If Igor and Red Elvises aren't in the middle of a tour, they are getting ready for the next one – this is a group that is constantly in motion and consistently evolving. Singer, songwriter, guitarist and showman extraordinaire Igor Yuzov is perpetually globetrotting and in the process he has found scores of wildly talented, entertaining musicians to bring into the fold of this increasingly international party band.

Red Elvises started as a Russian group, playing what they dubbed "Siberian Surf Rock". Since then the band has included musicians from many other countries including United States, Israel, Puerto Rico and Bulgaria, to name just a few. Everyone who performs with them for any length of time brings something different both energetically and musically. At various times shows have included (keyboards, accordions, sax, clarinet, trumpet, flute, banjo, mandolin, tuba) and many other instruments. Old and new fans alike can expect to be surprised at shows again and again, however the roots of Red Elvises remain the same: Igor's unique



brand of humor combined with guitar based rock n roll that makes audiences want to sing, dance, scream and shout.

German born Igor Yuzov grew up in the former Soviet Union, where folk music was the norm and rock n roll was illegal. A rebellious streak, however, led him to seek out the forbidden records, which could be secretly traded in some places for those who knew where to look. As soon as it became possible, Igor left Russia for America with his folk band Limpopo. The "Crazy Russian Folk n Roll" group were personally greeted by Ronald Reagan and proceeded to win Ed McMahon's Star Search.

Red Elvises began in 1995 after Igor dreamed that Elvis Presley came to him and told him to start playing rock n roll. Not one to say no to the King, Igor and his Russian friends started playing on Santa Monica's 3rd Street Promenade. Their street musician days did not last long, however, as they drew such huge crowds that the City of Santa Monica brought them to court and ordered them off the streets. Since then Red Elvises have been constantly touring, with occasional breaks from the road to record an album or take part in film and television projects. This constant work for the last 15 years has led to them gaining a world-wide following, with successful tours all over North America, Europe and Russia (Red Elvises bootlegs have been found in Siberia).

Igor & Red Elvises have declined several major record deals, preferring to maintain independent status and produce all their own work. This includes 11 studio albums, one live album, a live concert DVD and a Greatest Hits compilation. They can be found playing everything from large festivals to private parties, small venues to massive stages such as 2005's Live 8 Benefit Concert. Whatever the event, wherever Igor & Red Elvises go, they bring the party with them.

# MARIA MULDAUR

Saturday, Oct. 3rd @ 6 pm • Zoo Bar, 136 N. 14th Street, Lincoln, NE

Maria Muldaur is best known worldwide for her 1974 mega-hit "Midnight at the Oasis," which received several Grammy nominations, and enshrined her forever in the hearts of Baby Boomers everywhere; but despite her considerable pop music success, her 50-year career could best be described as a long and adventurous odyssey through the various forms of American roots music. During the folk revival of the early '60s, she began exploring and singing early blues, bluegrass and Appalachian "old timey" music, beginning her recording career in 1963 with the Even Dozen Jug Band and shortly thereafter joining the very popular Jim Kweskin Jug Band,

touring and recording with them throughout the '60s.

In the 39 years since "Midnight at the Oasis," Maria has toured extensively worldwide and has recorded 40 solo albums covering all kinds of American roots music, including gospel, rhythm and blues, jazz and big band (not to mention several award-winning children's albums), before settling comfortably into her favorite idiom, the blues, in recent years. Often joining forces with some of the top names in the business, Maria has recorded and produced on-average an album per year, several of which have been nominated for Grammys and other awards.

Her critically acclaimed 2001 Stony Plain Records release, *Richland Woman Blues*, was nominated for a Grammy and by the Blues Foundation as "Best Traditional Blues Album of the Year," as was the follow up to that album, *Sweet Lovin' Ol' Soul*. Her timely 2008 album, *Yes We Can!*, featured songs from some of the most socially conscious songwriters of the past half century: Bob Dylan, Marvin Gaye, Allen Toussaint, Garth Brooks and others, and featured her "Women's Voices for Peace Choir," which included: Bonnie Raitt, Joan, Baez, Jane Fonda, Odetta, Phoebe Snow, Holly Near and others.

For her 2009 release, Maria revisited her original jug band roots, teaming up with John Sebastian, David Grisman and Dan Hicks. *Maria Muldaur & Her Garden of Joy* was nominated for "Best Traditional Blues Album of the Year" by the Blues Foundation, and garnered Maria her 6th Grammy nomination, as well.

In 2011, Maria detoured from her ongoing exploration of vintage blues and released *Steady Love*, a return to her



much-beloved New Orleans (the place she calls her "musical and spiritual home") to record a contemporary electric blues album that reflected the kind of music she loves to perform live what she calls "Bluesiana Music" - her own brand of New Orleans-flavored blues, rhythm and blues and "swamp funk." Steady Love reached #1 on the Living Blues Chart and garnered her another nomination for "Best Traditional Female Blues Artist" from the Blues Foundation.

Now, in 2012, for her 40th album, Maria has produced....First Came Memphis Minnie, a loving tribute to the pioneering blues woman, who inspired and in-

fluenced so many female blues artists who followed in her footsteps.

The new album is a true labor of love for Maria, who considers Memphis Minnie to be not only a trailblazing musical pioneer for all women, but also a personal blues hero. "From that first moment I heard her soulful music on an old scratchy 78, to this," says Maria, "Memphis Minnie, and the example she set for me, has remained a profound influence on my life and my music."

# JOHN PRIMER

As the title of his critically acclaimed Atlantic Records CD suggests, Grammy Award and Blues Music Award Nominee, John Primer is truly "The Real Deal." At 8 vears old, John borrowed his first guitar and started to strum. Before that he played a homemade guitar built on the wall of the house with a broom wire, 2 nails, and 2 rocks to make it tight. With the sounds of Jimmy Reed, Muddy Waters, Little Milton, Elmore James, BB & Albert King reverberating through his Grandmother Laura Nell's tube radio, John was instantly hooked.

Early inspiration came from his family steeped in spiritual, gospel, blues and R&B tradition. As a young boy John's mother knew he would be a singer, "he came out singing" she would say. John first appeared on stage at the local Baptist church, in his hometown of Camden Mississippi. At the age of eighteen, feeling restless and in search of further audiences, John followed the path of his mentors and migrated to Chicago in the fall of 1963. He quickly found work in an era when Chicago's modern electric Blues sounds were first taking shape. Forming his first band, The Maintainers in 1964, John and his old Harmony guitar rocked such West Side clubs as, The Place, The Bow Tie, and Lover's Lounge. By 1968 John had left The Maintainers when the opportunity arose to front the Soul and R&B group The Brotherhood. Jamming late into the night and practicing by day, John was forming his own unique style and expanding his repertoire. John's success would lead him in 1974 to replace John Watkins in the house band at the world famous Theresa's Lounge on the South Side of Chicago. Over the course of the next 7 years, John would play with such originators as Sammy Lawhorn, Junior Wells, Buddy Guy, and Lonnie Brooks, all innovators sculpting the sound of Chicago Blues. It was during this point in John's career that quite a few people were taking note of this outstanding performer. In 1979, master songwriter and bassist Willie Dixon persuaded him to join

his band The Chicago All Stars. Traveling through the US,

Mexico and Europe, John developed his skills as a rhythm

guitarist, a lead slide player, and a powerful singer. Anoth-

er blues master who believed in John Primer was none oth-

er than the "Hoochie Coochie Man" himself, Muddy Waters.



Muddy recruited John not only as a guitarist, but also as an opening act and bandleader. As he did with so many other great musicians, Muddy served as a father to John, instilling in him an unrelenting passion for the music that gave birth to Rock and Roll. John stayed loyal to Muddy until his untimely death in 1983. Fresh off the heels of his success with the Muddy Waters Band, John signed on with the legendary Magic Slim. For the next 14 years, he toured with Magic Slim & The Teardrops, bringing tight, house rocking sounds to every corner of the planet. While

John was the bandleader of Magic Slim & The Teardrops, they were voted the best blues band in the world year after year and are still today thought of as the inventors of "the lump", Chicago Blues sound. In 1981 John began playing at the Legendary Checkerboard Lounge on the South-Side of Chicago. He was the house bandleader, holding open jam nights and teaching the next generation how to play the Blues until the original nightclub closed its doors in 2001. But John's days as a sideman were numbered, and in 1995 the veteran blues man released his major label debut "The Real Deal", on Atlantic Records. Deciding to make it out on his own, he began touring extensively in support of his twelve solo albums to date. John formed his independent record label, Blues House Productions in 2008 and released "All Original" his debut CD and then his second CD "Blues on Solid Ground". John's first 2 CD's "All Original" and "Blues on Solid Ground" have been nominated many, many times by the National Blues Foundation, Chicago's Blues Balst Awards, and have won Living Blues Critics Polls as well. His new record label is off to an amazing start. The people love John's music and he intends to keep manking it for a long, long time. John is a Living Legend and has been giving the Lifetime Achievement Award many times. He is a Grammy Nominated Blues Artist and is one of the last Traditional Blues Artists with original Mississippi roots. He was taught by our founding fathers of the Blues, the old way (some say, "the right way"). We need to cherish his history and celebrate his amazing music!



# THE JAMES HARMAN BAND

Thursday, October 15th @ 6 pm • Zoo Bar, 136 N. 14th Street, Lincoln, NE

James Harman was born and raised in Anniston, Alabama and quickly picked up on the black blues and soul music being played on juke boxes and the radio. He sang in the church choir until age 16 when his family moved to Panama City Florida, where he found himself surrounded by like-minded blues lovers. Wearing a fake moustache, young James slipped into a still segregated black nightclub to see Little Junior Parker's show. He was totally overtaken by the blues and soon became a regular, known as "That boy who sings like a man" by patrons.

While still in his teens, he started playing juke joints and dance clubs throughout the South. His performances became legendary-he was "tapped" by talent scouts, signed and taken to Atlanta, Georgia in 1964 to begin his recording career at age 18. He had a series of nine singles (45 RPM)

records) released during the mid to late 60's on obscure southern labels. He tried several restarts in new home bases including Chicago in '65, New York in '66, Miami in '68 and New Orleans in '69.

During his stay in Miami Harman was befriended by fellow record collectors Henry Vestine, Alan Wilson and Bob Hite of Canned Heat, who persuaded him to move to California, promising to help him get re-started. Harman made his move to SoCal in 1970, and true to their word, Canned Heat insisted on Harman's Icehouse Blues Band as their opening act on many big shows. Icehouse Blues Band became established at venues such as The Golden Bear, The Ash Grove, The Troubadour and The Lighthouse, which all booked real blues artists.

James Harman was soon in demand for his own shows, as well as backing every living blues artist who was touring without a band. He also opened literally hundreds of shows for artist who did have their own band. Icehouse Blues Band was a real working blues band. In 1978 James tired of using band names and started billing his act as James Harman Band.

Some alumni include Phil Alvin, Bill Bateman, Gene Taylor, David "Kid" Ramos, Michael "Hollywood Fats" Mann, Stephen Taylor Hodges and Jeff "Big Dad" Turmes. All of these players did long stints in the Harman Band. James is often cited as a band leader who gave many now famous bluesmen their start. Harman stopped ground touring in 2000 and now only takes blues festival dates around the world. Nathan James has been James Harman's regular band guitar player since 1997 when he was 19 years old... he turned 37 in 2015 and he's still Harman's favorite! Nathan is also James' recording engineer and co-producer on his own projects, as well as projects they produce for other artists.

James Harman's side project: Bamboo Porch Revue features guitarist Nathan James playing rollicking, low-down, juke-



joint blues over James Michael Tempo's Afro-Cuban percussion, Troy Sandow's sparse, pulsating acoustic bass and Marty Dodson's masterful drumming. Through his long career starting in the early 60's James Harman has built up an enormous song catalog and had 20 of his original songs used in movies and television. He has been nominated for 20 pestiferous W. C. Handy (Blues Foundation) awards. He was inducted into the Alabama Music Hall of Fame, and he is the harmonica player of choice on many ZZ Top releases, as well as live with them on many international TV shows. James Harman has had 32 releases, on many different labels; he currently tours every spring, summer and fall, working in as many as 29 countries. Harman was nominated for a Grammy Award, and won two Blues Music Awards for his contribution to the Blind Pig release, "Re-

membering Little Walter" in 2014. He is a one of a kind song writer, producer, musician, showman, vocalist and internationally known bluesman.

# **SELWYN BIRCHWOOD**

Living Blues

Selwyn Birchwood, Florida's rising young blues fireball, is a guitar and lap steel playing bundle of pure energy. He delivers his original songs with a revival tent preacher's fervor and a natural storyteller's charisma made all the more impactful by his raw, unvarnished vocals. Birchwood plays high-octane blues—at once deeply rooted, funky and up-to-the-minute—with true passion and honest emotion. With his band feeding off his drive and exuberance, the striking 6'3" 30-year-old with his trademark Afro roams the stage (often barefoot), ripping out memorable guitar licks with ease. His ability to win over an audience—any audience—is proven night after night on the bandstand. With his warm, magnetic personality, Birchwood is as down-to-earth as his music is fun, thought-provoking and vital.

In 2013, Birchwood catapulted from local hero to shooting star. He won the world-renowned International Blues Challenge, beating out 125 other bands from the U.S. and abroad. He also took home the Albert King Guitarist of the Year Award. It wasn't long before Alligator Records president Bruce Iglauer offered Birchwood a contract. His debut album, Don't Call No Ambulance, is a fully realized vision of contemporary blues. Birchwood's original songs range from raucous romps to hill country stomps, from searing, serious slow blues to modern blues rock. Between his uninhibited sense of fun and adventure and his serious—as—a-heart—attack musicianship, Don't Call No Ambulance is a window into the future of the blues.

The Tampa Tribune says Birchwood plays with "power and precision reminiscent of blues guitar hero Buddy Guy. He is a gritty vocalist [who is] commanding with his axe." According to Bruce Iglauer, Birchwood is the real deal. "Selwyn Birchwood is a terrific young blues talent with a huge future. He writes smart, infectious, fresh songs and delivers them with a warm, conversational vocal style and a fun-loving attitude. He's a killer guitarist, switching between a regular six-string and lap steel. Live, he's a ball of energy, interacting with the audience like they were in his living room. Selwyn is destined to be one of the next stars in the blues world."

Birchwood, his father from Tobago, his mother from the UK, was born in 1985 in Orlando, Florida. He first grabbed a guitar at age 13 and soon became proficient at mimicking what he heard on the radio. But the popular grunge rock, hip-hop and metal of the 1990s didn't move him, and he quickly grew bored. And then he heard Jimi Hendrix. "He was larger than life. What he did was mind-blowing. When I realized Hendrix was influenced by the blues, I found

my path," he says. By 17, he was deep into the blues, listening to Albert King, Freddie King, Albert Collins, Muddy Waters, Lightnin' Hopkins and especially Buddy Guy. As luck would have it, just as Birchwood was discovering Guy, the blues master had a concert scheduled in Orlando. Birchwood was there, front and center. "I was floored," he recalls. "I completely connected with the blues. I knew I had to make this music."

As Selwyn's guitar proficiency grew, a friend told him that his neighbor was a blues guitarist and had a band. The 19-year-old Selwyn went over to check it out and jam. The guitar-playing neighbor turned out to be the Texas-born blues legend Sonny Rhodes, who was instantly impressed with the enthusiastic young guitar slinger. Within one month's time, Rhodes asked Birchwood to pack his bags and join him on the road. It was an incredible experience for Birchwood, as Rhodes took the youngster under his wing, not only teaching him guitar and lap steel, but also how to conduct business, how to run a band, and how to reach an audience. "Sonny always said, 'Play what's in your heart.' I've never lost sight of that," says Birchwood. Rhodes insisted Birchwood go to college and always held the guitar spot in his band open for Selwyn whenever he was available. It was a win-win situation, as Birchwood-through hard work and scholarships-received his MBA from The University of Tampa. "I challenged myself to get that degree," Birchwood says. "These days, it's not good enough to just be a good player." Combining the musical lessons learned from Rhodes and his business acumen, Birchwood, now living in Tampa, formed the current version of The Selwyn Birchwood Band in 2010.

In 2011 the self-released FL Boy helped the band land gigs outside of their Tampa home, where they were becoming local heroes. Birchwood and his band won their way to spots at the 2012 and 2013 International Blues Challenges in Memphis. After taking ninth place in 2012, they came back determined the next year, taking first place. Alligator Records president Bruce Iglauer was sitting at the judges' table at the time. "I saw Selwyn's potential in 2012. He absolutely deserved to win in 2013," he says. The victory opened more doors for Birchwood, increased his exposure and helped the band land a deal with Intrepid Artists booking agency, which led to more and better gigs.

The Selwyn Birchwood Band has been touring non-stop since winning the IBC. The band has performed at festivals including The Mississippi Valley Blues Festival, Springing The Blues Festival, The Tampa Bay Blues Festival, The North Atlantic Blues Festival, The King Biscuit Blues Festival as well as on The Legendary Rhythm & Blues Cruise. Birchwood has opened for major blues stars including Robert Cray and Buddy Guy and has shared the stage with another friend and teacher, Joe Louis Walker. He recently had the opportunity, when performing in San Francisco, to bring his friend and mentor Sonny Rhodes on stage to sit in with his band. It was a moment Birchwood will never forget. "He did so much for me; it was a real honor to return the favor, if only a little."

With Don't Call No Ambulance, Selwyn Birchwood steps onto the world stage, bringing a new wave of blues to a new generation of blues fans.



With powerful performances and a contagious enthusiasm, Gracie Curran & The High Falutin' Band have established themselves as one of the most exciting young bands on the roots scene today.





### THE BART WALKER BAND

Thursday, November 5th @ 6 pm • \$10 • 21st Saloon, 96th and L Street, Omaha, NE

Walker's new, rocket-fueled album Waiting On Daylight is more than an explosive collection of 11 songs that ride the cutting edge of blues and rock. It's also a bridge that unites the best in both genres and aims to connect a new audience to the deepest roots of American music.

The young six-string slinger, winner of the 2012 International Blues Challenge's prestigious Best Guitarist award sees the disc

as fulfilling a dream that's helped drive his course as an artist from bluegrass prodigy to MVP sideman to globe-trotting bandleader.

"The songs have deep grooves, great hooks and honest stories, and all of that's wrapped in a sound that goes beyond the blues to a place where more than just blues fans can relate to the music," he explains. "But the blues is where the heart of all the music I love lies, and I'm hoping Waiting On Daylight can lead people who love rock and songwriting back into the blues. For years it's been my dream that I can play a role in making the blues popular again."

From the opening buttery slide guitar of "It's All Good," it's obvious that Walker is on the right path. Using his full-blooded guitar sound and powerhouse voice as constant guide, each song follows its own instantly appealing rhythmic spine. "Black Clouds" grows from a bass groove and a swell of feedback to a bare-knuckled tune about reckoning. And "Girl You Bad" praises his new bride Natasha Jacobs Walker over a deep shuffle with Mississippi roots and stratospheric slide guitar. Likewise "Gotta Be You" — a sequel of sorts to the latter number — is a love note that percolates to a Texas blues beat packed with plenty of rock 'n' roll drive and arcing single-note guitar breaks, plus a juggernaut wah-wah soaked solo that recalls both Jimi Hendrix's and Stevie Ray Vaughan's jolting use of the effect.

Waiting on Daylight's big, beefy and beautiful guitar sound is part of an aural conspiracy Walker and producer Jim Gaines masterminded in Gaines' Memphis studio. To achieve the boldest guitar tones possible, they chained together an array of a half-dozen classic and modern amps — Marshalls, Fenders, Category 5s and others — and Walker played through them all simultaneously.

"That allowed me to get the best sonic characteristics of all of the amps and tubes and speakers and cabinet sizes together in the sound of my own guitars," Walker explains.

But Walker's super-heated playing is always tempered by the album's pervasive sense of soul, which comes especially to the fore in the title track, co-written by Walker and veteran Nashville-via-Texas songsmith Gary Nicholson. The song "Waiting on Daylight" also addresses a recent, pivotal period in Walker's personal life. Last year he was able to sidestep the excesses of drug and alcohol abuse, which allowed him to bring a sharper focus to his music, his marriage and his future which, as the song's title implies, has been opening up before him.

That process of "seeing daylight" began with the release of



Walker's previous critically heralded debut Who I Am and his performances in the 2012 International Blues Competition in Memphis. The competition, sponsored by the Blues Foundation, features blues based artists from across the globe vying for top honors in the band and solo/duo categories. Representing Nashville, the Bart Walker Band came in second and Walker himself took the top guitar title and was awarded

an ES-335 model from the Gibson Custom Shop and a state-of-the-art Category 5 amplifier — both of which appear on Waiting On Daylight.

During the contest hard-core blues fans in attendance from all over the world were exposed to Walker's musical prowess. One of them, label owner Thomas Ruff, signed Walker to his first record contract and put him in the studio with Gaines, whose resume includes sessions with Huey Lewis, Buddy Guy, George Thorogood, Santana, Stevie Ray Vaughan, Steve Miller, John Lee Hooker and many, many more.

Walker arrived prepared, with double the songs necessary to make the album and his chops honed by more than 300 concerts in 2012 alone.

Born and raised around Holly Springs, Mississippi, Cedric Burnside, Grandson of legendary R.L. Burnside and son of drummer Calvin Jackson, has been playing music all his life. He has developed a relentless, highly rhythmic charged style

with strong hip-hop and funk influences. This four-time winner of the prestigious Blues Music Award's Drummer of the Year (2010-2014) is widely regarded as one of the best drummers in the world.

Growing up at his grandfather's side, he began touring at age 13 playing drums for "Big Daddy" on stages around the globe. Cedric was "I write about my life, my kids, and everyday things. I try to stick to the truth," Cedric says. He recalls growing up without a radio or a TV. "My Granddad used to play out on the porch, and we'd have house parties every weekend. Johnny Woods would come over and blow harmonica, and he'd drink two or three gallons of corn liquor. We just stomped up dirt."

In addition to "Big Daddy," Cedric has also played and recorded with among countless others, Junior Kimbrough, Kenny Brown, North Mississippi Allstars, Burnside Exploration, Widespread Panic, Burnside Exploration, Jimmy Buffett, T Model Ford, Bobby Rush, Honey Boy Edwards, Galactic, Black Joe Lewis and the Honeybears and The John Spencer Blues Explosion. In 2006 he was featured in Craig Brewer's critically acclaimed feature film Black Snake Moan, playing drums alongside Samuel L. Jackson. (The film is a tribute to R.L. Burnside, and gives many nods to the late bluesman.)

In 2010, Cedric collaborated with his younger brother, Cody Burnside, and his uncle, Garry Burnside, to create The Cedric Burnside Project. They created a new genre of music by infusing Mississippi Hill Country Blues, Funk, R&B and Soul that will keep your foot stomping all night long. The Cedric Burnside Project has brought new life and energy to the Blues, it's no wonder why it's loved by fans around the world.

Following the untimely and tragic death of his brother Cody, Cedric has kept the flame burning, recording and touring the world with guitarist and lifelong friend Trenton Ayers.

Ayers, son of guitarist Earl "Little Joe" Ayers (Junior Kimbrough) grew up in North Mississippi, where he is known for his deep knowledge of the blues and virtuoso skills on both the guitar and the bass.
