

It had to be a train. The name of Victor Wainwright's new band – and the sleeve image of their debut album – is also the most fitting of metaphors. In music folklore, the train might have associations with the freight-hopping bluesmen of yore, but with this restless boogie-woogie innovator stoking the furnace, this latest project is a charging locomotive – surging forward, crashing through boundaries of genre, sweeping up fresh sounds and clattering headlong past the doubters. As the man himself hollers in the ivory-pounding title track: "If you wanna boogie get aboard this train/Get yourself a ticket or get out of the way..."

At a sweet-spot in his career, where most established stars would rest on their laurels, Victor Wainwright & The Train instead rips up all that has gone before. These twelve tracks are originals in every sense, written by Wainwright, pricking up ears in a sterile music industry and stretching the concept of roots in bold directions. "I wanted to write this new music mostly on my own," he explains, "as it was coming and speaking to me. I believe that for roots music to grow, and reach out to new audiences, we have to push it forward."

The result is an album that walks a tightrope between scholar-

ly respect and anarchic irreverence. You'll hear Wainwright twist boogie-woogie tradition on barrelhouse thrillers like Healing and Boogie Depression, both driven by his visceral piano style. But you'll also hear him fearlessly explore the gamut of genre, from the Latin



flavors and New Orleans horns of Wiltshire Grave, to the mellow near-psychedelia of Sunshine.

It's a musical cocktail served up by Wainwright's inimitable gravel-flecked vocal. His words can be hilarious, as on I'll Start Tomorrow, on which he postpones his doctor's clean-living advice. But they can also be heartfelt, on the gospel-tinged kiss-off of That's Love To Me. "I've tried to write songs that remind us to love ourselves," he considers. "It doesn't matter who voted for who, what your religion is, who you love..."

On this white-knuckle ride, only The Train could keep the material on the tracks. "I ended up with a hit-squad of downright amazing musicians," he reflects, "that shared my curiosity for all corners of the roots genre. We wanted to capture how we feel performing, right smack-dab on this record, and I believe we've done that. Now I just try to keep up."

In truth, Wainwright has always been an artist that sets the pace. Born into a musical family in Savannah, Georgia, the formative influence of his father's vocals and grandfather's rolling boogie–woogie piano compelled him into a life of music. By 2005, he'd announced his talent with solo debut, Piana' From Savannah, while his central role in Southern Hospitality and partnership with Stephen Dees in WildRoots has seen him ignite stages and stereos for over a decade. "Looking back on your career is a tough thing to do," he says. "Challenges are many, and frequent, but when you get it together, it can also be extremely rewarding."

# MITCH KASHMAR, HARVEY BRINDELL & THE TABLEROCKERS and Special Guests the 44'S!

West Coast harmonica player MITCH KASHMAR is one of the California disciples who soaked up the sound and the soul of Chicago and Mississippi and Cali-customized it. His theory is the California harp scene started with Arkansas native George "Harmonica" Smith, who settled in L.A. soon after leaving Muddy Waters' band. "Rod Piaza got some of it and Kim Wilson got some," Kashmar says

of Smith's fat, rounded tones, which often sounded more like an entire horn section than a man with a harmonica. "I got some of it from them." Like Kim Wilson, the Fabulous Thunderbirds singer and harmonica legend, Kashmar grew up in Santa Barbara.

Mitch Kashmar has come a long way since his youth in what is now often perceived as the quaint beachside community of Santa Barbara, CA. They've all known what the rest of the blues world is about to find out: Mitch Kashmar is a force to be reckoned with in the blues. Mitch Kashmar has been making a name for himself with his own albums and his appearances with rock and blues giants. Mitch Kashmar has shared the stage with some of the most influential blues musicians including John Lee Hooker, Big Joe Turner, Eddie 'Cleanhead' Vinson, Lowell Fulson, Jimmy Witherspoon, Pee Wee Crayton, Johnny Adams and many others.

Harvey Brindell & The Tablerockers is a blues outfit that fills a niche in Portland that has been largely untapped, straight Chicago Blues. Harvey has



opened shows for Magic Slim & The Teardrops, Shawn Holt and The Teardrops, Bernard Allison, Mighty Joe Young, Jimmy Thackery, Smokin' Joe Kubik, Kilborn Alley Blues Band, JW Jones, Sean Chambers, Corey Stevens, Davina & The Vagabonds, Mike Zito, Dan Treanor's Afrossippi Band, Kevin Selfe & The Tornados, Mitch Kashmar, and Deak Harp. He's played in bands that have backed Chicago legends, Taildragger, Mary Lane and Rockin' Johnny when they were in his area and needed a back up band. One look at Harvey Brindell & The Tablerockers tour schedule confirms their status as an in-demand blues band.

It's plain and simple, Harvey Brindell & The Tablerockers play Chicago Blues. This is the real thing, post-war blues

of the '40s through '60s — no rock blues, no funk blues, no disco blues, no Americana, or any other watered down or hyped up blues hybrids. Their songlist is heavy with blues standards with songs from the likes of Muddy Waters, Howlin' Wolf, Little Walter, Junior Wells, James Cotton, Billy Boy Arnold, Magic Slim, Lonnie Brooks, John Primer, Little Milton, Magic Sam, Buddy Guy, Lurrie Bell, Fenton Robinson, Otis Rush, Hound Dog Taylor, T-Bone Walker and others. And on any given night you may also catch a set of The Tablerockers original songs. Then throw in some Bo Diddly and of course the required covers of the Kings (BB, Freddie, and Albert) and ..... well, you get the picture. It's all there. The Tablerockers wants to get the crowd dancing.



The 44's are a Los Angeles-based band that plays blues-roots-rock music. They first made their mark on the Los Angeles blues scene in '07 when they were tapped to compete in the International Blues Challenge in Memphis, finishing an auspicious 4th place. Band members include harmonica player Tex Nakamura (formerly of War), singer-guitarist Johnny Main, upright bassist Mike Turturro (formerly a featured performer with Lynwood Slim and Candye Kane), and drummer J.R. Lozano.

The 44's earned the attention of guitar great Kid Ramos (The Fabulous Thunderbirds, The Mannish Boys, Los Fabulocos) while playing their favorite haunt, the Doll Hut. With Ramos as producer, they have recently released their first full-length album, Boogie Disease.

The 44's' energetic live performances have garnered an enthusiastic local following, and they are a fixture on the Los Angeles blues scene. Their sound has attracted the likes of Los Lobos, who invited them on tour in '08.

In addition to their devoted fan base, the 44's have been critically lauded; Reviewer Robert Kinsler wrote of their '09 appearance at the Doheny Blues Festival opening for BB King: "Any overview of my day has to include the strong set by the 44's, an electric blues band that kicked off the action with a set of Chicago blues crossed with primal rock 'n roll!"

The 44's are honored to count Kid Ramos, Johnny Dyer, and Rod Piazza among the many blues luminaries they have backed.

## HADDEN SAYERS BAND

#### with US AND THEM

For most musicians, "the road" is a place of either hedonism or heartache. Contrasts on the far ends of a far too common cliché. But for Soul-Blues Guitar Slinger Hadden Sayers, the road is a comfortable buzz of underground fans and passionate shows.

It wasn't always this way.

Because for a while, Sayers wasn't on the road.

He built a successful career in Houston, Texas before relocating to the Midwest so his wife could pursue a career in cancer research. But then, shifty record companies faded away. Band members died tragically. The gigs stopped coming through and the phone stopped ringing. The '57 Strat stayed in its case.

However, Sayers rediscovered his love of music on regular drives to Southern Ohio where he was rehabbing a battered cabin. The murmur of radials on concrete, the sounds of Van Morrison and Sam Cooke on the stereo, and the support and tutelage of a grizzled stonemason sent him back to the recording studio.

In 2011, Sayers released the acclaimed Hard Dollar, featuring the single "Back to the Blues," which was nominated for the Song of the Year Award at the 33rd Annual Blues Music Awards. The album launched him back onto stages around the country. More than 100 gigs followed, from New York City to Mammoth Lakes, CA.

Sayers embraced the road, loved it. Savored the miles, the

buses, and the airplanes. While the easy rock and roll tale is to collect panties and mugshots on the road, Sayers collected stories. Stories by everyday people who had read HIS story of healing in Southern Ohio. From the woman whose husband had passed unexpectedly taking on immense home repairs with the help of some Home Depot classes after reading the bio...to the old man in Illinois who was moved to tears as he recalled a similar period of loss in his own life. The stories resonated in Sayers' head and heart driving him to explore the "human condition" more deeply. The result of that troubadour experience is the eagerly anticipated album Rolling Soul from Blue Corn Music.

Confident tunes from a mature, assured composer, the record features Sayers at his best. Heartfelt lyrics sung from deep inside matched with innovative guitar work, recorded with the warmth and soul and depth of the best vintage gear. It's a record to contemplate and savor.

Hadden Sayers is currently touring in support of his new CD Dopamine Machine and is one of the artists on the Legendary Rhythm and Blues Cruise # 31 on the West Coast in October 2018!!



Omaha's world-class, free summer concert series brings an award-winning mix of local and international talent poised to bring the best in blues, rock, soul, funk, and roots back to Turner Park.

"Every year, people remark on the amazing quality of artists that play our summer concerts. This truly makes the event unique," says Jeff Davis, founder of the Playing with Fire 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Playing with Fire (PwF) is celebrating 2004 its fifth year at Midtown Crossing's Pavilion at Turner Park and its 15th year in Omaha. Davis is especially fired up about this year's lineup. He says these "maybe the best bands we've ever played."

July 14 concert hosts two of the best Canadian blues bands. Headliner, Jack de Keyzer is a master of smoldering guitar skills with soulful singing and rocking blues and according to Blues Revue magazine, "a coveted super-hero in Canada..." A celebrated musician, de Keyzer has multiple nominations and two Juno awards for Album of the Year. He has won seven Maple Blues Awards (three of which were Guitarist of the Year,) first place in the International Songwriting Competition and won CBC's Great Canadian Blues Award from a poll of radio listeners. Bob Dylan claims, "If Jack de Keyzer was from Chicago, New York or LA, he'd be famous." The Ottawa Ontario-based trio, MonkeyJunk, has been dubbed "The Sultans of Swamp

R&B." Constantly evolving and continually pushing boundaries and blurring genre lines, MonkeyJunk has added an edge to their music by incorporating soul, funk, swampy blues & rock with thoughtful and intelligent lyrics. Celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2018, the group adds a 2018 Juno Blues Album of the Year Award to their collective 20 Maple Blues Awards, two Canadian Independent Music Awards, a Blues Music Award (USA), and a Juno Award for Blues Album of the Year in 2012.

A meant-to-be-moment for July 14 is the return of Heather Newman with her own band. Omaha watched Heather do the blues since 2006, as she performed with the BluesEd youth program. After learning guitar and performing solo acoustic folk music shows, she joined the Nick Schnebelen Band in 2015, gaining experience in touring, writing and recording before forming her own band in 2017. Her powerful and striking vocals along with her bass playing have earned her impressive reviews from the blues world. Blues Blast magazine's review of her first studio album, Burn Me Alive, said, "Heather Newman has written a solid batch of tunes - and when they are fleshed out by her compelling voice, every song becomes noteworthy...her solo career is off to rousing start.

August 25 is all about singer, songwriters and great guitars. Headliner. Paul Reddick was hooked on Delta blues before his teen years. Reddick's songwriting, power vocals, and harp skills over the years have catapulted him into a formidable force in blues music. Nominated for a Juno award in the

category four previous times. Paul Reddick finally scored the Blues Album of the Year in 2017! The Toronto-based singer/ songwriter won for his highly-praised album, Ride The One.

2017 also marked Reddick's 25th year as a recording artist, as his band The Sidemen's self-titled debut came out in 1992. Their fourth and final album, 2001's Rattlebag, won three Maple Blues Awards, including Album of the Year, and Songwriter of the Year, and earned a Juno nomination. Ride The One is his fourth solo record. American Blues Scene calls his latest release. 2018

"one hell of a ride."

No matter what you call their music - folk-rock, blues, roots, alternative country, REAL

> music - this Juno award-winning Canadian band is truly in a class by itself. Blackie and the Rodeo Kings originally formed in 1996 when members Colin Linden, Stephen Fearing and Tom Wilson came together to record one tribute album to Canadian songwriter Willie P. Bennett. Each of the members is hugely successful in his own right, with Frearing and Wilson touring and promoting their own music, and Linden, with his work as musical director on the television show Nashville. Now 22 years, eight albums, and numerous rousing live performances later, "BARK" thrives on, much to the elation of fans who follow the band Rolling Stone magazine called "the singer-songwriter supergroup."

Supporting artist and Midwest regional favorite and roots/blues/country songsmith, Matt Cox is a six-time OEA Award winner for Best Country/Americana and Best Blues. Cox has toured the western U.S. and was invited to play the SXSW festival in Austin. His ever-growing fan base appreciates his guitar-strumming, foot-stomping singular style of Americana, folk rock, country, and blues.

Each year, PwF supports other non-profit organizations in the community, including the BSO non-profit youth artist development program, BluesEd. BluesEd bands have performed at each PwF summer concert series and have the opportunity to attend clinics by presenting artists. PwF is elated to come "Full Circle" with BluesEd, with this year's bands, The Redwoods and Us and Them, and the return of BluesEd Alum, Heather Newman. To honor this momentous occasion, PwF has named the BluesEd program as our 2018 Charitable Partner. Free-will donations collected at the two summer concerts will be shared with the BluesEd program.

PwF is sustained by grants from the Nebraska Arts Council and the Douglas County Visitor Improvement Fund, as well as private sponsorships, in-kind donations, and volunteers. 




