Global Influences On American Blues To Be Celebrated At Holland Center



Omaha, Neb., (Sept. 20, 2013) – Omaha Performing Arts presents "World Blues" featuring The Taj Mahal Trio, Vusi Mahlasela and Fredericks Brown at the Holland Performing

Arts Center on Friday, Oct. 25, 2013, at 8:00 p.m. The celebration of the global influence on American blues is part of Omaha Performing Arts' 13/14 Season.

"World Blues" features three diverse points of view in the world of blues music. Anchored by The Taj Mahal


Trio, led by iconic folk-blues legend Taj Mahal with Omaha native Billy Rich on bass and Kester Smith on drums, the evening will highlight the South African blues of guitarist/vocalist Vusi Mahlasela

and the more modern rock 'n' roll perspective of New Zealand band Fredericks Brown, whose vocalist is Taj Mahal's daughter, Deva Mahal.

Though his career began more than four decades ago with American blues, Grammy Award®-winning Taj Mahal has broadened his artistic scope to include music from around the world – west Africa, the Caribbean, Latin America, Europe, the Hawaiian islands and so much more. Born Henry St. Claire Fredericks in Harlem in 1942, Taj Mahal grew up in Massachusetts where he learned to play the piano, clarinet, trombone and harmonica at a young age. He became serious about playing the guitar in his teens.

Inspired by a dream while at college, he adopted the musical alias of Taj Mahal and formed a popular party band at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. After graduating, he headed to Los Angeles, where he formed the Rising

Sons and mingled with blues legends. He released a string of recordings in the 1970s, including the Grammy®-nominated soundtrack to the movie Sounder. He toured relentlessly in the '80s and immersed himself in the music and culture of his new home in Hawaii. Among his releases in the '90s were two Grammy® winners. Overall, he has been nominated for nine Grammy Awards®.

Born and raised in a musical family in Omaha, Billy Rich began playing music at the age of 7, playing guitar before switching to electric bass. Growing up, Billy played with several local groups, most notably the Seven Wonders with his siblings. Rich began playing with Taj Mahal in 1972.

Kester Smith was born in Granada and raised in Trinidad, West Indies, where he learned to play drums, congas and timbales with Andre Tanker and The Flamingos. For the last 20 years, Kester has toured and recorded seven albums with Taj Mahal.

Vusi Mahlasela is simply known as "The Voice" in his home country, South Africa, celebrated for his distinct voice and his poetic, optimistic lyrics. Mahlasela became a singer-song-writer and poet-activist at an early age, teaching himself how to play guitar and later joining the Congress of South African Writers. After the release of his debut album When You Come Back, Mahlasela was asked to perform at Mandela's inauguration in 1994 and continues to spread Mandela's message as an official ambassador to Mandela's HIV/AIDS initiative, 46664. Americans first caught a glimpse of Mahlasela in the film Amandla! A Revolution in Four-Part Harmony. Long-time admirer Dave Matthews signed Mahlasela to ATO Records label and released The Voice (2003). Guiding Star and Say Africa, produced by Taj Mahal, soon followed.

New Zealand duo Fredericks Brown is the collaboration of

vocalist Deva Mahal and keyboardist Stephanie Brown. Their music fuses the cultural heritage of both musicians: Deva Mahal draws on her rich soul and blues roots and Brown's sound is rooted in the organic Pacific sound of New Zealand. They released their album Out of the Rain in October 2010.

However, there are other very important benefits. Like being able to fly our BSO flag promoting our passion for the music we love and the camaraderie we feel for each other and our "Blues family". In so doing we help get the word out to the general public that BSO is here and that we have such a wonderful Blues scene in our area. Without your continued support that would not happen. We have a number of "new" items in stock now that we either did not carry for quite a while or have never had before. Some examples of our new items are: our women's fitted t-shirts, both bottle and can coozies, jacket patches, bottle openers and vinyl window clings/stickers. In short, you can wear/display your BSO gear with pride and the knowledge it will represent well and that it will last.

DEBBIE DAVIES BAND

Everyone knows Debbie Davies. Over the years she has established a standard of excellence for others to follow when it comes to blues guitar. She was fortunate enough to have played with Albert Collins and although his influence is apparent, she still makes songs her own. She has also played with and/or recorded with the likes of John Mayall, Duke Robillard, Peter Green, Mick Taylor and Tab Benoit (to name just a few).

After The Fall is Debbie's 11th solo album, on the MC-Records label. Personnel are: Debbie Davies, lead & rhythm guitars, and vocals; Don Castagno, drums; Matt Lindsey on bass,; Scott Hornick, bass; Bruce Katz on B3 organ; Dave Gross on rhythm guitar (2nd lead on "Done Sold Everything", bass on "Don't Put The Blame On Me" and percussion). On "Don't Put The Blame On Me" Michael Bram plays drums, and Jeremy Bram plays B3 and piano. This album well played. Performances are relaxed, and the playing is loose, but never messy. The other thing that becomes clear is that her playing is controlled, but never contrived. It has a light, joyful, unhurried quality. Standout cuts are scattered throughout, starting with the opener, "Don't Put The Blame On Me", which is a foot-tapping honky-tonk. "The Fall" (co-written by Davies and Castagno), has a great backbeat, nice lead playing, and the organ backdrop is perfect. "True Blue Fool" (also co-written by Davies and Castagno), is slow and mellow with some nice chording and a nice lead run. "Done Sold Everything" is a shuffle, and you can hear Collins' influence; a nicely played piece.

The best cut on this album is "Little Broken Wing": The playing is spacious and airy, soft, with a lot of texture. "All Of My Forgiveness" is another mellow blues with stunning guitar tone, and again, great lead playing. "R.R. Boogie" is just a jamming romp! The album closes with "Google Me Baby", which is playful and sounds like a cool 1940's tune – really well done. The level of musicianship on this album is excellent. The production and sound quality are very good and give


the album a very relaxed, warm quality. This is a great album to play along with, or sit and enjoy with a good beer (or both).



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



Delbert & Glen Blind, Crippled, & Crazy


Delbert McClinton and Glen Clark first recorded together over four decades ago. If they had followed-up those two albums, it might have sounded a lot like this current recording. If anything, I think forty years of seasoning has improved their music.



These two Texans have a lot to do with the musical style that is now sometimes referred to as roadhouse blues. Drummer Tom Hambridge, pianist Bruce Katz, and guitarist Anson Funderburgh make for an outstanding back-up band.

The music ranges from ballads such as "When I Need You the Most" to the roadhouse blues of "Good as I Feel Today". There is no new ground broken here, but more of the exceptional music you've come to expect from the two musicians. This new collaboration was a long time coming, and definitely won't disappoint fans of the two singers.
