



# BERNARD ALLISON

Thursday, Oct. 16th • 21st Saloon • 6 pm • \$12

Born in Chicago on November 26th, 1965, the youngest of nine children Bernard Allison was first introduced to the roots of black music and the art of the electric guitar by his father, the late great Luther Allison. Bernard made his first appearance on record at age 13, when he played on a live LP his father recorded in Peoria, IL.

Soon after graduating from High School, he began a three-year guitar apprenticeship in Koko Taylor's high-flying Blues Machine. He also played in the late Willie Dixon's Blues All-Stars and performed with his Dad at the 1983 Blues Festival – one of the event's highlights. Along the way, Bernard picked up slide guitar tips from Johnny Winter and in the 80's also learned from the late Stevie Ray Vaughan.

With those experiences under his belt, Bernard moved to Paris in 1989 to live and play the blues with his father. He joined the tourband of Luther Allison after a furious collabo-



ration of "Father & Son" at the '89 Chicago Blues Festival. A recording of this formation is to be heard on the Luther Allison album "Let's Try It again" (RUF Records). Bernard released his first solo album in 1990 with the significant title "The Next Generation". In 1999, two years after Luther passed away, Bernard decided to move back to the States to go back to his roots and push his career in his native country.

Bernard seems to have inherited Luther's knack for igniting audiences, but he's no clone of his famous father. He is definitely blazing his own path with a style that reflects a unique mix of traditional and modern influences. The Allison torch has been passed, and it's clear that Bernard takes his role as its bearer very seriously. He's assumed the challenge of keeping the blues alive and growing – a

commitment he renews every time he takes the stage.

# JOHN PRIMER & THE REAL DEAL BLUES BAND

2013 Blues Music Awards Nominee for Traditional Blues Male Artist of the Year & Best Acoustic Album of the Year for Blues On Solid Ground

By any yardstick, Chicago guitarist John Primer has paid his dues. Prior to making The Real Deal for Mike Vernon's Atlantic-distributed Code Blue label, Primer spent 13 years as the ever-reliable rhythm guitarist with Magic Slim & the Teardrops. Before that, he filled the same role behind Chicago immortals Muddy Waters and Willie Dixon.

All that grounding has paid off handsomely for Primer. His sound is rooted in the classic

Windy City blues sound of decades past: rough-edged and uncompromising and satisfying in the extreme. He's one of the last real traditionalists in town.

By the time he came to Chicago in 1963, Primer was thoroughly familiar with the lowdown sounds of Waters, Wolf, Jimmy Reed, B.B. and Albert King, and Elmore James. He fronted a West Side outfit for a while called the Maintainers, dishing out a mix of soul and blues before joining the house band at the Southside blues mecca Theresa's Lounge for what ended up being a nine-year run. Elegant guitarist Sammy Lawhorn proved quite influential on Primer's maturing guitar approach during this period.

Always on the lookout for aspiring talent, Willie Dixon spirited



him away for a 1979 gig in Mexico City. After a year or so as one of Dixon's All-Stars, Primer was recruited to join the last band of Muddy Waters, playing with the Chicago blues king until his 1983 death. Right after that, Primer joined forces with Magic Slim; their styles interlocked so seamlessly that their partnership seemed like an eternal bond.

But Primer deserved his own share of the spotlight. In 1993, Michael Frank's Chicago-

based Earwig logo issued Primer's debut domestic disc, Stuff You Got to Watch. It was a glorious return to the classic '50s Chicago sound, powered by Primer's uncommonly concise guitar work and gruff, no-nonsense vocals. With the 1995 emergence of The Real Deal — produced by Vernon and featuring all-star backing by harpist Billy Branch, pianist David Maxwell, and bassist Johnny B. Gayden, Primer's star appeared ready to ascend. He soon transferred back to the Wolf label for sets such as 1997's Cold Blooded Blues Man, 1998's Blues Behind Closed Doors, and 2000's It's a Blues Life.



## **KELLEY HUNT**



Kelley Hunt's love for her craft was fine tuned listening to early blues, R&B, roots rock, jazz and gospel influences including Ruth Brown, Mahalia Jackson, Billie Holiday, Ann Peebles, Ray Charles, Dinah Washington, Aretha Franklin, Charles Brown, Wanda Jackson and a crossection of the New Orleans/St. Louis/KC piano traditions of Professor Longhair, Toots Washington, Johnnie Johnson and Kansas City masters Jay McShann and Mary Lou Williams among others. While subtle reminders of those very traditional influences can be heard in Kelley's live performances and recordings, her lyrics, soul and passion are all her own.

The result has been critical praise, "surprises don't often crop up on the well-trodden blues circuit. So welcome Kelley Hunt. This Kansan is a full-blown phenomenon: Powerhouse singer, hardboogieing pianist, polished songwriter..." – Minneapolis Star Tribune. "...the freshest slant on classic R&B you're likely to hear these days. She's a tough woman who makes a hip and burly sound." – Westword Denver.

Along with critical acclaim Kelley's blistering live performances over the last several years have won over legions of blues and roots music fans making her a crowd favorite at over 100 blues and music festivals across North America.



# JEFF JENSEN Producer, Composer, Blues Guitarist Thursday, Nov. 6th • 21st Saloon • 6pm • \$8

Growing up listening to 50's, 60's and 70's Rock -N-Roll, the Blues was always just a step away. So when Jeff started playing guitar at age 11 the significance of blues was overwhelming. Flirting with different styles of music like Rock and Roll, Funk, Punk Rock and Jazz through high school, Jeff landed his first blues gigs at age 19 as a guitarist. Soon after he was hired to front a southern California blues band that gigged a few times a month from San Diego to Ventura.

In 2003 Jeff Jensen and Chris Sabie founded the Santa Clarita Blues Society. Jeff and Chris traveled to Memphis for the 2004 IBC. Jeff came home from that a member of the Blues Foundation and fully charged and inspired to form his own band.

May 2004 the Jeff Jensen Band was born. From 2005-2009 the band performed 200+ shows per year. During this time the Jeff Jensen Band was in the 2005, 2006, and 2007 IBC's, regularly performed west coast blues festivals and opened for BB King at part of his 80th Birthday tour.

In 2007 the band's debut album "Self-Titled" (Swingsuit Records) was released. "Self-Titled" received great reviews form several respected Blues publications. "Self-Titled is a tour-de-force debut release by a band that breathes new life into the blues scene. The themes may be tried and true, but they are delivered with a fresh dose of enthusiasm form one tight band." - Dave Ruthenberg (Living Blues, 2007) Album also hit The Living Blues Charts and the Roots Music Charts that year.

2008 Jeff was asked to produce longtime friend and musi-



cal associate John Parker's album. This was very challenging and emotional because by this time John was quickly losing his 5 year battle with cancer. The album was completed just weeks before John passed. It was released a few months later and contains some inspirational blues songs about his battle that serve to this day as anthems for several America Cancer Society events around the country.

2009 Jeff Jensen Band released their second album "I'm Coming Home". This album was a big production featuring the very tight "Pandas Horns" and lots of special guests. It hit the Roots Music Charts in 2009 as well. And is still played on hundreds of blues formatted radio stations.

After moving to Memphis in 2011, Jeff

spent 2 years as Harmonica Sensation Brandon Santini's guitar player and Musical Director. Jeff performed over 450 shows with Santini. They also recorded three albums together including a "Live at Sirius/XM Studios" (2012) session that has not yet been released, "This Time Another Year" (produced my Jensen and Santini) which received two Blues Music Award Nominations and Jensen's critically acclaimed "Road Worn and Ragged"

Jeff is now touring as Jeff Jensen Band and promoting his 2013 release "road worn and ragged". You can hear Jeff Jensen on Sirius XM Satellite Radio and 250+ other radio stations around the United States as well as stations in Denmark, France, Norway, Sweden, Italy, England, Canada, Australia, Germany, Argentina, Brazil, Belgium and more.

# BISCUIT MILLER AND THE MIX

Thursday, Oct. 30th 21st Saloon • 6pm • \$8

Born and raised on the south side of Chicago by his Grandmother; he was given his childhood nickname, Biscuit, after always being in the kitchen and underfoot while she was trying to cook. Growing up at Grandma's house also gave Biscuit his love and appreciation for music, as gospel and soul were played in the home on a regular basis.

While visiting his friend Datrick's house one afternoon, Biscuit spotted a four string electric bass sitting in a corner collecting dust and decided to check it out. The bass belonged to Datrick's older brother, Darnell, who taught him a couple of songs. Biscuit took to it like a fish in water, "It was easy to play and I fell in love with it immediately". So at the tender age of eleven years old, Biscuit Miller was born into the "Blues". It didn't take long until he formed his first band, Clever, with Ivan Wallace, his childhood friend. They moved to Minneapolis in 1982 where Sonny Rogers taught him a lot about playing basic blues. During his time with Rogers, they recorded "They Call Me the Cat Daddy", which won Rogers a Handy Award for Best New Artist. Unfortunately, Sonny passed away before he was able to accept the award. Biscuit then went on to play with other respected blues artists such as, Mojo Buford (formerly with Muddy Waters) and Lady Blue (backup vocalist for Ike and Tina Turner).

One day, Biscuit received a phone call requesting him to come back home to sub for Chicago's own legendary Lonnie Brooks who needed a bass player for one night. That one night lasted for over ten years as Biscuit became the permanent bass player for the Lonnie Brooks Band. "The years I spent with Lonnie were invaluable to me as a musician. I learned so much about the music business and being on the road – we played some incredible gigs such as President Clinton's inauguration and I met and performed with many of my own idols while traveling with Lonnie and the band. During the winter months, we didn't tour as much, so I spent time sitting in with various



musicians and in 2000 I formed Biscuit and the Mix to fill up some of the down-time". During this time, he recorded a CD "Come Together". One of the bands Biscuit frequently sat in with was the up and coming Anthony Gomes Band. During one of those sessions, he was asked to ioin the band full time and he decided to take Anthony up on his offer. During the five years with the Anthony Gomes Band, they released five CD's, Unity, Sweet Strin-

gin' Soul, Long Way Home, Music is the Medicine, and the latest, Live at the Triple Door.

A heavy touring schedule of over 250 gigs a year in the US and abroad have led to a dedicated fan base. In 2012 Biscuit's fun and funky style of bass playing earned him the Blues Music Award for Bassist of the Year. He also took 2nd place in the bassist category in the Blues Matters International Writers Poll. Biscuit Miller and The Mix are once again on the road with his latest CD "BLUES WITH A SMILE" and ready to bring a smorgasbord of fun to your party. What's better than a bowlful of Soulful, Funky Blues stew? A pipin' hot Biscuit, of course!



# **CD** Reviews



## Polly O'Keary & the Rhythm Method · Compass

Self-produced

This is a fine debut cd. The members are well known in the Pacific Northwest, and should be everywhere else as well. I had the pleasure of seeing them recently in Omaha. They put on an extremely enjoyable show. The band should not be missed if you get a chance to catch them live. They are very tight, and they don't seem like a relatively new band. Polly has an enthusiasm and energy that is contagious.

The songs are all written by Polly, with one being co-authored by Clint "Seattle Slim" Nonnemaker. Polly handles the vocals and plays bass, Slim is on guitar, and Tommy Cook is on the drums. These are excellent musicians that don't over-play. They are very tasteful. There are also keys added on several tunes by Arthur Migliazza. Horns are supplied by the Seattle Horns.

There is a range of styles and tempos that keep your interest while listening to the cd. Polly is an expressive and powerful singer with a style all her own. She doesn't sound like many cookie cutter female singers around today.

The opening cut, "Fools Gold", is a perfect start to the cd. It is high energy with very cool and funky keyboard play.

## Sena Ehrhardt Live My Life

This is Ehrhardt's third cd. She is a very talented young lady. I would describe her music as blues/rock- with the emphasis on rock. She wrote five of the eleven songs. The songs are very personal statements, it seems.

The cd starts out rocking with a strong cover called "Stakes

Have Gone Up". I also like the Larry Williams often done, "Slow Down". There is a sameness on many of the songs, though, with the guitar and drums. They are screaming and booming even on ballads. I also think, as time goes on, Sena will develop a more unique singing style. At times, she sounds a lot like many other young female singers around today.

This cd will probably be a hit with a lot of folks whose tastes lie in the blues/rock genre. Sena is a talent to be reckoned with, and I look forward to seeing what she will do in the future as her gift matures.



"Summer" has a fun country touch. My favorite song is "Nothing Left to Say". It has a Latin feel with great horns.

This is a very original modern blues cd. I see a bright future for the band, and I hope to see them again soon. As good as the cd is, the band is even better live. How about a "Live in Omaha" cd in the future?
