JAMES HARMAN

James Harman seldom plays the Midwest. That's because he lives in Huntington Beach, California. But on **June 5th**, Lincoln's legendary Zoo Bar will get a rare treat – blues legend James Harman is providing a special Sunday night appearance.

James Harman is a California-based blues singer, harmonica player, songwriter and band leader. During his 40 plus year career, James "Ice pick" Harman has released nearly 30 recordings, earned multiple blues music awards and performed with many of the world's greatest blues artists. Harman's current backing band, led by the fabulous young guitarist Nathan James, with Bonedaddy Tempo, Adam Hagerman and Patrick Recob may be his strongest unit yet. Harman has had his original songs used in 17 movies, nominated for 19 prestigious blues music awards, and played harmonica on several ZZ Top albums. James Harman is a one of a kind showman.

From the James Harman bio: "Harman's professional career began in 1962 after moving to Panama City, Fla. Soon after the move, he discovered like-minded friends, who invited him to black nightclubs to see such performers as Little Junior Parker, Jimmy Reed, Little Milton Campbell, Slim Harpo, Bobby Bland, O.V. Wright, B.B. King, Otis Redding, Solomon Burke, Joe Tex and James Carr. He began hanging out on a regular basis and was eventually asked to sit in by local house bands, becoming known as 'that boy who sings like a man.' Encouraged by this acceptance, Harman launched the first of his many rhythm 'n' blues ensembles, using such names as King James and the Royals; Snakedoctor; Disciples of Soul; Disciples of Blues; The Disciples; Voo Doo Daddy; Soul Senders; Pieces of Eight; Kingsnakes; and finally, The Icehouse Blues Band."

With a career spanning forty years, award-winning soul, blues and R&B vocalist, harmonicist and songwriter Curtis Salgado is a one-of-akind talent whose music is as compelling as his story. From co-fronting The Robert Cray Band to leading his own band (and recording nine solo

albums) to helping transform John Belushi into "Joliet" Jake Blues to touring the country with Steve Miller and Santana, he is a true musical giant. NPR calls him "a blues icon" with a "huge voice." Salgado earned a reputation for high-intensity performances and a repertoire inspired by his encyclopedic knowledge of soul, blues and R&B music. He won the 2010 Blues Music Award (BMA) for Soul Blues Artist of The Year and went on to win the award again in 2012 and 2013. In 2013 he also won the coveted BMA for B.B. King Entertainer of The Year – the highest honor the blues world has to offer – and took the statue for Soul Blues Album of The Year for his Alligator debut, Soul Shot. Blues Revue says Salgado's music is "triumphant, joyful, blues-soaked R&B" and declared him to be "one of the most soulful, honest singers ever."

The Beautiful Lowdown, Salgado's new Alligator album, is the singer's most fearless and adventurous release to date. For the first time in his career, he wrote or co-wrote virtually the entire album himself. He co-produced it along with Marlon McClain and Tony Braunagel and contributed to the horn arrangements and background vocal parts. "My heart and soul are in this," he says proudly. "I worked my tail off and let the songs lead the way." As for the title, Salgado explains, "During a recent show, I turned to my guitarist and said, 'Play something lowdown. But make it beautiful.' Then I thought, 'Keep that."

Salgado joined Alligator Records in 2012, releasing the award-winning, critically acclaimed Soul Shot. The Los Angeles Times said Salgado is "keeping the classic flame of soul music alive." The strength of the record led to Salgado touring far and wide, with gigs in Manilla, Guam, Brazil, Saipan and Panama. He has performed at major festivals including Portland's Waterfront Blues Festival, The San Francisco Blues Festival, The Chicago Blues Festival, Memphis' Beale Street Music Festival, The Tampa Bay Blues Festival, Denver's Mile High Blues Festival, Toronto's Waterfront Blues Festival, Thailand's Phuket International

Blues Festival and Poland's Blues Alive Festival.

On The Beautiful Lowdown, the deeply-rooted singer effortlessly blends classic soul sounds and funk grooves with up-to-the-minute lyrics. His full-force vocals, intense and uninhibited, bring an urgency and edge to his timeless original songs. AllMusic says his music is filled with "greasy grooves and rollicking burners boasting all the confidence and swagger the lyrics convey. Upbeat, animated performances leave you wanting more." Blues Revue, describing Salgado's performance style, declares, "He starts at excellent before segueing into goose bumps, ecstasy, and finally nirvana." And that is the undisputed, beautiful, lowdown truth.

DELTA SOL REVIVAL

Tyler Stokes is the frontman and creator of Delta Sol Revival. It all began when the St. Louis native was in college and wrote 5 songs in a week. He put a group of guys together and the rest is still in the making of Delta Sol Revival's history. Delta Sol Revival has an eerily familiar sound...in a good way. It's a throwback sound that's steeped in old traditions and fueled with nuances of Latin and jazz - think Allman Brothers, but funky, mixed with Santana, and rounded out with R&B. Their music has soul and swagger. and their live shows are visceral, full of energy, and in high demand. Our forthcoming EP will be produced by Blues Music Award Winner Devon Allman.

"Delta Sol Revival took the stage and began the shredding of the place. Wow. I was not prepared for the sounds that came out of this group. Sounding like Jonny Lang-meets-Santana, the band

played a ten-song set that moved between salsa, blues, rock and shuffle. The entire band played well and engaged energetically with each other and their audience, but guitarist and Allman protégé Tyler Stokes was difficult to take your eye from. Looking about 17 of his tender 20 years, he jumped, danced, boogied and stomped."

HECTOR ANCHONDO BAND – 2016 IBC Finalists!

Born just right of the Great Plains in Omaha, Nebraska and raised in the hills of the Ozark Mountains near Salem, Missouri where the verdant grassy hills and trees stretched for miles, this Missouri farm boy has been has been rapidly emerging as one of the mid-western blues artists to watch for. His influences range from Stevie Ray Vaughn and John Lee Hooker to the stories told by legendary country players like Hank Williams Sr. and Johnny Cash.

He's been writing and performing since he picked up his first guitar when he was sixteen, playing shows for family, friends, pageants, premier concert halls, festivals, live radio,

and live television. After graduating high school he moved back to Omaha to pursue his career and in 2000 he started the band Anchondo, named his namesake. With his band he toured the country playing thousands of shows and also putting out four albums and an EP. Hector also performed many times in the prestigious South By Southwest music festival, as well as, several times on the Vans Warped Tour. Hector is living out his love of music with the Blues.

Hector Anchondo is truly one of those rare talents and when you catch one of his shows you can easily see why, all the while getting lost in the passion that comes through his warm voice permeating the air, the energy he projects toward the crowd, his intricate guitar work, and from the vivid lyrical visuals he creates. Hector is well on his way to being up there with the best of them and his dedication, love of writing, and performing will surely lead the way.

PLAYING WITH FIRE RETURNS TO SATURDAYS WITH ROSTER OF AWARDING WINNING ARTISTS

Free summer concerts series roars with growlin' vocals and twangin' guitars

Playing with Fire (PwF) will celebrate its 13th annual free concert series by returning to our original Saturday roots. The series was established in 2004 to bring people together to "celebrate and build community" with the most accomplished international, national and local musical artists. PwF is honored to support the growth of the BluesEd program as the opening band at every show. This year BluesEd bands, Far and Wide take to the stage to kick off the July 2nd concert, The Redwoods open for the August 27th date.


The first concert of the season marks a night of big vocals. Artists include The Nick Schnebelen Band featuring Omaha's own Heather Newman. Heather stole many of hearts as she grew up performing on the Playing with Fire stage as a member of BluesEd. Nick has won the International Blues Challenge, Albert King Best Guitarist of the Year award. Andria Simone, a sweet little 'growler' from Toronto blew people away when she performed at several Omaha venues in 2015. The evening headliner is 'big smooth' Sugaray Rayford, Blues Music Awards nominee for the prestigious BB King Entertainer, Contemporary Blues Male Artist, Contemporary Blues Album for "Southside" and Song of the Year for "Southside of Town."

On August 27th the 'Twang Bar Kings' will bend their strings in support of Donate Life Nebraska. Lincoln's 'young gun,' Levi William marks his return for a second appearance on the PwF stage. Montreal's one man band, Steve Hill, winner of the 2016 and 2015 Maple Blues Awards for Electric Act of the Year, Entertainer of the Year and Guitarist of the Year, 2015 Recording/Producer of the year and, finally, a 2015 Juno Award for Blues Album of the Year, amps it up for headliner, Walter Trout who requested PwF to produce this show. Walter's nominations and awards span the continent with his most recent, 2016 Blues Music Award for Rock Blues Album: Battle Scars and Song of the Year for "Gonna Live Again." Walter came through the 'darkest times a human being can experience' as he battled liver failure and a life saving transplant in Omaha at University of Nebraska Medical Center in 2014. Walter returns to Omaha with the release of his new album, "ALIVE in Amsterdam."



The road from Texas to California runs right through T-Bone Walker, no detours about it. Since Walker packed his guitar and moved there in the 1940's, what is termed as West Coast Blues revolves around a style he defined. Golden State Lone Star Blues Revue is a blues ensemble founded by harmonica player and singer Mark Hummel, featuring guitarists Anson Funderburgh, and Little Charlie Baty. All

respected instrumentalists in their own right, this collaboration is a premium showcase of West Coast Blues.

Hummel has been blowing blues harp on the coast for over forty years, with seventeen records out as leader. Funderburgh hails from Plano, Texas, made his name teaming up with blues harmonica legend Sam Myers, and is considered one of the authentic interpreters of the classic Texas guitar style. Little Charlie Baty rose to prominence with his band The Nightcats, releasing a string of successful albums on the Alligator label. They are anchored on this session by R.W. Grisby on bass, and drummer Wes Starr, two seasoned road veterans who go back to high school playing together.

These guys have been together since 2012, and have polished their repertoire while on the road, the proven method of playing blues. Funderburgh and Baty have led bands fronted by a harmonica playing singer, so they know the dynamics involved, the guitar interplay is tasteful and they give each other room. The spotlight of course will shine on Hummel as vocalist, but he wisely integrates himself in the band for the reliable blues band situation. As this music continues its generational journey, the *Golden State Lone Star Blues Revue* represent the contemporary keepers of the flame, assuring the blues will never die.

The journey began for Davy Knowles growing up in the Isle of Man, learning to play guitar from listening to the likes of Gallagher, Clapton, Knopfler, Green and Mayall in his father's record collection, and honing his skills playing the local music circuit. Knowles's professional career

started with a bang, arriving in America age 19 with his band Back Door Slam, an acclaimed debut album, and rave reviews at SXSW 2007. ("I heard the spirit of Jimi Hendrix "— Patrick MacDonald, Seattle Times). From that dynamic introduction, Knowles proceeded to make a significant impact across US media — from memorable TV performances on Jimmy Kimmel and Good Morning America, to a three year run at radio with the singles 'Come Home' from the debut album Roll Away and 'Tear Down the Walls' and 'Coming Up For Air' from the Peter Frampton produced sophomore album — both albums Top 3 Billboard Blues Chart. "Davy already has a recognizable style. He's definitely the gunslinger guitarist of the 21st century," — Peter Frampton

A relentless 4 year tour regime followed for Knowles in support of his albums, taking in legendary festivals Lollapalooza, Memphis In May, Bonnaroo, and Austin City Limits and headlining shows at The Troubadour, Red Rocks, World Cafe and The Iridium. He also toured with Jeff Beck, Buddy Guy, The Who, Warren Haynes, George Thorogood, Peter Frampton, Joe

Bonamassa, Kid Rock, Lynyrd Skynyrd, The Rhythm Devils, and the Satriani/Hagar inspired supergroup Chickenfoot. "It's an incredible, inspiring education to play with musicians and artists of that caliber" – DK.

From the very start Knowles earned the respect of fans, media and musicians alike, including some of his own musical heroes such as the aforementioned Peter Frampton, Joe Satrianni, and Warren Haynes. British Blues Legend, Bernie Marsden (Whitesnake, Moody Marsden Band) is another fan – "Davy Knowles continues to amaze me – he's still so young and yet he plays, writes and sings with such maturity. He's immersed himself in the styles of many great players and has emerged with his own brand, playing with a smile on his face. He's a rare bird, one I will continue to watch and study".

Throughout this musical journey, Knowles has kept 'the blues' close to his heart; "I love the guitar as an instrument, it's so versatile and endlessly challenging, but whilst I will try playing any style to meet that challenge, blues is the music I first fell in love with, and I have always connected deeply with it. I enjoy playing the historian, and am fascinated by all facets of the genre, from the earliest field recordings, to the more recent guitar gods that electrified and supercharged this music. It's from all along this timeline that I like to draw influence from."

MARKEY BLUE

When the duo Markey Blue was first formed to "write a few songs" and do "a few club dates" this musical pair had no idea what a fast riding journey it would become.

The Nashville based duo of Markey and Ric Latina have a combined performing/touring history that reads like a "who's who" in the entertain-

ment industry. In late 2012 while both performing with other artists as "side men", they found themselves booked on the same show at a small theater in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. After the show Latina reached out to Markey and suggested they join forces and possibly write a few songs for an EP to sell at venues. The Ric Latina Trio consisted of several different "top of the list" touring musicians and Markey jumped at the chance to work with such accomplished performers.

Soon it was apparent this was fast becoming more than a weekend project and the Markey Blue band was formed. The duo soon landed a small booking agent and started to gather a local following. It was when Latina and Markey started to write their first song, they knew they were on to something. Markey says, "It's a rare thing to find, but the writing process comes so easily for us. The ideas just flow." And they kept flowing until Markey and Latina completed the raw material for their first album **Hey Hey**. Randy Chortkoff, CEO of Delta Groove Records, signed Markey Blue as its first project to their new artist promotion department.

Hey Hey was released at #1 on the Debut Blues Chart, reached #1 on both the Tennessee Roots Music Chart and Blues 411, held Top 10 on National Roots Music Chart and Top 25 on the Living Blues Chart. The band was named one of the Top 10 Emerging Blues Artists to Watch in 2015; Markey was named one of the Top 10 Blues Women to Soar in 2014. The album was nominated for the Blues Blast Awards Best Blues Debut Artist, the NIMA Awards Best Blues Artist and Best Live Performance, and was featured in blues/roots magazines world-wide. The Duo was signed to both a national booking agency, Blues Pros Talent, and signed a TV/Multimedia Publishing deal for song placement in movies and television.



With three songs picked up for TV placement from the new album, **The Blues are Knockin'**, Markey Blue takes a diving approach into the different worlds of Blues. The album explores Delta, Texas, Memphis, Kansas City, Rock and a touch of Soul Blues. The creativity and craftsmanship of this duo shines throughout this entire musical journey. **The Blues are Knockin'** has something

to offer even the most discriminating blues palate. From the swampy Delta slide work of Ric Latina on "I'll Wait for You", to the traditional Kansas City slow blues of "Worries" and featuring the only track that was recorded live at Ocean Way Recording Studio Nashville, the rockin' blues song "That Ain't Good Enough", this compilation keeps you waiting for what's around the next blues corner. The album includes two tribute songs written for two Blues masters that have passed on. "Lay Down Lucille" was written for Mr. B.B. King and his beloved guitar, Lucille, and "Be My Train" in honor of Little Milton. Markey Blue takes a more serious approach with a song titled "Nobody's Fool" that reflects the growing unrest we have all been watching unfold on TV during the morning news.

Even apart, Markey and Latina have impressive resumes. The down-to-earth songstress was on a small Country label when she relocated to Nashville. Once on the Blues path, Markey quickly became a rising talent in the roots music world — performing with Taj Mahal, Candye Kane, Walter Trout, Delbert McClinton, Anson Funderburgh and Bobby "Blue" Bland — before joining with Latina to form Markey Blue.

Latina has a longstanding reputation as an inspired studio and stage guitarist, as well as a songwriter and studio craftsman. Besides his session credits, his extensive history of performing with and touring includes Waylon Jennings, Hank Williams III, Clint Black, Collin Raye, Suzy Bogguss, Billy Dean, John Berry, Vern Gosdin, Kirk Whalum, Sherrié Austin, Gary Puckett and Rhonda Vincent to name a few.

CANDYE KANE, WITH STYLE

Candye Kane, an L.A.-raised blues, swing and roots-rock performer who preached self-acceptance and whose song "The Toughest Girl Alive" gained new meaning as she performed for years with cancer, died Friday May 6th at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles.

She had been ill with pancreatic neuroendocrine cancer for about eight years. She was 54.

Dubbed an "East L.A. white homegirl" by The Times in the 1980s, Kane had been a high school dropout and phonesex operator before emerging as a musician and recording more than a dozen albums. Her music earned an international following and championed LGBT people and others.

She cited Patsy Cline as an inspiration, and touted the universal appeal of what she called "the old twangy stuff"



over newer, more polished versions of country music. A Times critic in 1990 compared her voice to Loretta Lynn's.

Despite advancing cancer, Kane returned to the concert stage again and again, sometimes from her hospital bed. Her final performance was a New Year's Eve show at the Belly Up Tavern in Solana Beach. Her most recent U.S. tour was in December.

"I almost felt like she wanted to die on stage, because she loved what she was doing so much," said Sue Palmer, who was Kane's pianist from 1991 to 1999 and performed with her last year.

"For me, she really is an example of mind over matter," said her son and drummer Evan Caleb Yearsley.

Bruce Katz is a four time (2008, 2009, 2010, 2015) Nominee for the Blues Music Award (W.C. Handy Award) for "Pinetop Perkins Piano Player of the Year", selected by the Blues Foundation of Memphis, TN.

While Blues is a very important part of his music, Bruce's music has more angles and influences, occupying a unique space where blues, "soul-jazz", jam-band rock, and all aspects of Americana Music collide into a style of original music all his own. He is equally comfortable playing Hammond B-3 Organ and Piano.

Besides leading the Bruce Katz Band, Bruce performs regularly with the Delbert McClinton Band, Jaimoe's Jasssz Band, John Hammond, and other artists as well. He was a member of the Gregg Allman Band from 2007-2013. Bruce was also an Associate Professor at the Berklee College of Music for fourteen years (1996-2010), teaching Harmony, Hammond organ labs, Private Instruction and Blues History.

As a performer, Bruce has been an in-demand sideman as well as leading his own band. He has played and recorded with many of the leading names in blues and roots music, appearing on over 70 albums with artists such as Ronnie Earl, John Hammond, Delbert McClinton, Gregg Allman, Duke Robillard, Joe Louis Walker, Little Milton, Maria Muldaur, Jimmy Witherspoon, Paul Rishell, Mighty Sam McClain, Debbie Davies, David "Fathead" Newman and many others.

In 1992, he met Ronnie Earl, who soon invited him to join his band, The Broadcasters. During his nearly five-year stint with Earl, Katz toured the world and performed on six albums, writing and co-writing many of the tunes, such as "The Colour of Love," "Ice Cream Man," and "Hippology." The album "Grateful Heart" (Bullseye) won the Downbeat Critics Poll for Best Blues Album of 1996.

In 1992 as well, Katz debuted his first solo album, "Crescent Crawl", on the Audio-Quest label. He released "Transformation" the following year. Just before the release of "Mississippi Moan" in 1997, his third




solo album, Katz left the Broadcasters to concentrate on a solo career. At that point, the Bruce Katz Band began touring the U.S. and Europe, and has been his ongoing focus, in addition to his many other projects.

Bruce Katz played with Duke Robillard (2001-02), John Hammond (2005 – present), Gregg Allman (2007-13) and many other high profile roots, blues and rock performers, while continuing to tour and record with his own band.



CD Reviews



The Mighty Mojo Prophets Record Store



The third release from The Mighty Mojo Prophets is their inaugural self-produced effort, "Record Store" on their Mojo King Music label. After their self-titled debut release, in 2011 for Rip Cat Records, which landed them a 2012 BMA nomination for "Best New Artist"

Debut" and the critically acclaimed 2014 "Flying Home From Memphis" on Delta Groove Records, vocalist Tom Eliff and guitarist Mitch Dow set out on their own.

What results here is a collection of 13, all original, well-crafted, modern day blues tunes. This is another tight, fun, free-spirited, toe-tapping album that continues to grow on this writer. Their style is West Coast with plenty of traditional Blues values, hard driving, and full of dynamic energy.

Dave Deforest on Bass, Tom Richmond on Harp, Mike Malone on Piano & Organ, and Al Ricci on drums provide solid backing for the gifted songsmiths Eliff and Dow. Mitch Dow's guitar work is clean and crisp, but it is Tom Eliff's vocal that steals the show, it reminds this writer a little of the late Alex Taylor, seems a touch southern-fried. Lot of good tracks on here, but perhaps Devil At Your Door says it best, "You've got a mouth like a Mossberg shotgun ... an attitude you're always right" – yeah, The Mighty Mojo Prophets got it right.

Mac Arnold has played with James Brown and Muddy Waters. He is one of the few living alumni of the fantastic Waters' bands from the 1960's. Arnold plays bass and gas can guitar. The original being made for Arnold by his brother Leroy in 1946.



The group has a laid-back, easy going style somewhat reminiscent of Keb' Mo'. The vocals are handled by all the members, but the drummer. Arnold handles the majority of the singing with a very endearing style that has a weathered feel that draws you in to its sincerity.

The album consists mainly of originals. There is an exceptional version of Bobby Bland's I'll Take Care of You that captures the melancholy feel of the original. There is also an interesting cover of Jerry Reed's Amos Moses.

This is a really good cd by a genuine original. It will be enjoyed by listeners that like their blues nuanced with no over the top solos and an ensemble style.
