

Letter from The President

I will be doing these letters every couple of months to keep the members of BSO informed. Since Terry O' Halloran sold his bar, BSO has no control over what bands are brought to the Omaha area. I feel BSO should be proactive in having a part in what bands come to Omaha. Based on that, BSO will be booking bands in different venues to reach out to other parts of town as well as being active in booking bands.

This is what we have done so far:

Lionel Young (the only two-time International Blues Challenge winner) will be playing at the Shamrock Bar at 103rd and Fort in Omaha on Friday, March 9th, from 5:30 to 8:30.

Carolyn Wonderland will be playing at the Waiting Room at 62nd and Maple in Omaha on Sunday, April 8th, from 6:15 to 8:00. The Electroliners open at 5pm. That is Easter night.

We are in the process of working out the details for Ronnie Baker Brooks to play May 27th, which is Sunday of Memorial Day weekend. For that event we are hoping to have it outside with two local bands and two Blues Ed bands.

At this point we don't plan on booking any more bands until we see how the Lionel Young and Carolyn Wonderland shows do. So please come out and listen to these bands so we can continue to provide blues music to the Omaha area.

We are planning to have an annual meeting in April. All BSO members are invited to attend the meeting. Please let me know if you are coming so we try to have plenty of room. At the annual meeting we will be presenting which committees we will need volunteers for.

Feel free to contact me via email and put BSO in the subject line, otherwise I will probably delete the email. Or, come up and talk to me. I will try to introduce myself at a few of the Thursday shows, so you know who I am.

It has been a joy to work with the BSO board, BSO officers, and others to keep blues alive and well in Omaha. As a previous BSO president has said, it's about butts in the seats!!

Award-winning blues and soul vocalist Janiva Magness will celebrate the release of her new Alligator Records CD, STRONGER FOR IT, with a live performance at The Zoo Bar in Lincoln on Wednesday, March 21, and at The 21st Saloon in Omaha on Thursday, March 22, 2012. A charismatic artist known for her electrifying live shows, Magness is among the premier blues and R&B singers in the world today; her voice possesses an earthy, raw honesty born from her life experience. Last year, Magness was nominated for four 2011 Blues Music Awards: B.B. King Entertainer of the Year; Album of the Year (The Devil Is An Angel Too); Contemporary Blues Female Artist of the Year and Contemporary Blues Album of the Year (The Devil Is An Angel Too). She won the coveted 2009 Blues Music Award for B.B. King Entertainer of the Year (she is only the second woman to ever win this award, Koko Taylor being the first)and for Contemporary Blues Female Artist of the Year, an honor she also received in 2006 and 2007. Through her passionate vocals and, for the first time, through her own original songs, Magness,














The night however was to thank Terry O' for all his efforts and dedication to the advancement of live and local music in Omaha and Lincoln...

A musical force equipped with the soulful vocals of Janis and the guitar slinging skills of Stevie Ray, Carolyn Wonderland reaches into the depths of the Texas blues tradition with the wit of a poet. She hits the stage with unmatched presence, a true legend in her time.

"She'd grown up the child of a singer in a band and began playing her mother's vintage Martin quitar when other girls were dressing dolls. She'd gone from being the teenage toast of her hometown Houston to sleeping in

her van in Austin amid heaps of critical acclaim for fine recordings Alcohol & Salvation, Bloodless Revolution, and most recently, Miss Understood.

Along with the guitar and the multitude of other instruments she learned to play - trumpet, accordion, piano, mandolin, lap steel - Wonderland's ability to whistle remains most unusual. Whistling is a uniquely vocal art seldom invoked in modern music, yet it's among the most spectacular talents the human voice possesses.

That vocal proficiency was well-established in the singer's midteens, landing her gigs at Fitzgerald's by age 15. She absorbed Houston influences like Little Screamin' Kenny and soaked up the Mad Hatter of Texas music, Doug Sahm. The Lone Star State was as credible and fertile a proving ground for blues in the 1980s as existed, especially in Austin with Stevie Ray Vaughan & Double Trouble, the Fabulous Thunderbirds, Angela Strehli, Omar & the Howlers, and Lou Ann Barton all in their prime. By the following decade, Austin's blues luster thinned, but Houston, always a bastion of soul and R&B, boasted the Imperial Monkeys with the effervescent Carolyn Wonderland as ruler of the jungle.

In the early 1990s Wonderland & the Imperial Monkeys were invited to the Guadalupe Street Antone's in Austin. There, they were treated like royalty with the singer as the gueen of hearts in the club's post-Stevie Ray Vaughan stable, which included Toni Price, Johnny and Jay Moeller, Sue Foley, Mike and Corey Keller, and the Ugly Americans. It was a good bar for the Monkeys to hang, and Austin felt so comfortable that when the band called it quits a few years later, she set her sights on Austin at the start of the millennium.

Living in Austin renewed Carolyn Wonderland's focus on her multiple talents, underlining luxurious vocals with fine guitar work, trumpet, and piano, as well as that remarkable

ability to whistle on key. A series each-better-than-the-next of discs began with Alcohol & Salvation in 2003 ("songs about booze and God; records are a time capsule of what happened that year").

Her music played in television series such as Time of Your Life and *Homicide*.

Her circle of musician friends and admirers broadened to include not only Ray [Benson, who produced Miss Understood but also the late Eddy Shaver, Shelley King, and yes, Bob Dylan, who likened her

composition "Bloodless Revolution" to "a mystery movie theme." She began co-writing with locals Sarah Brown, Ruthie Foster, Cindy Cashdollar, and Guy Forsyth; sat in with Los Lobos, Robert Earl Keen, and Ray Wylie Hubbard; recorded with Jerry Lightfoot; and toured with Buddy Guy and Johnny Winter. She also claims membership in the allgirl Sis Deville, the gospel-infused Imperial Crown Golden Harmonizers, and takes aw-shucks credit for inspiring Amsterdam's annual WonderJam.

Carolyn Wonderland is being praised unanimously for her new album Peace Meal (Bismeaux Records) that finds her collaborating with producers Larry Campbell, Ray Benson and the Monkees' Michael Nesmith.

Critics are heralding the album for capturing the high energy of Wonderland's electric live shows and displaying the raw talent that has made her a legend of Texas, and a huge hit in performances across the US and abroad.

Blues Ed Youth Bands for 2012. Auditions were completed in January of 2012. There will be five bands this year.

Young Bloods Committee – Michelle will hold a meeting with the Young Blood committee the week February 9, 2012. She will give an update at the March meeting.

Trailer Purchase Update – Mark placed a notice in the BSO Newsletter concerning BSO wanting to purchase a 6 x 9 trailer to store BSO supplies and equipment. Mark has not found a trailer in the agreed price range. Approved to spend more if need be.

Aksarben Concert on June 16th – This year it has been decided that we will hold BSO concert in the format that the venue is accustomed too. There will be no charge for admission, however, a Good Will Donation will be welcomed. There will not be beer sales this year. Guests will be allowed to bring in their own coolers. We are still reviewing if pets will be allowed. Also need to verify if rain insurance is needed or if the park handles the insurance. Bill will verify. The bands for this concert have been booked.

March show with Lionel Young – Discussion of possible venues for this show. Preston Love Jazz Center was suggested, but after speaking with a representative there, they were not too enthused with our proposal. petition. Added to his victory at the 2008 IBC in the solo-duo

in the history of the IBC. Young currently is nominated for a 2012 Blues Music Award as Best Instrumentalist (violin).

Levee Town · Pages of Paperwork

The band Levee Town has a new CD entitled Pages of Paperwork, out on their own label. I first saw Levee Town in Kansas City, Mo. a few years back before I joined the Blues Society of Omaha, and I have liked their style of music ever since. So when I was asked to review there new CD Pages of Paperwork I thought how cool is that to review a band's CD that I like.



The band Levee Town hails from Kansas City Mo.,

and was formed in 2002. The band has earned a reputation for being one of the hardest working bands around. Levee Town has played the King Biscuit Festival, Kalamazoo Blues Festival, Illinois Blues Festival, and had a spot in the 2007 IBC finals and a 2010 semi-finals, and has attracted an everwidening fan base.

Levee Town is comprised of four members, Guitarist and vocalist Brandon Hudspeth who can sing a powerful mix of blues.rock or country. Jimmie Meade is the bands Harp man who has an exceptionally strong Chicago Blues style. Jacque Garoutte on bass and vocals, and Jan Faircloth on drums. This duo forms a rock-solid foundation that the LeVee Town sound is built on.

The CD Pages of Paperwork by Levee Town has 14 really

Austin has many great musicians, and none is better than Carolyn Wonderland. She is an outstanding guitarist and great singer. Her new cd has her performing her usual brand of eclectic music. Song styles range from blues to gospel.

Wonderland starts the cd off with a seldom heard Janis Joplin penned

song, What Good Can Drinkin' Do. You might think she would avoid Joplin songs - being that they are both Texan blues women, and often compared - but she makes the song a kind of country, cry in your beer version that helps avoid the comparisons. She does a cover of Robert Johnson's Dust My Broom. I thought another version of this classic was the last thing the music world needed, but I was pleasantly surprised. She does an original take on the song and makes it her own.

The majority of the cd is produced by Asleep At The Wheel leader Ray Benson. A few songs are produced by Larry Cambell, and one is even done by founding Monkee, Michael Nesmith. They do a fine job showing off Wonderland's ample talents.

This is a very enjoyable cd that has a nice variety to it. This cd should please long time Carolyn Wonderland fans and help her acquire new ones.

Discovery: The Rebirth Of Mississippi John Hurt

For a better review than I could ever write, please read Scott Barretta's review in the latest issue of "Living Blues", it is terrific, as is the record. In 1928 Mississippi John Hurt recorded a half dozen 78's for the Okeh Co. He then disappeared from the public eye for 35 years. In 1963, blues fan,



Tom Hoskins tracked him down in Avalon, Mississippi and recorded him in his house with a bevy of guests stars, his wife Jesse, two Grandchildren and an easily heard Barnyard Rooster! A wonderful record, primitive ampex reel to reel recorder catches all the glitches. I have always wanted to track down a semi-retired and reclusive bluesman, I often tell people that I was with Tom Hoskins on that fateful day in Avalon but when pressed for more details and pinned against a wall, I Confess that I was actually three years old and living in Gretna, Nebraska at the time. Three great bluesmen were actually re-discovered by just plain Blues fans, Skip James, Son House and John Hurt, they all went on the festival and coffeehouse circuits, that were so popular in the mid 60's! Another story I like to tell is when I re-discovered Mississippi Fred McDowell working at a gas station in Como, Mississippi but when pressed for more details and pinned against a wall I confess that I was actually seven years old and living in Gretna, Nebraska. I love those old bluesmen and I actually tried to sell my soul to the devil once but I couldn't find him. (my ex-wife actually knew him). It just dawned on me that I am overusing the word actually in this column so I will stop that practice right now! So go ahead and buy "Discovery" and sit back and listen to the Happy and Gentle blues of Mississippi John Hurt. In September I am going back to Mississippi to visit the Graves of R L Burnside, Pinetop Perkins and Mr Tater, the Music Maker. Today do me a favor listen to some old school blues! Did I ever tell you the story of when I rediscovered Memphis Minnie? Maybe next time!


