





EDDIE TURNER and the Trouble Twins

21st Saloon • Thurs. Jan. 8th • 6 pm • \$8

"Otherworldly", "scorching", "polyrhythmic" and "chilling" have all been used to describe Eddie Turner's guitar playing. His ethereal style is an amalgam of the Afro-Cuban rhythms of his heritage and the music that influenced him as a teenager: Chicago blues, jazz, R&B and psychedelic rock. The Cuban-born singer/guitarist cut his teeth in several rock bands contributing what Slate magazine describes as "spacey-yet-resounding solos." Now he emerges for the first time as his own bandleader on Rise, which arrives in stores in February, 2005.

Eddie "devilboy " Turner picked up his first guitar, a candy apple multi-pick-up Japanese Tiesco, when he was twelve. Raised in Chicago, he moved to the Rockies in the early 70's to attend the University of Colorado; "a ruse," he says, "to get my parents to keep sending checks." More inspired by music than by

academia, Turner immersed himself in the local scene, and stints with some notable acts ensued. He played in the region's first punk/r&b band The Immortal Nightflames, then with Grammy nominees Tracy Nelson, Mother Earth, and the 4-nikators, a group which has become legendary for its unique mix of soul, Motown, and rock. Turner got the chance to grab at the brass ring when Colorado compadre Tommy Bolin left his band Zephyr to form The James Gang and Deep Purple. He eagerly joined the hard rock, psychedelic, blues



band as a guitarist, singer and songwriter. But, tragedy struck with the sudden death of Zephyr lead singer Candy Givens. Deeply shaken, Eddie decided to "grow up" by taking a hiatus from performing music to become a realtor in Denver.

Yet, some people just refuse to "grow up". A decade later, when Eddie was invited to join the Ron Miles electric band led by one of the country's premier trumpeteers, he jumped at the chance. Then, in 1995 he rounded out the Otis Taylor Band adding what Guitar Player magazine describes as "otherworldly atmospherics (which) lend a decidedly cosmic ambience to Taylor's sound." Enhancing the spice and flavor of the trio, Eddie recorded five groundbreaking CDs, and toured the U.S. and Europe extensively.

Today, Turner continues to evolve as an artist. With nominations from the Blues Music Awards & many others, for his CD's: Rise, the Turner Diaries and Miracles & Demons, all produced by Kenny Passarelli. Running the gamut between Blistering guitar to deep delta blues, each CD dazzles with the chops and techniques that Turner has developed over the course of his unique genre melding career. It's evolutionary music – and quite grown up indeed.

Saturday January 31, 2015

Saturday, Winter Blues Fest 2015, between nine and eleven Blues acts on six different stages, followed by a jam session going into the wee hours, all in the Des Moines downtown Marriott. \$18 advance tickets, \$20 day of show. The music will begin at 5:00PM (4:00PM for the Blues In The Schools performers) and goes until approximately 1:00AM. The bands on Saturday currently projected, with more to be added as contracts are fi-



nalized are: The Belairs, Danielle Nicole Band (ala Trampled Under Foot fame), Moreland & Arbuckle, Hector Anchondo and Joe & Vicki Price. More bands will continue to be announced. In early December go to http://www.cibs.org/ to see a line-up of the bands and further info on advanced ticket sales. Also, there may be a discounted ticket prices for those going to both Friday and Saturday's shows. Tentatively that price may be \$30 for both Friday and Saturday. Check the CIBS website for more info as the date gets clos-

er. The Hotel WILL definitely sell out. The event is usually attended by around 2500 people, butthe tickets for the Saturday event will NOT sell out and you can purchase them the day of show without any worries (and we would assume the same is true for the Friday show, but buy your tickets in advance if you want to be sure).

JIM SUHLER AND MONKEY BEAT

Dallas native Jim Suhler has been making a big Texas-sized sound in and around his home state as well as all over the world for a lot of years with no signs of slowing down.

He's of the generation who cut their teeth on the classic bands of the day like The Allman Brothers, The Rolling Stones, Led Zepplin and ZZ Top. Then they worked their way back to the origins of the Blues-based music they grew up listening to.

"I got my first guitar when I was about 14," Jim recalls. "It was a little \$50 Harmony which I still

have. I've been playing nearly 40 years now. The early rock bands were the ones I heard that really turned my crank. Like a lot of guys my age who do what I do. They're retroactive with the influences.

Many artists claim they came by the Blues as a matter of course. Some say they choose it and some say it chose them.

"I guess it chooses you," Jim says. "But I chose to listen to it and enjoy it. Once I was exposed to it. It's something that's familiar to me. I like arranged music a lot but I also like the most simple, direct thing. That gut thing. I don't mean simple-minded simple but there's a beauty in that. The simple, direct stuff."

After spending his formative years in and out of various bands in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area Jim started his long-lasting group, Monkey Beat, in the early '90s and still fronts them today.

"We went through a couple of drummers before we made our first recording in the spring of '92," Jim said. "It came out in '93. The bass player was Carlton Powell and the drummer was Paul Hollis. Paul was with the band up until about 2002 and Carlton, the bass player was with me until this year. He'd been with me for 23 years. Our new guy's name is Chris Alexander from Austin. We've played just a few gigs with him. We have some more booked. We love Chris. His energy. His ability. His musicality. His personality is wonderful. He's a real good addition to the band. His nice to have that new energy he brings. With all due respect to Carlton, we couldn't have done it without him. But this is another chapter and I'm excited about what we're gonna do."

To add another dimension to Jim's busy schedule, he's also the lead/rhythm player in the seminal Blues rock band George Thorogood & The Destroyers, a job he's held since 1999. George came on the scene in the early '70s and has stayed viable for more than 40 years.

Most guys just starting out never dream they will end up on stage with their heroes at any time during their careers. Many of them "get a haircut and get a real job" before any of that happens.

"I've definitely had a classic rock influence with a Blues



sensibility," Jim says. "I don't profess to be a great Blues guitarist or even call my band a Blues band but my style is probably more a rock sound. I want to bring something fresh from Blues and do it without desecrating it. (Laughs)"

Playing in two acclaimed bands might seem to be a daunting undertaking for some. Jim takes it in stride and says playing with Thorogood is nothing like his band and he is able to keep the two separate with little stress.

"George probably has a more narrow range musically," Jim said. "It's a rock show and it's en-

tertainment. I have a lot more flexibility with respect to my band. George has a set of hit songs that he's expected to play. I don't have any hit songs so I can play whatever I want with Monkey Beat. George only does 12–13 songs in a set. You try to approach it professionally. Maybe you're tired or not feeling well you put on a good show no matter how I feel. Sometimes you just gotta dig in play. You just got some bad news or somebody just passed away or you've got a stomach virus. You've got to go out and play and not let it show. I come out and open shows for George. That might be the biggest challenge with only a 30 minute break between my set and then playing with him. But you're definitely warmed up when you start the George show.""

It appears Jim Suhler has a handle on his life and his musical path. He's been mentioned by this magazine as one of the up-and-comers on the scene and he's steadily gaining momentum wherever he plays!



NPR Music has noted the soulful baritone "skirts categories with ease, fitting in with current R&B innovators like Frank Ocean or Miguel, yet maintaining a strong awareness of a lineage that stretches from Ray Charles to Marvin Gaye to Lou Rawls to Maxwell."

James released his 2008 debut The Dreamer and 2010's Blackmagic with Brownswood Recordings before signing to Blue Note Records in 2013, where he released his breakout album, No Beginning No End, featuring the single "Trouble." The New York Times praised No Beginning No End, calling it a "cool and confident" album, adding that it "sounds like the result of the black-pop continuum, jazz and soul and hip-hop and R&B, slow-cooked for more than 50 years." THE BRANDON MILLER BAND

Music has always been a part of Brandon Miller's life. From an early age, his dad would let him explore his record collection of Led Zeppelin, Genesis, Aerosmith and other classic rock legends. Miller spent countless days and nights trying to recreate the sounds of his musical heroes. After sculpting his sound for years, he formed the Brandon Miller Band, a powerful, guitar-driven blues-rock trio. Having

released two, full-length albums and sharing the stage with artists like Jonny Lang, Foghat, Night Ranger and Eddie Money; Brandon Miller brings a fiery passion to the guitar that is unlike any other.

Brandon grew up listening to classic rock from the 60s and 70s because of his parents love for music. Listening to the rock n roll stories of disc jockeys from a famous Kansas City radio station just stirred the fire of his love for music even more. When he first began elementary school, his older brother had begun playing guitar. Brandon would sneak into his brothers room to grab his guitar just to play around with it. Driving his brother mad because of his always wanting to play, Brandon received his first guitar for Christmas when he was seven.

His love for music quickly turned to dedication and devotion after he started attending concerts at a very young age. Seeing idols such as Kenny Wayne Shepherd, Eric Clapton, Joe Bonamassa, Tom Petty, Aerosmith, KISS, Rush, Fleetwood Mac, and Lynyrd Skynyrd, he wanted to take it to the next level of playing. He was learning very quickly and could start playing songs he was listening to. However, when he was around the age of 11, his frustration began to show. He couldn't recreate the solos and difficult guitar work which made him sit his guitar down and didn't want to touch it. He didn't play as much as what he used to and the music bug hadn't completely bit him yet.

Shortly after he turned thirteen in seventh grade, the music bug bit him deeply and over the summer his talent exploded. He would sit and practice for hours upon hours. Some days he would practice up to ten hours, and soon he was recreating what before he couldn't. He began going to blues jam sessions around Kansas City where he began



to gain popularity with his audiences in large part due to his young age and immense talent. Quickly he realized that his age always presented some problems when clubs and bars would not let him into play until they witnessed his precocious ability first hand. At these jams, he met some of the most influential musicians in his career. With these musicians, he discovered his true love blues. He


could be found during his middle school years not listening to what was popular at school dances or on the pop radio stations, but listening to legendary blues artists such as Robert Johnson, Albert King, Freddie King, Howlin Wolf, Muddy Waters, John Lee Hooker, and many more. One artist stuck out the most, Stevie Ray Vaughan. Listening to how he put all of his emotions into his playing inspired Brandon to do the same to spread the blues and bring it back to Kansas City.

Over the next few years, audiences would come from throughout the Kansas City area to see this young guitar-slinger play the blues. Soon enough he was playing every weekend and spreading his music and his blues in particular to many.

Brandon currently performs with his own band, Brandon Miller Band, as well as a new venture with Danielle Schnebelen of Trampled Under Foot, Danielle Nicole Band.






