

The old Willie Dixon adage, "blues is truth," perfectly describes the searing, contemporary blues-rock of world-renowned guitarist and vocalist Coco Montoya.

Taught by the "Master of the Telecaster," Albert Collins, but with a hard-edged sound and style all his own, Montoya mixes his forceful, melodic guitar playing and passionate vocals with memorable songs, delivering the blues' hard-est truths. He earned his status as a master guitarist and soul-powered vocalist through years of paying his dues as a sideman with Collins (first as a drummer) and then with John Mayall's Bluesbreakers, before launching his solo

career in 1993. Five years of constant touring with Collins and ten years with Mayall turned him into a monster player and dynamic performer. Montoya has released eight solo albums—including three for Alligator between 2000 and 2007—and has played at



clubs, concert halls and major festivals all over the world. Guitar Player says Montoya plays "stunning, powerhouse blues with a searing tone, emotional soloing, and energetic, unforced vocals."

POLLY O'KEARY AND THE RHYTHM METHOD

With BluesEd band The Redwoods • Thursday July 13th @ 5:30 • \$10 • Chrome Lounge • 8552 Park Dr, Omaha



Polly's eclectic blues style reflects her colorful history. She grew up in a log cabin with no electricity or plumbing, and began her music career a teen working bars in Mexico. At 19 she had a husband in prison and an 8th grade education. Twenty years later, she

was a bassist for touring blues bands, playing a total of four continents, was one of the Pacific Northwest's most highly awarded blues artists, and was working toward a Ph.D. Polly is today a 6 -time Washington Blues Society Best Female Vocalist, a four-time Best Songwriter, has won Best Album from Washington and Inland Empire blues societies, and many more awards.

Groups Polly has toured with include Too Slim and the Taildraggers, The Soul of John Black, and the Randy Oxford Band.

Polly O'Keary and the Rhythm Method is the trio she built with her husband and drummer Tommy Cook, also a highly sought touring drummer and winner of the 2017 Washington Blues Society Blues Drummer award, with whom she shared rhythm section duties for international touring act Too Slim and the Taildraggers for four years. Rounding out the trio is David Miller, who grew up listening to blues in Texas.

At 17, then living in California, Miller met a piano player who was then working for Tommy Castro. The older musician re-

cruited Miller to come play at several bars, and assured the young man that he could get him in, underage though he was. Miller became a regular in clubs in the Bay Area, sitting in with local and touring acts night after night. At 25, then living in San Luis Obispo, he assembled The Dave Miller Band, and for the next 18 years, he and the group went on to become one of Southern California's most popular blues bar bands, leading one reviewer to describe his "jaw-dropping guitar licks" and praise his "extraordinary mixture of inspiring virtuosity both vocally and instrumentally."

Polly O'Keary and the Rhythm Method's 2014 debut album "Compass," reflecting the humor and tragedy of her checkered life, won international rave reviews, and the trio's irreverent, boisterous and joyful performances immediately established them on the national blues touring circuit.

"It's been a hell of a ride," said Polly. "I guess I always thought as a young musician that when I got to 40 or so, I'd be wrapping it up. I was so wrong! I spent a lifetime learning, and I finally feel like I've put everything I learned into one place. This band represents 75 years of experience between the three of us and we haven't wasted a minute of it. There aren't any two other musicians alive I'd rather work with than the guys I've got. I'm incredibly excited about these next years."

George Clinton and Parliament Funkadelic packed the Bourbon Theater in Lincoln, NE with a mixed crowd of people, both young and old.

Little Mike and the Tornadoes

Queens native Little Mike grew up on the very competitive New York City music scene. He started playing harp at age 14 and took up piano two years later. His first brush with the blues came while hearing John Lee Hooker at Carnegie Hall and later listening to a Paul Butterfield record. After that Little Mike couldn't get enough. If a blues show was in New York City, Mike was there, especially when the Chicago players came to town. His favorite was Muddy

Waters. "I used to go and see Muddy anytime he was within 150 miles of New York," he said. "He is easily the biggest influence on the band and my playing. And if it's not Muddy himself then it's the great guys he always picked to play with him, like Pinetop Perkins and Otis Spann on the piano or Little Walter and James Cotton on harp."

Another musician Mike greatly admired was Paul Butterfield, who would regularly come and see Mike's band perform. He liked their old "Chess sound" and took Mike under his wing. Mike says, "He helped me become less of a blues purist, and more of a music purist. Paul opened up my playing and taught me to put my blues in other music forms, to make it very personal." Other influences cited include Chuck Berry, Bo Diddley, the Rolling Stones, Jimmy Reed, Eddie Taylor, Sonny Boy Williamson, and Walter Horton.

After leading a series of bands as a teenager, Mike formed the Tornadoes in 1978. At age 22, Mike was leading one of the busiest and toughest blues bands in New York City. Whenever a visiting blues artist came to town and needed a band, Little Mike and the Tornadoes usually got the call, backing artists such as Walter Horton, Otis Rush, Bo Diddley, Lightning Hopkins, and Big Mama Thornton. Mike's reputation led to the band's touring as the backing unit for blues legends such as Pinetop Perkins, Hubert Sumlin, and Jimmy Rogers.

Little Mike and the Tornadoes proudly describe themselves as a "working class band" that plays blues with a rock 'n' roll edge. "We all come from working class families and tough, working class neighborhoods," says Mike. "Working class people have always been our biggest supporters."

Music luminaries who have sat in with the band include Robert Cray, Jaco Pastorius, Kim Wilson, Jorma Kaukonen, James Cotton, Los Lobos' Cesar Rosas and David Hidalgo, Stevie Ray Vaughan, and Taj Majal. In 1988, Mike played on and produced Pinetop Perkin's first domestic release, "After Hours". The following year he did the same for Hubert Sumlin's "Heart & Soul". Both recordings are available on Blind Pig Records. In 1990, Blind Pig released the first solo album by Little Mike and the Tornadoes, "Heart Attack", which Mike also



produced. It features all original songs and guest appearances by Perkins, Sumlin, Butterfield, Ronnie Earl, and Big Daddy Kinsey. The album thrust the band out into the spotlight, where they began to tour almost non-stop across North America and Europe, establishing themselves as true road warriors. Little Mike's success led to a 1992 follow-up release entitled "Payday". The material is once again all original and draws upon Mike's blue-collar upbringing

and experience. Says Little Mike, "It's the best thing I've ever done. Best writing, best playing, and best producing. I think I'm finally getting the hang of this."

From there Mike moved on to record Flynn's Place on Flying Fish records, then Hot Shot on Ichiban and has now released "Forgive Me" on ElRob Records. Also released independently was a live release from Paris, France, as well as a collection cut with his most recent touring band featuring Troy Nahumko, Chris Brzezicki, and Cam Robb, that features special guests Sonny Rhodes, and Jim Mckaba. 2014 saw the release of Little Mike and the Tornadoes critically acclaimed "All The Right Moves". Additionally, during the summers of 2014, 2015 & 2016 Little Mike toured throughout the southeastern U.S. as well as touring Southern Europe.

How better to follow up on the acclaim and success of the back to back to back releases of "Live at the St. Augustine BLUZFEST" with special guest Zora Young; dovetailed with Zora Young with Little Mike and the Tornadoes "Friday Night". Followed by "Genuine Blues Legends" with Pinetop Perkins & Jimmy Rogers, than to release the hard chargin' "How Long?", in August 2016. ""This recording includes original tunes as well as a few blues classics, with a nod toward the more modern approach as well. As usual, the songs are pure high energy as well as deep down in the alley. You can hear Pinetop Perkins in Mike's piano playing and James Cotton in his harp playing"

ANDY T BAND WITH ALABAMA MIKE

The Andy T Band featuring Alabama Mike is a potent new blend of blues talent. The group pairs veteran Nashville guitarist Andy Talamantez with the dynamic San Francisco Bay area singer Michael A. Benjamin, aka Alabama Mike.

Benjamin makes his recording debut with the Andy T Band on the group's fourth album, Double Strike. To be released June 16, Double Strike features Benjamin singing half of the songs and Nick Nixon singing the other half. Double

Strike presents the Andy T Band at its best, before and after Nixon left the group in 2016 due to health issues.

The performers' credit for Double Strike goes to the Andy T Band featuring Alabama Mike with special guests Nick Nixon and Anson Funderburgh. Co-producer and guest guitarist Funderburgh will also join the band for its 2017 summer tour. Previous Andy T Band albums produced by Funderburgh earned Blues Music Awards nominations and Blues Blast Awards nominations.

"I Want You Bad," Double Strike's swaggering, house-rocking opening track, stars Benjamin's soaring tenor vocals and gospel-infused shout. Nixon takes the lead for the loose and fun "Deep Inside," a Jimmy Reed-styled song featuring Greg Izor's harmonica. Benjamin returns for the deceptively named swinging big band blues number, "Sad Times." Nixon sings the sweetly authentic gospel-soul ballad, "Sweet Thing." Shifting to a slower tempo, Benjamin nails "Doin' Hard

Time" with total conviction.

There's much more to savor on Double Strike. "Where Did Our Love Go Wrong," featuring Benjamin at his most passionate, echoes the classic, swaying New Orleans rhythmand-blues of Fats Domino.

Talamantez, a Los Angeles native who moved to Nashville in 2008, has been a gigging musician since his teens. After performing part time while he worked in the aerospace industry for 23 years, Talamantez took the full-time music plunge in 1997. His first seven years of touring musician included two years with Smokey Wilson and five years with Guitar Shorty. He toured internationally with other major blues acts.

In 2011, Talamantez and Nashville blues artist Nick Nixon formed the Andy T – Nick Nixon Band. The group released three acclaimed albums, all produced by Texas guitar ace Anson Funderburgh.

When Nixon retired in 2016, Talamantez asked his peers if they knew a singer who could replace the ailing vocalist. Phoenix harmonica player Bob Corritore immediately recommended Benjamin, aka Alabama Mike. Benjamin sang in gospel sextet with his five siblings during his childhood in Alabama. A longtime student of the blues, he made his belated professional debut as blues singer in 1999.

To be released June 17th on Mascot/Provogue, 'ALIVE in Amsterdam' is the sound of a man announcing his resurrection after a period on the ropes. 



"T" prepared and distributed BSO's biweekly news eblasts for 3 years, from summer of 2014 to March, 2017. "T" still

serves as back-up for the eblast responsibilities.

She has volunteered at the BSO tent for every Playing with Fire concert since the beginning of Playing with Fire in 2004.

"T" has been a volunteer through the years for any of the BSO-sponsored events: signing up new/renewing members, manning the BSO tent to sell merchandise, etc.

"T" is a charter member of BSO. She moved to Omaha from Lincoln in 1998, when she knew exactly 2 people in Omaha. She had been a regular at the Zoo Bar, and so she was looking for places in Omaha to hear some blues. It so happened that the Omaha blues society was starting at that same time, and "T" recalls having seen an article about the new blues society. The article included a phone number to call for more information. "T" called, and she got signed up right away. Her first volunteer event was helping with getting the printed newsletters ready to take to the post office. This happened at Greg Lindberg's house. "T" doesn't remember who all was there, but she thinks there were about six volunteers helping to get the newsletters ready for mailing.

"T" is employed as a software tester for Moody's Analytics. She also volunteers for Feline Friendz, a nonprofit with the mission to reduce the stray and feral cat population and stop the unnecessary euthanasia of stray and feral cats due to over-population. The organization supports the humane method of TNR (Trap, Neuter, Return) and traps the cats, pays to get them fixed & to get their shots, and then returns them to where they were trapped. "T" feeds 4–5 feral cats year around and has built feeding shelters and winter shelters for them. She has 2 pet cats, Richard IV and Glory Girl, both trapped as kittens. "T" is an avid gardener of flowers and vegetables. She loves playing in the dirt and pulling weeds, which is immedite gratitication to her.

"T" shares, "Becoming a member of BSO and volunteering was one of the best things to happen to me when I moved to Omaha. Being new to town, this helped me meet people with the same musical interests. For me, it's all about the music and, by volunteering, I am able to help spread the word about the wonderful Blues scene in Omaha that some may not be aware of. I feel that I am doing my part in helping to keep the blues alive in Omaha."

CAROLYN WONDERLAND WITH 40 SINNERS

The Los Angeles Times says, "Carolyn Wonderland is the real deal! She is an amazing guitar player. And damn, can she sing."

"A dollop of Janis Joplin, a slice of Stevie Ray Vaughan, and a big load of soulful individuality... that's Wonderland, a seething- hot Texas singer-guitarist. And she can write too! No wonder Dylan is a avowed fan."

A musical force equipped with the soulful vocals of Janis and the guitar slinging skills of Stevie Ray, Carolyn Won-

derland reaches into the depths of the Texas blues tradition with the wit of a poet. She hits the stage with unmatched presence, a true legend in her time.

Carolyn Wonderland is touring in support of her 5th studio album, Moon Goes Missing, her first in 6 years. Her prior release, "Peace Meal" (in 2011), reached Top 10 on Billboard's Blues



chart. The qualities that have cemented her notoriety as one of today's top blues rock artists are on full display with this new release.

Wonderland's vocal proficiency was well-established in the singer's mid-teens, landing her gigs at Fitzgerald's by age 15. She absorbed Houston influences like Little Screamin' Kenny and soaked up the Mad Hatter of Texas music, Doug Sahm. The Lone Star State was as credible and fertile a proving ground for blues in the 1980s as existed, especially in Austin with Stevie Ray Vaughan & Double Trouble, the Fabulous Thunderbirds, Angela Strehli, Omar & the Howlers, and Lou Ann Barton all in their prime. By the following decade, Austin's blues luster thinned, but Houston, always a bastion of soul and R&B, boasted the Imperial Monkeys with the effervescent Carolyn Wonderland as ruler of the jungle. In the early 1990s Wonderland & the Imperial Monkeys were invited to the Guadalupe Street Antone's in Austin. There, they were treated like royalty with the singer as

the queen of hearts in the club's post-Stevie Ray Vaughan stable, which included Toni Price, Johnny and Jay Moeller, Sue Foley, Mike and Corey Keller, and the Ugly Americans. It was a good bar for the Monkeys to hang, and Austin felt so comfortable that when the band called it quits a few years later, she set her sights on Austin at the start of the millennium. Living in Austin renewed Carolyn Wonderland's focus on her multiple talents, underlining luxurious vocals with fine guitar work, trumpet, and piano, as well as that remarkable ability to whistle on key. A series of each-better-than-the-next discs began with Alcohol & Salvation

in 2003 ("songs about booze and God: records are a time capsule of what happened that year"). Her music played in television series such as Time of Your Life and Homicide. circle of musician friends and admirers broadened to include not only Ray [Benson, who produced Miss Understoodl but also the late Eddy Shaver. Shelley King,

and yes, Bob Dylan, who likened her composition "Bloodless Revolution" to "a mystery movie theme." She began co-writing with locals Sarah Brown, Ruthie Foster, Cindy Cashdollar, and Guy Forsyth; sat in with Los Lobos, Robert Earl Keen, and Ray Wylie Hubbard; recorded with Jerry Lightfoot; and toured with Buddy Guy and Johnny Winter. She also claims membership in the all-girl Sis Deville, the gospel-infused Imperial Crown Golden Harmonizers, and takes aw-shucks credit for inspiring Amsterdam's annual WonderJam. It was magic in the studio, too, as Miss Understood came to life, a canny mix of Benson's production, Wonderland's compositions, and select covers of Terri Hendrix, J.J. Cale, and Rick Derringer that punched her sound up a notch. As soon as the album roared to life, it was clear the singer-songwriter-guitarist-whistler had delivered on her long-awaited promise."

Every now and then, you run across someone with a library's worth of stories to tell. But unlike the raconteurs who regale friends with well-embellished versions of their exploits, these storytellers have lived so much, they reveal chapters of their hard-won wisdom slowly, carefully, like layers peeled from an onion.

Ray Bonneville didn't even open his storybook until his early 40s, some 20 years after he started performing. But with a style that sometimes draws comparisons to JJ Cale and Daniel Lanois, this blues-influenced, New Orleans-inspired "song and groove man," as he's been so aptly described, luckily found his rightful calling.
