Since 1980, the Blues Foundation has been inducting individuals, recordings and literature into the Blues Hall of Fame, but until now there has not been a physical Blues Hall of Fame. Establishing a Blues Hall of Fame enhances one of the founding programs of The Blues Foundation. The "Raise the Roof" campaign calls for up to \$3.5 million to create a Blues Hall of Fame in Memphis. It will be the place to: honor inductees year-round; listen to and learn about the music; and enjoy historic mementos of this all-American art form. The new Blues Music Hall of Fame will be the place for serious Blues fans, casual visitors, and wide-eyed students. It will facilitate audience development and membership growth. It will expose, enlighten, educate, and entertain.



## RIP MORRIS "MAGIC SLIM" HOLT

**AUGUST 7, 1937 TO FEBRUARY 21, 2013** 

With the passing of Magic Slim we say farewell to one of the greatest traditional Chicago blues artists of our time. Magic Slim died of complications from a breathing disorder after weeks of hospitalization. He was 75.

Though a great singer, guitarist and band leader, it was Magic Slim's undeniable personality that set him apart. He could play heartfelt, rough and tumble Chicago blues with a zest that was unmatched. Every part of Magic Slim's being was the blues – his geographical path, his hard partying, fun loving personality, and his far traveling, dedicated lifestyle.

Magic Slim's patented two guitar driven Chicago blues sound was both a concert hall pleaser and a dance floor filler. He had, perhaps the largest repertoire in the blues, knowing thousands of songs that he could call upon at any time. Living Blues Magazine put

it this way; "Magic Slim consistently offers no-frills house-rockin' blues. He and his band are a national treasure."

Born in rural Mississippi to a farming life, Slim lost his little finger in a cotton gin accident at a young age, but that did not seem to hinder his guitar playing. He arrived on the Chicago blues scene in the mid 1960s initially to a luke-warm response, but after recruiting his brother Nick to play bass, Magic Slim & the Teardrops were formed, and in 1966 their first single "Scuffin" was released. Some years later, Slim's 1975 single "I Wonder Why" produced by Steve Cushing (then a drummer in Slim's band) won high praise for it's raw, gutsy sound. Throughout the mid 1970s Slim and his tough band worked the south and north side clubs every night of the week, gaining a huge following and getting the attention of promoters and record labels.

Europe embraced Slim with numerous tours and record releases on labels such as MCM, Black & Blue, Isabel and later Wolf Records for whom Slim would record many albums. Magic Slim was also part of the highly celebrated 1978 Alligator Records compilation series Living Chicago Blues earning much US airplay among blues DJs. Slim's band became noted for the second guitarist who would play an essential role in the Slim's sound and who would open the sets before Slim took over the microphone. This guitar role was defined early on by the great work of Junior Pettis AKA "Daddy Rabbit. After Pettis left the band a long legacy of artists served as the Teardrops' second guitarist

including Pete Allen, James Wheeler, Jake Dawson, Jon McDonald, and of course John Primer who's 13 year tenure with this band starting in 1983 is highly celebrated, and served as a launching pad for John's own powerful career.

In 1994 Slim moved from Chicago to Lincoln, Nebraska where he had played for years prior as a popular attraction at the Zoo Bar. In 2009 Slim's beloved brother and longtime musical partner. Nick Holt passed away. Slim's son, Shawn "Lil' Slim" Holt has emerged as a great young talent and has been a feature of some of Slim's more recent shows. Slim's last release, Bad Boy on the Blind Pig label was released in mid 2012. A movie called "We Be Kings" was in the works that would have featured Magic Slim as it's lead character in a fictional story of a rediscovered blues man. We can look back at Magic Slim's

long and fruitful career and see a man who has lived his dreams. After humble beginnings, working hard to garner his respect, Slim's persistent and consistent work earned him a rightful place as one of the greatest blues artists of his time.

Slim's recordings will live as a permanent testament to his greatness with over 30 albums released on labels such as Alligator, Wolf, MCM, Black & Blue, Candy Apple, Rooster Blues, Red Lightnin', Delmark, Evidence, Isabel, Storyville, Tone Zone, and most recently, Blind Pig Records who have annually released top quality albums by this great artist. He received numerous awards and nominations for his recordings. his band and for his role as a uncompromising traditional blues artist.


Thanks to Slim's manager Marty Salzman and road manager Michael Blakemore for their amazing behind the scenes support work. Also thanks to the booking work of Max Cooperstein, Concerted Efforts, Adrian Flores, and Jillina Arrigo for their contributions over the years. Slim always lived his life on his terms and he met and exceeded his dreams. We can look back and think of all the times that he brought a smile to our face. He was the consummate bluesman and we will always love him for that. May he now rest in peace after his tireless work here on earth. We thank God for blessing us with the blues of Magic Slim.

### Louisiana Music Factory

If you have seen Charlie Wooton with Royal Southern Brotherhood, or with one of his own groups, you know he is one of the best bass guitarists playing today. He has a strong Jaco Pastorius influence, but he is definitely his own man.

Wooton's music is best described as being eclectic. Being from Louisiana, his music is fashioned from the wide range of music he was exposed to while growing up. Songs are bass driven – as you would expect – with hints of Zydeco, Latin, and West African styles.

The musicians rotate often on the cd allowing Wooton to drive his creativity. Wooton is influenced by each musician he has worked with, and it shapes the vision of his music. The music might be categorized as World Music, for lack of a better term.

This is a very enjoyable "project." I recommend it to listeners that are open minded in their listening choices in music.



## **CENTRAL IOWA BLUES SOCIETY'S 2013 WINTER BLUES FEST**

Out of the 109 Blues fans from BSO and their acquaintances that signed up for our pilgrimage to downtown Des Moines for the Central Iowa Blues Society's 2013 Winter Blues Fest over 75 souls braved the threat of freezing rain to attend this wonderful annual event. Of the original 109 it was about a 50/50 mix between veterans and "newbies", however, when the smoke cleared the threat of freezing rain (which



fortunately didn't really materialize) caused a higher attrition rate among the uninitiated, and there were more veterans than "newbies" in the 75 plus hardy souls landing in Des Moines on January 26th. We did still have a good size contingent of "newbies" though, bless their pointed little heads!

This event has been going on since 1996, which would be two years earlier than our own beloved Blues Society began. Originally, from 1996-2003, the Winter Blues Fest was a pub crawl in the Court Avenue District (similar to Omaha's Old Market area), with nine to twelve bars taking part and most of them hosting Blues bands. You could purchase a wrist band at the host hotel, the Kirkwood, that admitted you to all of the venues including the ballroom of the Kirkwood. After the bars closed there was a jam session at the Kirkwood until around 4:00 AM. With the closing of the Kirkwood and several of the other venues the event did not take place in 2004. It then ceased being a pub crawl and was resurrected in 2005 at the Hotel Fort Des Moines, with all the bands performing in the various ballrooms/meeting rooms in the hotel. It was such a huge success it remained there until 2009, garnering an ever growing following. The Hotel Fort Des Moines was purchased by another hotel chain in 2009 and was scheduled for an extensive remodel. In 2010, with the help of the Hotel Fort Des Moines, the event moved to the Des Moines downtown Marriott and has remained there ever since. Beginning in 2010 the CIBS began to book Blues Challenge winners from the surrounding states to perform, prior to their trip to Memphis to compete in the International Blues Challenge in Memphis Tennessee in February. As an aside, for those of you who are not familiar with the IBC in Memphis, it is a Blues Challenge which takes place every year in Memphis Tennessee over a five day period, hosting approximately 250 Blues bands from all over the planet. In addition to the regional Blues acts waiting to compete at the IBC, the CIBS Winter Blues Fest usually also features one or two established Blues bands. This year it was Corey Stevens from L.A. and Nick Moss and the Flip Tops from Chicago. Again this year, as in most years, there were ten bands on six stages for \$12.00 in advance and \$15.00 day of show.

I and four other miscreants have been attending since the early days when it was a pub crawl. Due to fear of prosecution we five have been bound by a blood oath of secrecy regarding the events of those early days. Suffice it to say we have mellowed with experience and are no longer near as likely to require a bail bondsman on speed dial. And, there are now a number of women friends who regularly attend with us who would rat us out in a heartbeat just to see

us squirm. Bless their souls. Three years ago we started out with one entire floor of the downtown Marriott and this year we inhabited over two floors of the hotel. We register as a group and the hotel graciously allows us to check in early at noon and hang together. They even put tables in the halls on "our" floors and we all bring food and coolers and have a huge pot luck dinner before the music festivities begin at

5:00 PM. The opportunity to break bread and hang with so many of your Blues buddies is priceless! The music starts at 5:00 PM and goes until around 1:30 AM, and all of the rooms have ample dance floors. Many of us return year after year and we continue to recruit more "newbies" every year who then return as veterans. This year we also wrangled donations for our Blues Ed program from folks from the Des Moines area who joined us on "our" floors to socialize and we ended up raising \$110.


I've received many glowing comments about how outrageously fun this event is and what a fabulously welcome break it is in the dead of winter. Once someone attends, many of them who've heard about it but not attended before say they want to kick themselves for not going sooner. Some of the comments from the "newbies" this year were that they had a great time, met so many great people and had some wonderful food, not to mention beverages. They also adsolutely couldn't believe the quality and amount of great Blues they heard for such a reasonable price, in an environment with 1800–2000 other avid Blues fans, without ever having to brave the elements until the following day. The non-official consensus was that Crankshaft and the Gear Grinders from Minnesota were the favorite band, followed by Nick Moss and the Flip Tops and our own Levi William.

Next years Winter Blues Fest will be held Saturday February 8, 2014 at the Des Moines downtown Marriott. This is one of, if not the biggest fund raiser of the year for the Central Iowa Blues Society and we want to continue to support a sister Blues Society, so please consider attending. The Central Iowa Blues society are great people who do a wonderful job of putting this on and you won't regret it! Check them out at cibs.org.



Stax Records (a great ole label)

"I Ride at Dawn" right now is my favorite song of the year! (although it is early). This whole record is solid except the first song, which Ben sings in a higher register than the rest of the c.d. I don't know if there was an accident during the first take of the song, but he lowers his voice for the rest. This is a great collaboration that works well. Charlie is in the background for most of the time, which is alright; but his harp rings thru at the perfect



times. Lots of nice guitar work. Not a standard blues album, but a good Ben Harper record. Lots of different styles and paces throughout. I believe Mr. Harper wrote all the songs

and he is very talented writer and, again, this is a very good effort. Buy this immediately! ### Andy T – Nick Nixon Band "Drink Drank Drunk"

New Release from Delta Grove Music



This is a rip-roaring debut CD from Andy T (Talamantez) and James "Nick" Nixon. Andy honed his skills from the influences of BB King, T Bone Walker, Albert Collins, Muddy Waters and others before touring with L.A. based blues legend Smokey Wilson, then Texas great Guitar Shorty.

Nick started singing in his Nashville church as a young boy, before training in Opera then gravitating toward the blues. He toured nationally for some years before teaching for many years in Nashville, earning the Blues Foundation "Keeping the Blues Alive" award for education. This CD was produced by guitar veteran Anson Funderburgh. Right from the first song "Midnight Hour" this CD left me wanting to hear more. The clean crisp guitar riff of Andy and rich, soulful vocals of Nick are the stars of this CD, with saxophone on songs like "Drink Drank Drunk", "No Use Knocking", my favorite "Have You Seen My Monkey", and "No End to the Blues", accordion on Ray Charles' "I've Got a Woman", and harmonica on "You Look so Good", the musicianship is truly outstanding. The best songs on this CD were written by Andy T & Nick. There isn't a song on this CD that I didn't like and enjoy. It also makes you wanna dance and tap your feet. I would highly recommend adding this CD to your collection, and for a debut CD I can't wait until the next one from this talented duo comes out.
