THE BSO OFFICERS AND THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS WOULD LIKE TO THANK EACH OF THE MEMBERS FOR TAKING TIME OUT OF THEIR BUSY SCHEDULES TO ATTEND THE BSO GENERAL MEETING.

The goal for the general meeting is to invite ALL members so that we can hear their vision/suggestions for BSO and how to keep promoting the Blues in our area.

Members did suggest at this meeting they would like to see more BSO support for the local musicians/bands. BSO would like to team with the musicians/bands to have them promote BSO to their audiences as well. This will be an on-going team effort.

FINANCIALS AND MEMBERSHIPS UPDATE:

FINANCIALS:

April's current balance sheet is \$26,455.00 This includes a profit of \$536.00 from the Carolyn Wonderland membership drive show.

MEMBERSHIPS:

For the Carolyn Wonderland membership drive show held on 4/8/12, we had 59 free memberships and 44 of those are brand new BSO members. We also took in \$265.00 in paid memberships at the show.

WEB MASTER:

Michelle Saltzman gave a presentation for the new proposed web page. She has been hired to create the new design of the web page and to host and transfer the domain. This will allow the domain and the hosting to be on the same provider's account.

Michelle Saltman is working with Dave Dotson, our current web master, to ensure that the web page has all of the features we are



requesting including a membership page and a volunteer page.

Bill Martin is the project leader. Others will be called upon for their input to ensure that we have a web page that is user friendly for the administration team and for all users. Up-to-date technology such as, Word Press will be used for this new web page to achieve this goal.

NBC BLUES CHALLENGE UPDATE:

Bands will be picked randomly to play at the venues this year. Venues will be in Omaha and Lincoln. The committee will try to accommodate all bands schedules/playing times.

Discussed logistics for the wevent. The musicians who participated last year provided valuable input for this years contest.

BSO requested volunteers for upcoming events. BSO is also still looking for a VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR. This can be more than one person. Vanessa did caution that the volunteer coordinator position should be separate from each event/committee chair person.

BSO members whom attended the meeting stated that before they would be able to commit to any event/volunteer position, they would like to see the charter for the event as well as all open volunteer positions. BSO will add the charter and volunteer positions to the Event Checklist and it will be public knowledge well in advance of each event going forward.

The IBC has evolved into the nation's biggest and most respected showcase for blues musicians ready to take their act to the national stage. Industry professionals say that winning the International Blues Challenge gives the top band the equivalent of \$100,000 in media awareness and publicity. Winning the IBC has been a stepping-stone to a high-profile career for artists like Trampled Under Foot, Zac Harmon, Eden Brent and JP Soars, to name a few.

Phoenix, AZ, bluesman Bob Corritore, Blues Music Award winner and Keeping the Blues Alive Award recipient, says of the IBCs "I once thought that going to the IBCs (AKA the International Blues Challenge) was all about the band competition, and perhaps for some it is. But for a number of years now I have chosen to attend to be a part of what I feel is the bigger picture of this event. To me this event is a family gathering of blues people who come to get the feeling of community that is so powerfully demonstrated in these few days. Everyone is there for the blues, and that's a powerful thing."

The 29th International Blues Challenge is set to begin Tuesday, January 29, 2013 and conclude on Saturday February 2, 2013. The competition will be held in Memphis, TN in the Beale Street entertainment district.


