




# JAMMIN' AWAY THE BLUES

The 6th Annual Jammin' Away The Blues, a fundraiser for the Mental Health Association of Nebraska, has been scheduled for Saturday, May 17th in Lincoln (venue TBA.)

This years event will feature two of the west coast's hottest blues artists, Kevin Selfe & the Tornadoes and Mitch Kashmar. Both are Delta Groove Recording artists and represent the burgeoning blues scene in Portland, Oregon, home of the Safeway Waterfront Blues Festival. Both have been regulars at that festival.

Mitch has been through Lincoln in the past having done shows at The Zoo Bar. This will be Kevin's first time in Lincoln. Kevin was nominated for a Blues Blast award this year by Blues Blast Magazine and was a featured performer at the Blues Blast Award show at Buddy Guy's Legends in Chicago.

# THE RANDY OXFORD BAND TOURS IN SUPPORT OF NEW RELEASE

Seattle-based trombonist Randy Oxford is bringing his 6-piece high-energy blues and funk ensemble to 21st Saloon in Omaha on Thursday, January 16th.

During this road trip, the band will be promoting its brand new recording, ... it feels good..., en route to a repeat appearance at the International Blues Challenge in Memphis where it earned a highly-coveted

spot in the competition's finals in 2011.

The Randy Oxford Band is composed of a versatile group of seasoned vocalists and instrumentalists who primarily perform original compositions as reflected on ...it feels good...; 9 of the 10 songs were written by band members.

This is the band's 7th recording of its 10-year history and features the lead vocals of Jada Amy, Polly O'Keary (who also plays bass), Manuel Morais (guitar), and Randy Norris



(guitar). Richard Sabol keeps the beat steady as the group's long-time drummer.

"I have found that great musicians do not always make for a great band unless there is a harmonious chemistry between all band members, "observes Oxford. "I believe I have found that special combination, and I know listeners will agree once they hear this recording or see us perform live."

# Moreland and Arbuckle

As a social liberal residing in the capital city of the Sunflower State, there has been precious little incentive of late to claim publicly my status as a Kansan – but then comes **Moreland & Arbuckle** and their new album, *Seven Cities*. At their CD release party on August 23rd in the opulent Orpheum Theatre in Wichita, the trio (yes, a trio – Drummer Kendall Newby is represented by the ampersand, so the joke goes) presented its signature Kansas sound of plaintive lyrics with a dark, driving undercurrent hinting

of mayhem just around the corner.

You know you're at a Moreland & Arbuckle show when Aaron Moreland delves into his trance zone and begins his frenetic pacing, to and fro, back and forth, on the stage with an occasional kick of the left foot for emphasis. At times his persona breaks to the surface as he flashes a quick smile at a friend in the audience, but he pretty much maintains a solemn, intense affect whether he is sliding on his cigar box guitar or plucking his brand new cherry red Epiphone Casino.

It is Dustin Arbuckle who is the voice of the group. With his rich vocals, he never oversings but delivers each song in earnest. His vocal ability is rivaled only by his ability on the harp to add punch and color to each tune. He, too, is capable of twirling frenetic dance moves during his solos which add to the energy beaming off the stage. In addition to providing a solid rhythmic platform for the front men, Kendall Newby's harmonies add nicely to the texture of the music.

Of Seven Cities' 13 tracks, eight are original songs and three were written specifically for Moreland & Arbuckle by composers who know them well and nailed the sound and theme of the recording. For the first time, they used an outside producer – Matt Bayles – who is best known for his work with metal; bands such as Mastodon and Isis. Moreland & Arbuckle's prior efforts have included proud references to their Kansas roots, and this one is no different. The title of their 2008 release 1861 refers to the year Kansas was admitted as a state to the Union, and in 2010, Flood chronicled a devastating flood that wreaked havoc in 18 counties in southeast Kansas.

This time we are launched on Coronado's quest for the mythical seven cities of gold which brought him to Kansas in vain. The opening song, "Quivira," sets up the theme permeating the recording – the search for wealth and power, then the downfall. Although the Spanish explorer struck out, Moreland & Arbuckle have a treasure trove of songs in Seven Cities describing their own flaws or pointing out those in others through interesting lyrics and compelling hard-driving music. Having spent time with them off stage, I know that they are stable guys with positive outlooks on life (Moreland continues to maintain his position as a school psychologist for a local school district), so I find it intriguing that they choose to express so much angst in their music.

Arbuckle sings of unfriendly towns that treat visitors as stranger than most, gals who are wasting away, and men who bring gifts of misery. Even the sunshine is broken in the Moreland & Arbuckle's world. Arbuckle explains that their musical influences – Junior Kimbrough, Howlin' Wolf – for the most part contain dark and dirty vibes and that writing songs comes more naturally if the subjects at hand are serious.

The group will be embarking on its first tour of the UK in September and will return to the States at the end of the month. To pick up a copy of the record or get more information about their touring plans, check out the website at morelandandar-buckle.com.

We have some terrific talent here in the eastern Nebraska area and we would really like to continue to present the Nebraska Blues Challenge and offer local bands this opportunity to be heard at the International Blues Challenge in Memphis, but we need some committed volunteers and one or two solid team leaders to make this happen again in 2014.



This is Brandon Santini's sophomore solo disc and he has thrown together a stellar band to work with, most notably the addition of guitarist Jeff Jensen. The pairing of Santini and Jensen has proven to be somewhat magical as Santini's easy-going manner onstage is offset by the frenetic pace of Jensen's guitar playing. They're the perfect foils for one another.

Santini has an exceptional knack for writing tasteful songs with memorable instrumental catches and lyrics. The title song, a

reworking of Charlie Musselwhite's "This Time Another Year," maintains a steady walk as Santini's harp rolls back and forth, crisp but never overplayed, making the song

totally his own. Again with Jensen the two trade off leads on the number enhancing with the right amount of fills to compliment the other. Early in his career Santini had a tendency to play like John Popper, but over the years he has matured following the path of Chicago masters like Sonny Boy Williamson or Little Walter instead. He has mastered that direction knowing that when you blow a note you make it have meaning, it does not need to be overworked. And with that sense Santini has built his own unique sound that is

as easily identifiable as those aforementioned greats.


Speaking of Sonny Boy, there are two covers of his on this disc, "Bye Bye Bird" and "Raise Your Window." They are done with glowing tribute to the master, yet also delivered with an original sound of their own at the same time. Most of the tracks are originals by the band and are quite pleasant and bluesy. I love the step-up of "Got Good Lovin'," the slow blues of "Late In The Evening" and the frivolity of "Fish Is Bitin'" co-written by Jensen and bassist Bill Ruffino. Jeff Jensen rises to the forefront with his sensational playing on "Dig Me A Grave".

The band, besides Jeff Jensen, includes the aforementioned Bill Ruffino, who like Jensen departed from the West Coast to Memphis where he teamed up with his former bandmate. On drums is longtime Memphis musician James Cunningham who has worked with Robert Nighthawk Tooms and Mike Forrest in various band formats, including the Wampus Cats and the Eric Hughes Band. Making a guest appearance on three numbers is Victor Wainwright including "What You're Doing To Me" which he co-wrote with Santini and Jensen. The band also covers one of Wainwright's pieces, "Coin Operated Woman."

I first met Brandon Santini many years ago, introduced by mutual friend Billy Gibson. At the time Gibson was working seemingly constantly on Beale Street, earning the moniker "The Prince of Beale Street." Gibson is not as common a sight on Beale anymore, but Santini has surely taken on the role himself. You can find the band working the clubs several times a week. Perhaps it is time to pass the title from Gibson to Santini. A more worthy successor would be hard to find. Brandon fits it nicely. And This Time Another Year supports the claim.

## **Harper & Motor City Josh** · *Bare Bones*

Last November 21st Harper appeared at the 21st Saloon at one of their renowned Thursday matinee shows. Harper is one of those musicians that goes by only one name, like Fabian or Dion (showing my age here). Harper pretty much does all original music, sings and plays harp very well; and he plays a didgeridoo. Now how good he is at that I do not know, because I have no other didg-



eridoo players to compare him to. He had about 3 of these things, a couple large and rather artistically decorated. He said they are made from eucalyptus trees. Harper hails from Australia but has lived in Michigan for quite a while now. At the show he stated several times how excited he is to soon becoming a US citizen. This was about the third time I think to have seen him at this venue. I have always found his music to be fresh and enjoyable. Harper was offering the clientele at the show the opportunity to purchase his latest compact disc; I left the scene with one and can provide this short report on it. ### Smokin' Joe Kubek & Bnois King Road Dog's Life



After over twenty-five years together, Smokin' Joe Kubek and Bnois King could fairly be described as an enduring energy in the field of smooth Texas blues. What Smokin' Joe Kubek and Bnois King bring to the table are solid, traditional, electrified, Texas blues played so smoothly

it seems almost effortless. Smooth as glass vocals and smoking guitar have made this Dallas duo legendary.

ROAD DOG'S LIFE is their second album for Delta Groove Music and follows the unplugged CLOSE TO THE BONE. Executive producer Randy Chortkoff and Grammy Award winning producer David Z have delivered a warm endearing record of two Texas legends reveling in the blues they do so well, with Kim Wilson and Randy Chortkoff on harmonica and vocals, and solid support from The Mannish Boys rhythm section.

Favorites here include **K9 Blues** (Did she just call me a dog?), **That Look On Your Face** and **Talkin' Bout Bad Luck**; plus very interesting covers of George Harrison's **Don't Bother Me** and The Stone's **Play With Fire**.
