

Canada's Top Touring Bluesman, JW-Jones is on the move and has a boundary breaking new CD.

On his 7th release, aptly titled 'Seventh Hour', Jones teamed up with multi-Juno award winning artist/producer, Steve Dawson, to mix the album.

Previous releases have featured legendary guests Hubert Sumlin (Howlin' Wolf, Muddy Waters) and David "Fathead" Newman (Ray Charles); heavy-hitters Kim Wilson (Fabulous Thunderbirds) and Charlie Musselwhite; two of the most innovative guitarists of our time, Little Charlie Baty and Junior Watson; and Canadian billboard favorite, Colin James. Jones has cut records from Hollywood to Sun Studios in Memphis.

Guitar World Magazine featured a CD called 'Guitar Masters Vol. 2' that put Jones alongside guitar stars B.B. King, Jimmy Page, and Carlos Santana among others, which led him to an endorsement deal with Gibson guitars.

While keeping one foot firmly planted in the roots he came from, this Maple Blues Award winner believes that appealing to a younger audience is the most important way to ensure the evolution of blues-based music.

Musicians that tour with Jones; Jamie Holmes (drums) and the heavy grooves of Laura Greenberg (bass) always add a powerful energy to the stage.

Charlie Musselwhite says "JW has done it again. Another fine CD of great tunes, guitar playing and arrangements. He sings his blues with authority."

His last few CDs have hit #1 on B.B. King's Bluesville on Sirius-XM Radio in the U.S.A., and Jones continues to win over audiences across the globe with his high-energy live performances.



HARPER - HARMONICA WIZARD

Part harmonica wizard, part rhythmic explorer, Harper is a fiery artist who blurs the lines between rock, blues, soul and world music. His latest CD "Live at the Blues Museum", released April 16, 2012 displays his trademark virtuoso harp performances, distinctive instrumentation, deeply soulful grooves and instantly memorable songs and provides another prime example of why his unique roots music style occupies a category of its own. Harper has been described as "a singer with the deep soul of Motown, a harmonica player who can graft Sonny Boy II and Little Walter with Sugar Blue, a songwriter who tells his own compelling stories in an unhurried, J.J. Cale-like manner, and a musical visionary who is unafraid to mix the didgeridoo, an impor-

tant part of the Australian indigenous culture of his homeland, with infectious modern percussive rhythms" (Hartford Advocate, Blues Revue, USA). His skill lies in the fact that he is able to tap into the kindred spirits running through his traditional and modern influences, borrowing from western and world music to develop a highly original take on the roots genre. He also takes the harmonica beyond its assigned place. Harper's innovative use of electronic enhancement and feedback breaks the traditional boundaries of the harmonica, giving his music its distinctive harmonics and effects.







Since 2003, Omaha rockabilly musician Larry Dunn has organized annual events to collect and deliver Christmas toys for the needy children of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota. Money also is donated to the emer-

gency heating fund to help the elders during the cold winter months. Pine Ridge's Lakota Sioux community is one of the most poverty stricken communities in the United States. Less than a day's drive from Omaha, families struggle in third-world conditions. The children of the reservation are desperately in need of hope and cheer, especially during a time of cold, harsh winds and the immense desolation of winters on the reservation. The majority of gifts for the children are collected at benefit concerts put on by area musicians. This year the toy drive is focusing on one large benefit concert in place of several small ones. Every dime raised goes toward buying additional gifts and stockings. The Toy Drive for Pine Ridge covers all administrative fees, the cost of transporting the toys to the reservation, and any additional travel expenses. The Toy Drive for Pine Ridge is a 501c3 non-profit organization and all donations are tax deductible.

Mato Nanji and Indigenous began playing local Omaha bars, and Nanji now is recognized as a major talent and accomplished guitarist in the blues-rock world. The latest recording by Indigenous, *Vanishing Americans*, is a tribute to Mato's late father and his band. Released May 21, 2013, the CD promptly found its place on iTunes Top 10 Blues Chart. Blues Rock



Review said on June 5: "Each song is brought together with heavy and powerful guitar riffs akin to those of Carlos Santana and Jimi Hendrix, while bellowing, raspy vocals turn a talented guitarist's vision into a relatable song for many, just as any praiseworthy blues album should."

Nanji was born and raised on the Yankton Lakota Reservation in South Dakota. Mato's father, the late Greg Zephier, Sr., was a well-known and highly respected spiritual advisor and spokesperson for the International Indian Treaty Council. In addition to this leadership role, he was an accomplished musician and a member of the musical group, The Vanishing Americans, which he formed with his brothers in the '60's. With the experience, love and wisdom of their father to guide them, Mato, his brother, sister and cousin formed the band Indigenous while in their late teens and they began touring extensively across the country. In 1998, they released their award winning debut album, *Things We Do.* The title track's video, directed by Chris Eyre (*Smoke Signals*), won the American Indian Film Festival Award and was shown at the prestigious Sundance Film Festival.

Since then, Nanji has released over ten acclaimed recordings. In addition to his Indigenous 'day job', Mato Nanji has been a member of the annual Experience Hendrix Tour Band since 2002. Playing alongside original Jimi Hendrix band members Billy Cox and the late Mitch Mitchell, the tour roster includes some of today's blues greats including Chris Layton and Tommy Shannon (Double Trouble), Jonny Lang, Kenny Wayne Shepherd, Eric Johnson, and Robert Randolph. Following their 2012 Experience Hendrix Tour, Nanji collaborated with two of his fellow EHT band mates, David Hidalgo (Los Lobos) and Luther Dickinson (North Mississippi Allstars), delivering the hard-driving, blues-infused 3 Skulls and the Truth.

Currently touring as in support of *Vanishing Americans* as a power-trio with musicians Derek Post and Charles Sanders, Mato's performance at the Toy Drive for Pine Ridge concert offers local fans a chance to enjoy a long-overdue appearance by this Midwest favorite.



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
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

Singer Johnny Rawls is "Remembering O.V." on New Tribute to Soul/Blues

GREAT O.V. WRIGHT COMING FROM CATFOOD RECORDS ON OCTOBER 15

EL PASO, TX – Catfood Records announces an October 15 release date for Remembering O.V., the new CD from Blues Music Award-winning singer Johnny Rawls that pays tribute to his late friend and mentor, O.V. Wright. Blues Hall of Fame singer Otis Clay is a special guest on three tracks of the album, which features nine songs associated with Wright and an original cut, "Blaze of Glory," that closes the album in rousing fashion.



Remembering O.V. was produced by Johnny Rawls and recorded at Sonic Ranch Studios in Tornillo, Texas. It was mixed by Jim Gaines at Bessie Blue Studio in Stantonville, Tennessee, and mastered by Brad Blackwood at Euphonic Masters in Memphis.

"O. V. Wright was a God-gifted singer," says Johnny Rawls in the album's liner notes about the most underappreciated of soul greats. "He didn't have to practice on it. He didn't have to work on it. The only thing he had to do was open his mouth and his song became life." Rawls saw the Wright magic first-hand: he was Wright's music director and guitarist back in the 1970s and after his mentor died in 1980 he played a large role in keeping Wright's band going strong into the 1990s. (They backed and opened for R&B stars like Little Johnny Taylor, Little Milton and Bobby "Blue" Bland.)

Rawls, in his own long-established solo career, continues to draw inspiration from Wright's Southern soul music. Over his previous three albums for Catfood Records, Rawls included a song on each from the Wright catalogue: "Ace of Spades," "Blind, Crippled and Crazy" and "Eight Men, Four Women;" all are reprised here and benefit from the expert remixing work of three-time Grammy winner Jim Gaines and multiple award-winning mastering engineer Brad Blackwood.

Other notable Wright classics on Remembering O.V. include "Precious, Precious," Nickel and a Nail" and "Into Something (I Can't Shake Loose)," as well as lesser known – but equally as powerful – songs such as "Poor Boy," "Don't Let My Baby Ride" and "Searching."

Joining Johnny Rawls on three tracks is another soul/blues titan, Chicago's own Otis Clay, who adds his down-home vocal style in a perfect match with Rawls on the aforementioned "Into Something ...," "Nickel and a Nail" and "Blaze of Glory."

Backing Johnny Rawls once again are the Catfood Records "house band," The Rays: Dan Ferguson – keyboards; Richy Puga – drums and percussion; Bob Trenchard – bass; Johnny McGhee – guitar; Andy Roman – sax; Mike Middleton – trumpet; and Robert Claiborne – trombone. Background

vocals are provided by The Iveys (Arlen, Jessica and Jillian).

The genesis for Remembering O.V. came a few years ago from Bill Wax, then the blues program director at satellite radio station Sirius-XM. Rawls was initially resistant to undertaking the project, even reluctant to update a single tune identified with Wright. Fortunately, bass player Bob Trenchard (also Catfood Records' label head) and guitarist

Johnny McGhee (credits include Marvin Gaye and the funk-soul group LTD) managed to talk the singer into recording "Ace of Spades" for his 2009 album of the same name. That was followed by "Blind, Crippled and Crazy" on Memphis Still Got Soul in 2011 and "Eight Men, Four Women" on Soul Survivor.

Johnny's soulful delivery of the songs on the new CD comes from the deep well of knowledge he has from working with Wright for all those years. "I was remembering the old days," says Rawls. "These are songs that O. V. sang back there on the stage and my mind goes back to standing beside him while he sang. And I watched the reactions of the crowds." He says he was especially fond of "Eight Men, Four Women." "It was a slow ballad that O. V. got emotionally up into. People in audiences were screaming because he was so deep into that song."


"Blaze of Glory" is the album's lone original, an emotional salute written by Rawls and Trenchard about keeping the flame alive as a truth-telling soul man until the very end. Rawls and The Rays are again aided by another "soul survivor," Otis Clay. Just before the song ends, Rawls instructs listeners to remember O. V. Wright and Little Johnny Taylor. Says Bob Trenchard: "The first verse references Johnny driving to a big show with O.V. when O.V. suffered his fatal heart attack. Just the two of them [in] O.V's Cadillac."

In the album's liner notes, Johnny Rawls closes with this message: "I want people to re-discover O. V. Wright and find out what a great singer that he was. They don't make people like that anymore, like O. V., Marvin Gaye and Otis Redding."

Johnny's 2012 CD, Soul Survivor, garnered him two more Blues Music Award nominations and followed Memphis Still Got Soul, which received three. He's been nominated numerous times in both the Soul Blues Male Artist and Soul Blues Album categories by The Blues Foundation, and his Ace of Spades CD won the BMA in 2010 as "Soul Blues Album of the Year."



Shawn Holt and the Teardrops · Daddy Told Me

Shawn Holt and the Teardrops have a new Blind Pig Records compact disc release out titled Daddy Told Me. Shawn is the son of Magic Slim of Lincoln who had a long and productive career in blues music. The CD is 49 minutes in length and includes a solid line up of 12 blues songs. It has a mix of original and cover songs. A couple of the covers were written by Magic Slim. Many songs on the disc have what seem like standard blues riffs and melodies, yet they all sound extremely



tasty. The disc features Lincoln Nebraska talents Shawn Holt, aka Lil Slim, and Levi William. Both of these individuals have won competitions sponsored by the Omaha Blues Society to represent Nebraska at the International Blues Challenge which is sponsored by The Blues Foun-

dation and held annually in Memphis, Tennessee. The sound quality and fine guitar playing of these artists makes this a very enjoyable disc to listen to. Flashy every now and then but nothing overbearing, just well-balanced presentations. Shawn's easy going vocals are well suited to what was put down in the studio. The CD has enough variation to maintain the listener's interest level. Chicago blues artist John Primer also sits in on a few of the songs. Hopefully blues fans in the

Omaha-Lincoln area will be getting opportunities to see some of the tunes on this disc performed at upcoming blues shows. This is an enjoyable set of music to imbibe in.



Roosevelt Sykes The Original Honeydripper

Roosevelt Sykes was one of the originators of modern blues piano. He influenced a great many modern keyboard players including Honey Piazza. This barrelhouse live solo album came out in 1977, and is now being released on cd.



Many of the songs have Sykes

introducing the cut with a humorous story that is as entertaining as the song itself. Sykes is playing unaccompanied, which might not be everyone's cup of tea, but I found it refreshing. The piano style is a combination of blues and ragtime.

The cd has many songs Sykes is known for such as "Drivin' Wheel" as well as covers of songs like Ray Charles' "What'd I Say". The cd shows Sykes to be a great entertainer that seemed to love the appreciative crowd.
