FORMER ZOO BAR OWNER LARRY BOEHMER DIES



Larry Boehmer was a kid in Pawnee City when he started listening to the blues on radio station KAAY out of Little Rock, Ark.

As an adult and owner of the Zoo Bar in Lincoln, he would introduce thousands of people to the music he loved.

Boehmer, 65, died Tuesday morning (Sept. 4th) at a hospital in Berryville, Ark. He had lung cancer and was in hospice care.

He was an art student at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln when he stumbled onto the tiny club on North 14th Street. He became a regular at the bar, which then catered mostly to third-shift workers in the morning hours. And before long, he asked owners if he could put some of his records on the jukebox.



And then, Boehmer bought the place.

"It just looked like a blues bar to me," he said in June. "I never had a dream to own a club ... it became my life. It turned into this big family. That's a wonder."

Drummer Dave Robel played one of the first shows at the Zoo with the Megatones.

"The first time I played there was Dec. 15, 1973," Robel said Tuesday. "And the last time I played there was about 12 hours ago.


"The Zoo Bar is a music bar, as opposed to a bar with music -- because of his understanding and love of music," Robel said. "Larry was a fair man. He was a really great guy, he was a good bass player and he gave everybody a shot."

Robel said Boehmer tapped into an already existing blues underground and introduced Lincoln to all kinds of roots music.

Boehmer and his wife, Rosalie, moved to Eureka Springs, Ark., in 2000, handing the club and its tradition of live music onto sons Jeff and Tim Boehmer and longtime Zoo Bar employee Pete Watters.

"I started in 1986 as a bartender and became manager in the '90s," Watters said Tuesday. "And then in '99, I got my degree, and I told Larry I was going to leave. He came back in the next day and said, 'Hey, why don't I leave and you stay?'

"It's kinda mapped out my whole life for me ... it was just incredible what he did for the community of Lincoln. There aren't a lot of guys that will step up and really take that chance, and he and (original Zoo owner) Jim Ludwig did.



It sure makes life more interesting when there's people like him around."

Boehmer's booking magic and his relationship with musicians all over the world made the Zoo Bar work.

"He really understood -- you can see from the outpouring from musicians and from fans -- he really had a unique ability to see it from both points of view," Watters said. "He always knew how to treat musicians -- he understood what problems there were on the road -- but he also understood that fans only have so much money. He always struck a good balance."

Watters said the Zoo will commemorate Boehmer's life, and death, but no plans had been made yet.

In 1998, Boehmer took the music to the streets to celebrate the bar's 25th anniversary. The

festival was an unqualified success, with more than 16,000 people turning out to hear a lineup that included Chris Gaffney, Maria Muldaur, James Harman, Coco Montoya and Dave Alvin. The bar has continued the tradition and is looking forward to its 40th anniversary next summer.

Over the decades, hundreds of blues giants played on the bar's tiny stage at 136 N. 14th St.: Otis Clay, Albert Collins, Pinetop Perkins, Buddy Guy, Son Seals, Koko Taylor, Robert Cray, Matt Guitar Murphy, Charlie Musselwhite and Southside Chicago's Morris Magic Slim Holt, who eventually moved to Lincoln with his family.

"Well, Larry, he feels just like my brother," Holt, 75, said Tuesday. "Larry meant a lot to Lincoln, the Zoo Bar means a lot to Lincoln and the Zoo Bar is known all over the world, because I've been all over the world and people have asked me about it.

"Larry has made many people happy. He has got many people together."

Grammy Award winner Bubba Hernandez shared his thoughts of Boehmer on Facebook.

"Even if you walked into the Zoo Bar without knowing anything about it other than music is played here, one would know they were on very hallowed ground. ... It was/is one of those venues that when on the road, you'd swear it was Saturday night on a Monday or a Tuesday. I love love love this joint but, the room, the name are nada without its people, its staff and its audience, that give that body a soul."

And from longtime local blues harmonica player Chris Siefkes: "Larry built a house that turned into a community and that community is better off having known Mr. Larry Boehmer!"



The Dustin Pittsley Band has long been a household name in Tulsa, a hotbed of eclectic music for decades, and gaining national attention. While difficult to label, the band's sound is best described as a roots rock with a strong blues influence from the likes of Freddy King to Jimi Hendrix but with a dash of that Tulsa Sound. Dustin's searing guitar, warmth and passion on stage draws favor from all ages and fans of particular musical preferences.

The release of Dustin's 4th CD, "Palm Trees & Trailer Parks", coincided with a five show Jagermeister tour with country star Dierks Bentley last spring. He has also opened for or shared the stage with Delbert McClinton, Tab Benoit, Indigenous, Arlo Guthrie, Chris Duarte, Watermelon Slim and Bernard Allison. Grab your dancing shoes and get your ticket for the October 12th show at Slowdown, featuring Tommy Castro and the Painkillers at 7:30, followed by Curtis Salgado and finally Joe Louis Walker. We just received late word that Murali Coryell will be sitting in with Joe Louis Walker for an even more unforgettable evening! Coryell, the son of guitar legend Larry Coryell, grew up around the likes of Jimi Hendrix, Miles Davis, & Carlos Santana. His 2010 CD 'Sugar Lips' reached # 5 in 2010 on the Living Blues Radio Chart.

Walker, Salgado, and Castro, all Alligator records recording artists, have each achieved new musical milestones in 2012. Walker is presently touring to support his latest release, 'Hellfire,' which Billboard magazine says, "blows all over the map... gutbucket blues, joyous gospel, Rolling Stones-style rock crunch, and aching R&B. Walker's guitar playing is fine and fierce."

Salgado, an adopted son of the Blues Society of Omaha, released 'Soul Shot' in February. The 11-track CD features four Salgado originals and covers that include George Clinton, The O'Jays, and Otis Redding, and Johnny "Guitar" Watson. Salgado seems born to sing soul and 'American Blues Scene' says he 'hits the bulls-eye' with 'Soul Shot.'

Castro, multiple Blues Music Awards winner and honorary Captain of the legendary Rhythm & Blues cruises, turns yet another new corner this year with the formation of 'Tommy Castro and the Painkillers.' Still inspired by his blues guitar and R & B vocal contemporaries and a strong desire to push the boundaries of today's roots music Castro has brought the all new band together to do exactly that. 
I hope the pictures tell the story I cannot. Wonderful night to be at The Zoo Bar, Larry will be with us all inside that little club known as The Zoo Bar!

Deanna Bogart · Pianoland

Blind Pig Records



Deanna Bogart is a vocalist, piano player, saxophonist and song-writer that might be best known as a featured player in the Legendary Rhythm and Blues Revue. This CD highlights her skills as a solo performer concentrating on her great piano playing ability.

Bogart plays a hybrid musical style she describes as "blusion".

This is a form of music that combines blues, boogie woogie, jazz, and country.

The first cut is called "In the Rain". It is a very lively tune and a fine introduction to the CD. The third song is an excellent boogie woogie instrumental cleverly entitled "Boogie Woogie Boogie". The CD has a wide range of styles exemplified by Bogart's version of the classic "Over the Rainbow" and a cover of James Taylor's "Close Your Eyes".

This CD shows why Bogart is such a hit on blues cruises. She sings brilliantly, and her exuberance comes through on each song with her outstanding keyboard playing. I have never seen her live, but I would love to! I hope she comes to Omaha one day soon, but in the meantime, I will enjoy this exceptional CD.
