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## RIP NICK HOLT

1/15/1940 - 6/22/2009

Bruce Iglauer reports that Nick Holt, the bass-playing younger brother of Magic Slim, died of brain cancer on Monday, June 22, 2009 in Lincoln, Nebraska, where he had been living. He was 69. Born in Granada, Mississippi in 1940, Nick moved to Chicago in 1956. Four years later, he and his brother formed the notorious Magic Slim & The Teardrops. This band persevered to become a mainstay of the Chicago blues scene. Slim's raucous guitar and Nick's insistent bass lines anchored the band, and created a tough, rock-solid groove so propulsive that it packed the dance floors nightly. It wasn't that Nick did anything fancy or flashy on the bass; he just played it simple and right. Magic Slim & The Teardrops recorded numerous

albums for a wide array of labels such as Rooster Blues, Blind Pig, Wolf Records, Alligator, Isabel, Delmark, Red Lightnin', Black & Blue, Evidence, and others. The band relocated to Lincoln, Nebraska, where they had a huge following from their touring appearances at the Zoo Bar.



Nick had not been touring for the last few years, possibly for health reasons. In addition to scores of Magic Slim & The Teardrops records, and various sessions as a sideman, Nick leaves us with three releases bearing his name:



## MAGIC SLIM FEATURED ON COVER OF LIVING BLUES MAGAZINE!

Blind Pig recording artist Magic Slim is featured on the cover of the current (June) issue of Living Blues magazine. In the eight page feature article inside, writer David Whiteis validates

Magic Slim and the Teardrops' pedigree as "the last real Chicago blues band" when he refers to the golden age of Chicago's blues clubs in the 60's and says, "Magic Slim and the Teardrops have remained true to the raw, high-energy atmosphere of those legendary venues with as much fidelity - and at least as much heart - as any blues band still working."

Referring to Slim's most recent recording (his seventh for Blind Pig), the writer says that "Midnight Blues finds him roaring through a characteristically uncompromising set of bone-crunching shuffles and angst-ridden slow blues, delivered with his trademark musical and emotional fire." He continues, "His leads combine dexterousness with almost atavistic fecocity; his lyrics are streetsy and tough; and his personal touches are among the most compelling in modern blues."



## **Endings, Beginnings and Remembering**

JON DEE GRAHAM and ZOO BAR BLUES

As I write this, on the evening of July 22, word is spreading about the passing of Nick Holt, Magic Slim's brother, longtime bass player and member of the Zoo Bar family from way back. I did not know Nick well at all but I do know that Nick was much loved by many people and was a link to the early days of the Zoo Bar. He passed after battling brain cancer and his passing leaves a huge hole not only in the hearts of the Holt family and the Boehmer family, but in the hearts of the Zoo Bar family and the Blues family.

More sad news came last week with the passing of Toni Halpenny, wife of Blue House soundman Shawn Halpenny, who has been a part of the Omaha music scene for many years. The Blues Society and Terry O'Halloran assisted the guys from Blue House in hosting a couple of benefits for the Halpenny family, both of which generated funds that were very helpful to them during difficult times. Toni's passing leaves too many people, family and friends, behind. Hopefully they will continue to feel her strength as well as her love.

A young friend of a friend in Kansas City has been fighting cancer and writing an extraordinary blog about her experiences. She's a musician named Abigail Henderson, her band is The Gaslights and her blog called "Hope is My Middle Name."

At one point in her battle she wrote, "Love those you love. Tell them you love them. Do not suffer fools. Do not make excuses. Life is too short. Life is too short. Really."

And after she'd survived treatments and was faced with radical surgeries she concluded another blog with this simple quotation, "Time wounds. All heals." (a quote which seems equally attributed to John Lennon and Groucho Marx. That disparity seems fitting too.)

My thoughts and prayers go out to all the beloved family and beloved friends of Nick and Toni and to everyone who is hurting, missing someone, fighting for their lives in battles large or small and to everyone who needs an open heart or a helping hand.



Countdown to Jon Dee Graham at Sunday Roadhouse or Luminous Hope

One of my musical heroes and personal favorites, Jon Dee Graham is next at Dean Dobmeier's and Gary Grobeck's Sunday Roadhouse concert series on Sunday, July 5, at 5 p.m. These shows now take place at Murphy's Lounge, 96th & L.

Graham is a celebrated songwriter, guitarist and performer whose luminous cynical optimism fuels music that connects with listeners' hearts and souls while still delivering plenty of sizzling guitar power that's built to rock.

Washington, D.C., filmmaker Mark Finkelpearl created a marvelous 2008 film,



I say "to that point" because, as regular readers of my musings may remember, in July of 2008 Graham survived a near-fatal car accident. It was just six days after Graham's last Sunday Roadhouse appearance. The artist fell asleep at the wheel of his car while heading home to Austin, Texas, from Dallas after a solo gig. Despite breaking his back in two places, breaking and fracturing numerous ribs and undergoing an emergency spleenectomy, Graham was back onstage at his home base of the Continental Club almost a month to the day after the accident. Since then Graham has been steadily ramping up his live performance schedule, including a month in Europe opening shows for pal James McMurtry.

In the June 2009 issue of Dallas' music magazine BUDDY, Graham was interviewed. Journalist Tom Geddie wrote, "Jon Dee Graham was driving home to Austin from a gig in Dallas early on Saturday morning, last July 26, when he apparently feel asleep at the wheel and crashed his car into a fence along Interstate 35: two broken ribs, cracked vertebrae, and a concussion. By the time a state trooper got to the accident scene, Graham was out of his car, standing up and leaning against a barbed wire fence. "I was in shock," he said. "I was bleeding so much internally that I was bleeding from the mouth. It was a mess. The state trooper touched me on the shoulder and I snapped to, and said, 'It's not as bad as it looks.' "He said, 'Sir, it looks pretty bad. Maybe you should sit down." Graham refused, because he wanted his guitar from his car, which easily could have burst into flames. "I had to get it out. The state trooper said there were more important things to worry about than a guitar. I said, 'No, there's not" The trooper ran to the car and got the guitar for him."

Graham spent the end of May and early June of 2009 in the studio recording his next disc. The working title, IT'S NOT AS BAD AS IT LOOKS. The CD is due out in September, but Graham hits Omaha for what is bound to be another incandescently rocking show on Sunday, July 5, at 5 p.m. He'll be on the homebound leg of his annual Chicago

trip where he performs not one but two nights as part of Fitzgerald's celebrated Americana Music Fest. Before Graham's astonishingly wonderful show last July 20 here in Omaha, filmmaker Finkelpearl wrote me, prepare for the room to levitate with love. He was right.

Graham's music speaks to the heart and is a life-preserver for the tired soul. If you like the kind of music I write about and you were only going to see one club show this year, this show should be it. Period. I've traveled to Austin twice to see Graham since the accident and am counting the days till this show. Even if his music doesn't speak to you the way it does to me, I guarantee you'll hear some great stories, beautiful songs, loud guitar and come away smiling. See sundayroadhouse.com for details.

## O.B.S. MAILBAG

Hello Everyone-

It is with a heavy heart that I inform you of the passing of one of the truly legendary figures in music, the Queen of the Blues, Koko Taylor. Koko had surgery May 19 for some ongoing gastrointestinal issues and developed an infection that ultimately could not be contained. This morning we were told she'd taken a turn for the worse overnight. She passed away around 3:15pm today.

Born a sharecropper's daughter in Shelby County, Tennessee, Koko boarded a bus to Chicago in 1954 as part of the great migration of southern blacks to the urban centers of the north. For years she worked as a housecleaner until Willie Dixon discovered her in 1963 sitting in with a band at a South Side nightclub. She had an R&B hit with Dixon's Wang Dang Doodle in 1966 and was one of the first Chicago blues artists to work the white clubs on the city's North Side.

She signed with Alligator in 1975 and received Grammy nominations for eight of her nine Alligator albums (she won a Grammy in 1984 for the live multi-artist album Blues Explosion on Atlantic Records). She won a record 29 Blues Music Awards (the Grammy of the blues world) and in 1999 was inducted into the Blues Foundation's Hall Of Fame. "There are many kings of the blues," said The Boston Globe, "but only one queen."

Koko's last release, 2007's Old School, was a fiery return to the gritty blues she sang upon first arriving in the Windy City. She was the modern-day version of female blues trailblazers like Bessie Smith and Memphis Minnie and as such influenced generations of artists from Janis Joplin and Bonnie Raitt to Susan Tedeschi and Shemekia Copeland. Our deepest sympathies go out to Koko's family and blues lovers everywhere.

## CD Reviews



#### Chicago Blues Harmonica Project *More Rare Gems*



This is the second installment from Severn spotlighting relatively unknown harmonica players. The six harp players are backed by The Chicago Bluesmasters.

The harp players are all excellent musicians, and The Bluesmasters provide uncluttered and solid backing. Most of the songs

are blues classics. I enjoyed this cd a lot, but I'm not sure it is for everyone. If you are a harp nut – like me – or really enjoy basic Chicago blues, then I would recommend this cd to you. I think the talented harp men would have been better served, though, if they would have used their own groups to showcase their fine playing.

Again, I would recommend this cd on a qualified note. The cd could have had a more diverse sound and still kept the Chicago harp feel by using the backing musicians that play behind the harp players night after night.

#### Zac Harmon · From the Root

Zac Harmon is a guitarist/singer and writer from Jackson, Mississippi. He has worked with Z.Z. Hill and Sam Myers as a guitarist. In 2004 he won the International Blues Challenge and in 2006 he won a Blues Music Award for Best New Artist.



Harmon's latest cd is what I would call contemporary soul-blues, but it also has hints of gospel and reggae. The soulful vocals at times are reminiscent of Johnny Taylor. Harmon is an accomplished guitarist, but does not overplay. He uses dynamics to construct his playing to benefit the song – not just show how quickly he can play.

This is an outstanding cd by an artist that deserves wider recognition. Don't miss Harmon live. He puts on a very good show – just ask anyone that has seen him at Murphy's. I hope he plays there again, soon!

## Kris Lager Band The Mighty Quinn

Along with Des Moines' Matt Woods, Nebraska's Kris Lager has laid the groundwork to become the High Plains' next blues act of note. Earning their road apprenticeship as the band for Mato Nanji's Indigneous, The Kris Lager Band has release their fourth album, 'The Mighty Quinn.' Like many bands that are



allowed to develop at the less than frantic pace of today's internet driven music industry, Lager's second and third CD's displayed progressive improvement and strong lyrical melody lines that are indicative of the early bluesrock progenitors such as The Allman Brothers, Bonney & Delaney and Leon Russell. As the critically applauded band, "The Screaming Cheetah Wheelies' learned however, this is a narrowing genre today and although the Derek Trucks Band is doing well with their World Music come blues feel, few others within this field seem to rise above a regional cult status.

'The Might Quinn' is a powerful record where the nuisance of the inter-play between Lager's slide guitar and Miah Weir's keyboards can, at times, over-shadow the songs but, after numerous playings, Lager's true-to-self style slowly transcends and the true power behind the album emerges. This is not your passive listening, blues friendly, compact disc. Instead the listener is required to invest in the audio experience as the band moves through complicated but enjoyable passages.

On the track, "Mean Old World" Lager's emotive vocals lines broach new areas for the band as they pioneer in a more tentative yet heart-felt layer brushed up against an aggressive slide guitar line. On 'Hold On' the band melds an island rhythm over rich blues textures akin to the sounds of "461 Ocean Boulevard." While not an easy album to digest in initial airings, 'The Might Quinn' shows the Kris Lager Band growing by writing songs that are well outside of the narrow confines of the blues industry today. This is a serious album that is filled with songs that separates the partisans from the artisans and like anything work having – the climb is worth the view. "Mama always told me not to look into the eye's of the sun, but mama, that's where the fun is."


