaville Cafe - Late Night Menu" on MCA Records featuring Jimmy Buffett and various other artists.

Fourth generation performers their musical heritage began in the latter part of the 19th century with their great-great grandfather the classically trained violinist Valandingham Nace. The legacy continued in the 1920's and 30's with their grandfather Percy a multi-instrumentalist and square dance caller. By the late 40's their father was playing box suppers and square dances. Johnny Nace progressed from playing rural dances to leading the house bands on the regional radio and television programs "Hillbilly Jamboree" and "Circle Six Ranch". He recorded rockabilly in the late 50's before finding his musical home during the golden age of honky-tonk. An astute songwriter he led a top notch band to regional success with songs like "Sing me the blues" and "Blue Notes". Their 1997 release "Roots of Steel" is a tribute to their father and the lessons he taught them.

Starting their 32nd year as a touring group the Nace Brothers are poised for a larger audience. Brilliant songwriting, expressive vocals, soaring guitar and a rock solid rhythm section combine for entertainment at its best.

Zac Harmon

Zac Harmon is an award-winning guitarist, organist, singer, and songwriter whose distinctive style combines the best of old-school soul-blues artists with modern lyrics and themes that bring the blues into a new century. His new Blind Pig CD, Right Man Right Now, is contemporary music that proves



just how alive and relevant the blues is today.

Born and raised in Jackson, Mississippi, Zac Harmon is a true embodiment of the music that emanated from the city's historic Farish Street district, home of blues legend Elmore James. Given that Zac was exposed to a lot of music in his home, neighborhood, and local culture, it's not surprising that he turned out a blues musician. His mom played piano, and his dad, the city's first black pharmacist, played harmonica and tended to the needs of artists such as Muddy Waters, B.B. King, Ike and Tina Turner, Albert King, and Little Milton.

Zac started his professional career at age sixteen, playing guitar with Sam Myers, a friend of his father's. Two years later he was playing with Dorothy Moore, Z.Z. Hill and other well-known blues artists who were passing through on regional tours.

In the early eighties, at age 21, he moved to Los Angeles to take a real shot at the music business. He worked as a studio musician at first and eventually established a very successful career as a songwriter and producer. He worked on major films, television shows, and well-known national commercials, even being hired at one point by Michael Jackson as a staff writer for his publishing company. Harmon wrote songs for the likes of Evelyn "Champagne" King, Freddie Jackson, the Whispers, K-Ci & Jo Jo, and the O'Jays.

BluesWax said of a festival appearance, "Harmon's stage show is like a Blues symphony where he segues from one song to the next without a moment's hesitation, building a head of steam that is orgasmic. Mixing classic boogie gliders with originals, he builds a West Side guitar sound that's almost as sweet and simultaneously rough as classic Magic Sam into a showcase presentation that takes a lot of pages from Buddy Guy as far as dynamics. His hour on stage went by in an instant."

With Right Man Right Now Harmon finally brings that excitement to a brand new CD, his bluesiest ever. Addressing issues straight from today's headlines, Zac presents them in a fresh original style built on the best blues tradition. The album provides definitive proof that Zac Harmon is indeed the right man to firmly establish all that blues can and should be right now in the second decade of the new millennium.

Nick Schnebelen has quickly built a reputation as killer lead guitar player and impassioned vocalist. As founding member of the award winning popular family band Trampled Under Foot (TUF), Nick has traveled the world playing festivals such as Notodden, Montreal, and as fan favorites on

the annual Legendary Blues Cruise. Today Nick performs with his own band, as does his sister Daniele, and brother Chris. The siblings still perform a few re-union shows as Trampled Under Foot. Now, Nick Schnebelen continues to tour world-wide, bringing his raw blues energy guitar and vocals, backed by a hot rockin' blues band.

The music industry agrees: In 2008 Trampled Under Foot (TUF) won the International Blues Competition and Nick won The Albert King Award for "Best Guitarist". Shortly thereafter Nick and his family band TUF recorded two great



blues releases with Tony Braunagel producing (Taj Mahal, Robert Cray): "Wrong side of Blues" and "Badlands" and the latter debuted #1 on Billboard and won "Best Contemporary Blues Album at the Blues Music Awards in 2014. Today, Nick is again working with Tony Braunagel for Nick's next album to be released in 2017. "It's great to be working with Tony again. I am currently writing new songs for this release. It's going to be a blast recording in LA".

Nick Schnebelen has blues in his blood. Nick and his siblings grew up with parents who played music full time in the Kansas City blues scene. Their house often became a jam space for their parents, Lisa Swedlund and Robert Schnebelen's popular blues band, Little Eva & The Works. Today Nick continues that tradition with the blues as he travels world-wide with his own band. Look for even greater success for Nick in the coming months.

Selwyn Birchwood, Florida's rising young blues fireball, is a guitar and lap-steel-playing bundle of pure energy. He delivers his original songs with a revival tent preacher's fervor and a natural storyteller's charisma made all the more impactful by his raw, unvarnished vocals. Birchwood plays high-octane blues - at once deeply rooted, funky and up-tothe-minute - with true passion and honest emotion. With his band feeding off his drive and exuberance, the striking 6'3" 29-year-old with his trademark Afro roams the stage (often barefoot), ripping out memorable guitar licks with ease. His ability to win over an audience – any audience – is proven night after night on the bandstand. With his warm, magnetic personality, Birchwood is as down-to-earth as his music is fun, thought-provoking and vital. His mission is to spread his music far and wide, to share his joy, to play his heart out, and to push the blues into the future. "There's nothing I'd rather be doing than playing the blues," he says. "And I try to convey that with every song and with every performance."

In 2013, Birchwood catapulted from local hero to shooting star. He won the world-renowned International Blues Challenge, beating out 125 other bands from the U.S. and abroad. He also took home the Albert King Guitarist Of The Year Award. It wasn't long before Alligator Records president Bruce Iglauer offered Birchwood a contract. His debut album, Don't Call No Ambulance, is a fully realized vision of contemporary blues. Birchwood's original songs range from raucous romps to hill country stomps, from searing, serious slow

blues to modern blues rock. Between his uninhibited sense of fun and adventure and his serious-as-a-heart-attack musicianship, Don't Call No Ambulance is a window into the future of the blues. "All originals and no filler," he says of the album. "It's that genuineness of emotion in the songs that people can hear."

The Tampa Tribune says Birchwood plays with "power and precision reminiscent of blues guitar hero Buddy Guy. He is a gritty vocalist [who is] commanding with his axe." According to Iglauer, Birchwood is the real deal. "Selwyn Birchwood is a terrific young blues talent with a huge future. He writes smart, infectious, fresh songs and delivers them with a warm, conversational vocal style and a fun-loving attitude. He's a killer guitarist, switching between a regular six-string and lap steel. Live, he's a ball of energy, interacting with the audience like they were in his living room. Selwyn is destined to be one of the next stars in the blues world."



Williams attacks his lyrics like he attacks his guitar: with bare-bones intensity that makes each word sound like a matter of life or death."

The group took home the Living Blues Award for Best Live Performer in 2011, 2012 and 2013. They won the prestigious



Blues Music Award for Band Of The Year in both 2007 and 2009. The Associated Press says, "Williams fills Chicago's biggest shoes with more life and heat than anyone on stage today."

With The Big Sound Of Lil' Ed & The Blues Imperials, the band continues to bring their blistering Chicago blues to "Ed Heads" new and old. Their infectious energy, joyful showmanship and masterful playing have been honed to a razor's edge by their many years together. Lil' Ed, Pookie, Mike and Kelly have seen sports stars and presidents, musical fads and fashion trends come and go. Meanwhile, their fiery music has more than

stood the test of time. "We're not band members," says Williams, "we're family, and families stay together." Night after night, gig after riotous gig, the musical family called Lil' Ed & The Blues Imperials bring their big, dynamic Chicago blues sound to fans across the country and around the world.



Ricci has been actively touring the Blues circuit in the USA and Europe for over twenty years. In 2005 The Mercury News listed Jason Ricci's show in a "Top Ten Best Shows" of 2005 list alongside acts such as Springsteen, Rush, Prince and Green Day for best concerts of the year. Jason's shows feature a variety of music from Blues, Punk, Jazz, R&B, and Fusion. He s just as likely to cover music by Little Walter, Otis Rush, Sonny Boy Williamson and Slim Harpo as he is The Misfits, Sun Ra, Lou Reed or Cheech and Chong. Ricci is an edgy performer, singer, songwriter and interview. Jason's career has been ripe with discussion, controversy and appreciation alike. 

The Steepwater Band's is touring in support of their 6th full-length studio album SHAKE YOUR FAITH. The LP features 11 brand new TSB tracks, and was recorded last winter at Crushtone Studios, in the shadows of the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, in Cleveland, Ohio. Shake Your Faith was produced by the band along with seasoned rock studio veteran Jim Wirt, who has also worked with the likes of Fiona Apple, Incubus and the Buffalo Killers. As with most TSB albums, the sound and songwriting on Shake Your Faith has grown and expanded, yet retained the true nature of the band. It's the first TSB studio record in over 4 years and the first to include "new" guitarist Eric Saylors.

The arctic Lake Erie air made for a secluded and quick session, as it was all recorded and mixed within 12 days. The band entered the studio with a group of songs, but with very loose arrangements. Bassist Tod Bowers elaborates, "It really allowed everyone in the band to be inspired by the moment. Sonically inspired by what sounds you were hearing coming out of the speakers... what was happening in the room, musically between the 4 of us. And you can hear that in the recording."

Shake Your Faith has a wide range of sounds from straight ahead rock n roll to a psychedelic samba, and lyrical direction that extends from love to murder. This album is the true meaning of just that. An album – a collective piece of music that's meant to be heard front to back. Saylors adds "The way the whole record flows, it's like one long song... takes you on a little journey."

Formed in Chicago back in 1998, The Steepwater Band's signature sound is a nod to early British blues, combined with a modern, raw and gutsy musical approach. Founding members Massey, Bowers and Winters have a synergy that comes from years of playing together. Then in early 2012, the long-time trio was joined by Saylors, from Indianapolis, IN, who brought an added depth to the TSB LIVE sound.

The Steepwater Band has maintained a grueling schedule throughout the last 18 years, averaging about 140 shows per

year. They have toured and shared the stage with acts such as Gov't Mule, Buddy Guy, Wilco, Taj Mahal, Marc Ford, ZZ Top, T-Model Ford, North Mississippi All Stars, Leon Russell, Drive-By Truckers, Robert Randolph & the Family Band, Cheap Trick, Bad Company and Heart. In 2005, the band made its European debut, performing at the Azkena Rock Festival in Vitoria-Gasteiz, Spain. In the following years, the band has returned to the United Kingdom and Europe for multiple club and festival tours, increasing their loyal overseas fan-base.

Lurrie Bell Can't Shake This Feeling

Lurrie Bell plays classic Chicago blues while providing his own imprint. On his new cd, he uses his extremely tight regular band, with the addition of journeyman harp player Matthew Skoller. This is hard-core blues from the windy city.

The cd starts off with a great shuffle entitled Blues is Trying to Keep Up With Me. Some great harp work is supplied by Skoller. I am also very fond of the second cut entitled Drifting. It has a bit of a West-coast feel.

This cd is not for those that like guitar slashers. Bell is an exceptional guitarist that incorporates a tasteful finger picking style with huge bends. It is ensemble music allowing each member of the exceptional band to shine. I like the fact that Bell uses his regular band and does not use "super stars" in place of his usual band. It makes for a very cohesive feel.

I highly recommend this deep-blues cd. I think you will see it up for many year-end awards.
