tours nationally. I'm sure by doing this the KLB band made a few new fans and friends in Omaha tonight.




Tab Benoit has long been one of my favorite performers. Tonight he could only manage a 21/2 hour set. Are you kidding me? Nobody plays for that

holed category of everyone else! He







33rd Blues Music Awards - Thursday May 10, 2012

The 33rd Blues Music Awards will be Thursday May 10, 2012 at the Cook Convention Center in Memphis, Tennessee.

Major funding is provided by ArtsMemphis and the Tennessee Arts Commission.

The 33rd Blues Music Awards are sponsored by Blue Mountain Artists, BMI, Catfood Records, Eagle Rock Entertainment, FedEx, First Tennessee Foundation, Gibson Foundation, Legendary Rhythm & Blues Cruise, Memphis Convention and Visitors Bureau, the Sierra Nevada Brewing Company and Sony/Legacy Records.

Once again, The Blues Music Awards will be broadcast live in their entirety on Sirius XM's B.B. King's Bluesville. The next best thing to being there. They will be broadcast on public television later in the year.


The 2012 show will follow the format of the critically-acclaimed shows of recent years. Close to 100 nominees attend and the night is filled with their appearances and performances in a cabaret/dinner setting in the Convention Center's ballroom.

The event brings together Blues performers, industry representatives and fans from all over the world to celebrate the best in Blues recordings and performances from the previous year. Each year, the Foundation presents The Blues Music Awards to the artists selected by its members. They are universally recognized as the highest honor given to Blues artists. As always, a pre-party will immediately precede the Awards.



Winning the International Blues Challenge is better than having a \$100,000 publicity budget. 2004 IBC winner and 2006 Blues Music Award Best New Artist Zac Harmon.



CD Reviews



John Hiatt · Dirty Jeans and Mudslide Hymns



"Dirty Jeans and Mudslide Hymns" is a collection of stories told in song and verse by one of the greatest musical storytellers of our time. A lot of superlatives like genius and immortal are casually thrown around to describe various musicians. There are very few that it actually fits. John Hiatt is one of

those rare exceptions that deserves every accolade directed his way. His song styling slides effortlessly around the edges of the pop, folk, blues, rock and country genres. His body of work over the decades speaks for itself. Virtually every album that he has released over the years contained songs that were picked up by singers of every genre. They are recorded and performed throughout their careers. "Dirty Jeans and Mudslide Hymns" is no exception. Somewhere among these eleven tracks are future hits for someone. We'll just have to wait and see.

The songs, with a couple of exceptions, are raw-edged tales of hard people, hard lives and hard times. It opens with **Damn This Town** – the story of a ne'er-do-well family filled with gamblers, drunks, thieves and convicts. It is being told in the voice of the brother who blames it all on their hometown. In the end though he has done something so bad he won't even talk about it – ."I'm fifty eight years, still live at home like a kid. . . . Now I can't let my mamma tell you what her youngest boy did. . . Damn this town! I'm Leavin." The second track, 'Til I Get My Lovin' Back. is pure and simple country. It has everything needed to be a top 10 country hit – a pathetically sad story line, a crying, wailing pedal steel guitar, and a vocal sung in the key of nasal.

This really is a solid listen from front to back but the following are among the highlights from my perspective. For a change of pace, **Love that Girl** is a positive-toned, lilting love song about a lasting relationship. Fear not though, two songs later **Don't** Wanna Leave You Now is another love song where, in spite of the title and the surprising the use of a romantic string section backing, the final verse ends with "I gotta leave you now." **<u>Detroit Made</u>** is a pedal down tribute to an old Buick Electra 225 - his beloved "deuce and a quarter". It is rock and roll with a driving drum and guitar backing. Train to Birmingham is an up-tempo blues tune about a musician heading home. He never gets there, as it really never really was the plan - he "just likes the feeling of going home". Adios To California is, I suspect, an autobiographical look back at his leaving California for Nashville. It has a neo-country feel due to a strong pedal steel backing. Buried in its lyrics is album title.

John Hiatt fans will love this CD, of course. For those of you who aren't fans, "Dirty Jeans and Mudslide Hymns" is a great way great way to revisit his work and see what you've been missing.

Oxford American Southern Music Issue



ing the year a little different, every winter the Magazine of Southern Writing, The Oxford American publishes a Southern Music Issue focusing on one state, this year it is Mississippi, they also include a c.d. profiling the state. The C.D. has all kinds of great music on it from soul, blues, rock and country. It is a 27 song compilation that is always fun! Mostly obscure musicians and bands but that is where the fun lies!
