What's New with BluesEd?

BluesEd Draws Crowd at Pizza Shoppe Collective; Seniors Shine

People were literally walking in off Maple Street on May 3 to hear all six BluesEd bands belt out the blues at the Pizza Shoppe Collective in downtown Benson. Mojo Bag turned in a stellar performance as sisters Ali and Jenny Fisher wowed the crowd with vocals. Ben Curran (guitar), Ed Berry (keyboards), and Joe Fox (drums) round out the seasoned band. Third-year member Jenny added her skills on bass guitar as well. Ali, who graduates from Millard South this year and a six-year veteran of BluesEd, said she got involved in the program

because of the influence of her cousin, Monica Maher, who was also a BluesEd artist. Monica played for Backer's Blues, named after Doug Backer, one of the original founders of BluesEd. Ali and Jenny's parents, Bill and Barb Fisher, are in their second year as directors of the BluesEd program.

One audience member at PS Collective said, "I heard this great vocalist when we walked by and had to come in and see what was going on." The vocalist was Becca Erdman for Far & Wide. Far & Wide also performed May 17 in Stanton,

Iowa, for the graduation party of their guitarist, Phil Pfeiffer. Phil received an acrylic guitar as a gift from the band. "It's a really big deal to me. I am really grateful to be in a band with such cool people. I wouldn't have wanted my last BluesEd season to be with anybody else," said Phil in an e-mail to the band members.

Other seniors in their final year of the program are: Ed Berry (Elkhorn South), keyboardist for Mojo Bag, 6 years in BluesEd; Ben Curran (Lincoln Southeast), guitarist for Mojo Bag, 2 years

in BluesEd; Grace Bydalek (Brownell-Talbot), vocalist for Dilemma, 3 years in BluesEd; Trace Jones (Creighton Prep), guitarist for Dilemma, 3 years in BluesEd; Ben Wellwood (Millard South), guitarist and harmonica player for Us & Them, 3 years in BluesEd; and Connor Swanson (Millard South), guitarist for Us & Them, 4 years in BluesEd.

Be sure to come out to the BluesEd Fundraiser June 8, 4 p.m., at the Slowdown, 729 N 14th St. Bad Brad and the Fat Cats will be the closing band at 8 p.m.

REVEREND RAVEN AND THE CHAIN SMOKIN' ALTAR BOYS KEEP IT SIMPLE AND REAL

With their attention getting oddity of a name and Milwaukee as a home base, Reverend Raven and the Chain Smokin' Altar Boys are different in some ways, but faithful to the real Blues in the ways that count.

"The Reverend's ability to keep a crowd going all night long is a matter of haunted local legend."

Once you hear their album Shake Your Boogie you'll know why the rest of the

country is catching on. They have a simple and straight forward sound that locks into a variety of mostly Chicago type grooves. That makes sense since main man Reverend Raven was born on the south side of Chicago.

Where better for a Bluesman to call home?

"You know I hate these cookie cutter bios. I know they are necessary but you are only as good as last night's gig," said the Reverend Raven.

I'll keep it brief and simple: The Reverend started playing



the Blues in 1971 after he heard a Freddy King concert. His career was interrupted by a 15 tear stint in the Navy where he got his nickname. One of his duties as a Chief was to consul sailors with personal problems and the crew started calling him Reverend and it stuck.

After the Navy he moved to Milwaukee and hooked up with Jimmy Rogers longtime harmonica player Madison Slim and started collecting the personnel who now make up The

Chain Smokin' Altar Boys. Since then they have opened for a who's who of Blues greats and moved up the line to play some of the top clubs and festivals in the country.

Among the festivals Reverend Raven and the Chain Smokin' Altar Boys will be playing this year is The 2014 Greeley Blues Jam, June 14 at the Island Grove Regional Park. I know you'll be glad when you come out and hear them. They're a real good time.


BSO SUMMER HELP WANTED!

RED ELVISES' founding member Igor Yuzov has been traveling the world conquering the hearts of screaming fans for over 10 years with upbeat music and amusing lyrics that demand, quite literally at times, that you "shake your ass". Constantly touring the globe and playing with a variety of talented musicians, and continuing to release albums on their own label, Red Elvises are known to be "the hardest working band in show business". They are also known to be extremely talented, over-the-top performers, complete with outrageously sexy lounge suits, pelvic gyrations, audience conga lines and a drum "solo" that includes the entire band playing one drum set simultaneously. These acts, among others, continually justify their title as the world's greatest "Rokenrol Vaudevillians". Red Elvises' eclectic career includes 11 studio albums, a double live album, and spotlights in both television and movies, including Six String Samurai, Mail Order Bride, VH1's Behind the Music, and Melrose Place. In 2005 Red Elvises were spotted on MTV while playing for the Live 8 benefit concert in Moscow. Currently they reside in Venice, CA, where they continue to pursue numerous film and music projects.

It was a special night to watch this award be given out to some hometown boys who have worked their tails off to earn this honor.





Estrin, along with The Nightcats — jaw-dropping guitarist Chris "Kid" Andersen, singing drummer (who plays standing up) J. Hansen and dynamic multi-instrumentalist Lorenzo Farrell (electric and acoustic bass, organ and piano) — serve up fresh and modern original blues injected with a solid dose of gritty roadhouse rock 'n' roll. Since the 2009 release of their celebrated Alligator Records debut, TWISTED, the band has toured non-stop, honing their creative synergy to a razor's edge. Night after night, the band blazes their own innovative musical path while still remaining true to the blues. Rick Estrin won a 2013 Blues Music Award for Instrumentalist Of The Year – Harmonica. 




