

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Best-Self Produced CD Information

Since 2005, The Blues Foundation has celebrated up and coming artists by bestowing an award for the "Best Self-Produced CD" of the year. It will do so again in 2011. The Best Self Produced CD award honors artists that have achieved excellence in the **studio**. Acts can be bands, solo acts, duo acts, trios, full choirs or any other combination. The purpose of this award is to assist Blues musicians in the pursuit of their professional goals.

This award complements the International Blues Challengethe live music component of IBC Weekend. The Foundation believes this award further emphasizes the critical role of affiliated societies in the Blues world and provides another featured award for IBC weekend.

Here are the simple rules; they can be found on our website on the IBC page under the "Best-Self Produced CD – General" on the left of the page.

- Entries for the Best Self-Produced CD are permitted by affiliated blues societies only.
- Each affiliate is permitted one entry only.
- The CD entered does not have to be performed by the band entered in the 2010 International Blues Challenge.
- The eligibility period is the same as for the Blues Music Awards-the CD must have been released during **November 1, 2009 October 31, 2010** time frame.

2010 IOWA BLUES CHALLENGE SOLO/DUO ACTS FINALS

Congratulations to **The Most Handsome Duo in the World**, consisting of Dylan Boyle and David Smit, winners of the 2010 Iowa Blues Solo/Duo Challenge held September 12, 2010 at Blues on Grand. **Dylan Boyle**, 21 is originally from Burlington, IA and currently is a senior in journalism at Iowa State University in Ames, IA. **David Smit**, 23 is originally from Boxholm, IA and graduated last December from Iowa State University in Ames, IA with a degree in mechanical engineering. **The Most Handsome Duo** in the World received \$250 cash plus \$300 travel expenses to Memphis as our state representative at the International Blues Challenge to be held February 2-5, 2011. They were one of eight acts from across Iowa to participate in this event.

The 2010 Iowa Blues Challenge has been proudly sponsored by Central Iowa Blues Society, Mississippi Valley Blues Society, Lizard Creek Blues Society, Budweiser and Citadel Broadcasting/94.9KGGO & 98.3WOW.

- If an affiliate does not conduct a competition to determine who it will sponsor but instead appoints a CD, that CD may not include a board member or officer.
- Interested affiliates must submit 4 copies of their selection to The Blues Foundation office by November 1, 2010. Include a note on the affiliates letter head stating the artist and title of the submitted material is for consideration in the BSPCD.

- Judging will be in three stages. There will be two rounds of judging by radio/print people leading to the final judging.

The finalists will be announced prior to IBC weekend. Music professionals will judge the finalists and the winner will be announced at the IBC finals.

Judges will evaluate:

- (1) Musical Performance
- (2) Audio Quality of the Presentation
- (3) Cover Art and Design
- (4) Credits and Liner Information.

A performer who has previously been nominated for a Blues Music Award (formally the W.C. Handy Blues Award) shall not be eligible for this competition. A CD issued in the name of an otherwise eligible performer which also includes the contributions of a Blues Music Award nominee may be ineligible, depending on the extent of the contribution. A CD on a record label that has been previously nominated for a Blues Music Award (Formally the W.C. Handy Blues Award) shall not be eligible for this competition.

Compilations are not eligible.

Singer, band, society or local producer may produce the actual CD as long as the performer is a singer, band or other individual entity.

Recordings with established or "known" producers within the industry are eligible as long as the recording is on the artist's independent label and not on an established national blues label.

If a recording was produced independently but an established blues label has purchased the master for distribution, the recording is still eligible until such time as the established blues label releases the recording.

The affiliates are responsible for ensuring that their submission complies with these rules. If you have any doubts or questions, contact Joe Whitmer at joe@blues.org.



Live and local! If ya like it, ya gotta live it.



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2010 Chicago Blues Festival

The 2010 Chicago Blues Festival was as good as any, and better than some, that I've attended in the past ten years. Except for a brief shower early Saturday, the weather was perfect for strolling around Grant Park from stage to stage, five in all. The new stage this year was sponsored by The Windy City Blues Society and although it was somewhat of a lo-tech set-up (not really a stage at all but an awning with a sound system set up on the ground) they had some noteworthy acts. Most notably The Kilborn Alley Blues Band, Chris James & Patrick Rynn, and Dave Specter & Steve Freund with Bob Stroger.

As has been the case every year in the past, I discover a band I've never heard of before that just knocks me out. This year

it was Dave Weld and the Imperial Flames. How this guy has stayed under my radar until this year is unclear. He was a founding member of Li'l Ed and the Blues Imperials and just like Ed was educated by J.B. Hutto. And as a kicker his band included none less than Abb Locke on sax.

A favorite of mine for the last two years has been Mary Lane. She can really belt out the blues and always has a great band. This year her two guitarist were Rockin' Johnny Burgin http://todayschicagoblues.blogspot.com/2009/01/hes-baaaack-rockin-johnny-at-nicks.html and former Muddy Waters side man Rick Kreher. Last year, when I first stumbled upon Mary Lane, in addition to Rockin' Johnny, she had Lurrie Bell and Matthew Skoller accompanying her.

This was my first chance to see Sugar Blue live and although I've listened to but never been knocked out by his recordings, seeing him live helped convince me, if there was any question, he is the real thing.

Of course the highlight each year of The Chicago Blues Festival is always the Friday night and Saturday night show on the Petrillo Music Shell Main Stage and this year was no different. The Friday night show was James Cotton with special guests Matt "Guitar" Murphy and Darrell Nulisch on vocals. Matt's band also includes another local Chicago guitar player, Tom Holland who has his own band, The Shuffle Kings, and is worth checking out in his own right. After James Cotton's set on Friday was the Tribute to Howlin' Wolf celebrating Wolf's centennial birthday with Eddie Shaw and The Wolfgang and special guest Hubert Sumlin followed by an award presentation to Wolf's daughters.

Other Friday highlights included Grady Champion, Jimmy Dawkins & Taildragger, Big George Brock and The Houserockers with Big George Brock Jr, and Sam Lay.

And that was just Friday!


The show opened with Zac Harmon, no slouch himself! Ricky


CD Reviews



Reba Russell Band · Eight

The Reba Russell Band opened the Tampa Bay Blues earlier this year. Following her usual rousing set of blues, one of the locals remarks to his buddy as he's heading towards

the beer tent — "Wow, I think I've found my hot new artist of the year already!" Such is the way of Reba. While locally and regionally respected for decades of top shelf recording and performance work, she has stayed fairly close to the Memphis area. As one would logically surmise **Eight** is, in fact, the Reba Russell Band's eighth CD. The six originals and six covers offered here are a mixture of styles and tempos with delta, jazz, gospel and rock influences. The band for this



Eight opens with three outstanding originals. <u>Almost A Memory</u> is a soft jazzy shuffle with a retro feel. It is quite

was popular long before he was born. "Nighthawk" Tooms adds the piano styling to complete the picture. This piece would not seem out of place in some upscale east coast lounge. The second track is the slow and soulful ballad Tender To Me. Reba's emotive vocal works perfectly with Josh's crisp guitar sound. Good Woman's Gone is the third track. It is a Memphis-style torch song sung in Reba's own style: "I hope I don't have to wait too long – to get that good man when his good

woman's gone." My favorites from the rest are <u>Water's Only Water</u>, a solid gospel-sounding lament and <u>Say The Word</u> a soft ballad bordering on country/pop. Reba pulls it off without a hitch backed by beautiful guitar and piano work by Josh and Robert.

Two of the covers are songs from Jim Dickinson's play list. Jim Dickinson was a Memphis singer, songwriter and producer who owned the Zebra Ranch where this CD was recorded. Jim died during the time this CD was being recorded and their inclusion here is truly a fitting tribute to an old friend. Asshole is a lighthearted ribbing of a man who has one well-known and widely recognized character flaw – enough said. The closing track, Hitler Lives, is preceded by a recorded introduction to the song by Jim Dickinson from one of his live performances explaining that this song is not about Hitler. Rather, it is an admonishment to the public about the treatment of returning veterans but extends to cover how we treat people in general. Reba's heartfelt vocal and Josh Roberts' emotion filled slide work are the perfect close to an outstanding listening experience.

The Reba Russell Band is a tight group of Memphis professionals that can cover the many of the styles and sounds of today's blues genre showcased here. Reba's voice can be emotive, passionate and strong or soft and heartfelt. This CD touches a lot of the bases and spotlights the skills of each of the players. Hey, Reba and her band have started to travel more so, who knows, maybe she will become the "hot new artist" in a lot of geographic areas.

Bob Corritore and Friends *Harmonica Blues*



Bob Corritore is a journeyman harp player from Chicago. He is celebrating the fortieth anniversary of the day he first picked up a harmonica with this cd. It is a compilation of his recordings with some of the great musicians and singers in blues, such as Koko Taylor, Little Milton, Pinetop Per-

kins, and many others. Corritore doesn't sing himself.

The cd is an assembly of songs Corritore played on from 1989 through 2009. And unlike many harp cd's, the harp is not out front or dominate. Corritore acts as a consummate sideman, and he lets the legends do the bulk of the soloing. He puts the song first and often plays the melody.

This cd doesn't break any new ground, but stays true to the classic Chicago style. I would recommend this outing to listeners that lean toward classic blues and like a little variety with the band members on a recording.

Rob Stone Back Around Here



When Rob Stone's previous album, 'Just My Luck' came out it was my album of the year. No, it was probably not "the best" blues album that year but it was so fresh, so unrecognized and so accessible that I was swooned. When I saw that the drought was to be broken, that Stone was releasing, 'Back Around


Again' my expectations soared.

Stone's former band mates Chris James (guitar) and Patrick Rynn (bass) a/k/a 'The C Notes' join in the recording with appearances by some of Chicago's finest including; Aaron Moore (piano), Sam Lay (drums) and Willie 'Big Eyes' Smith (drums). Like Stone, Boston native David Maxwell (piano) also plays on the record.

Stone's sound is pure 1950's Chicago with flicks of other blues city sounds such as the New Orleans beat on the focus track, "Chicago All Night." It is on "Chicago All Night" that the album begins to gel as the Stone's lyrics take the listener through a late night until dawn tour of the Windy City's noted blues venues, eateries and asundry hang-outs. On the fifth track, "I Need a Money Tree" Stone tiptoes around clichés themes without stepping off the balance beam. Perhaps this is the base draw to Stone's recordings; that he harkens that lovely blues vibe that most associate with Chicago without being overly reliant on covers or rehashing tired clichés. Albeit an up tempo album, Stone has a vague Harry Connick vocal quality that is boosted that he is cognizant of what he can, and therefore cannot, sing. There is none of the faux-shouter blues growly mishmash here - just a guy having a great time.

The album falls short, for me, because there are too many tracks. The albums textures are consistent and perhaps I just need a tad more variance in sound: admittedly Stone let's us know he has no interest in taking the artform beyond the establish 50's sound. Since his first album provided a fine rendition of the post-war Chicago blues sound, a lack of maturation or perhaps development is apparent.

Radio hosts might look at, 'Can't Turn Back the Clock' for an entry way into the record: David Maxwell rollicks across the keyboards and the song's form is a pure, easily recognized but tasty blues treat. Not a "great" album but fun and above average.
