Bobby Messano is a legendary guitarist and Contemporary Blues Artist who has released seven Solo CDs, placed songs in many TV and Cable shows and played on over 50 Major label and Indie albums. His playing has been heard on everything from MTV jingles to Benny Mardones' smash hit "Into the Night".

The celebrated guitarist has played on records by Clarence Clemmons, Franke & The Knockouts, Joe Lynn Turner and STARZ, and produced the 60's hit act, "THE SHADOWS OF KNIGHT". Live he has played guitar and been the music director for Steve Winwood, Lou Gramm and Country artists Jimmy Wayne, Rodney Atkins and Steve Holy.

The guitarist's last five CD's ("Holdin' Ground", "Bobby

Messano Live In Madison", "that's why i don't sing the blues", "Welcome To Deltaville" and "Love & Money") have garnered 26 Grammy 1st Round ballots in 8 categories and airplay on over 275 Blues shows.

Between 2012 and 2016, Bobby played over 400 shows in 32 states to over a half-million people.

Bobby's newest CD "BAD MOVIE" was released on April 15,2017 and debuted at #1 on Sirius/XM BB King's Blues-ville and has been in the Top 20 on SIX Roots Music Reports charts since it's release. It is a collection of fifteen incredible songs written with major co-writers Jon Tiven, Larry Weiss and Steve Kalinich and features the amazing "Come To Your Senses" written by Queen founder Brian May and Jon Tiven and the haunting duet "Water Under The Bridge" with Bobby and Alecia Elliott (2001 AMA Nominee) "BAD MOVIE" offers a unique perspective of personal traumas and a country in a state of flux and the reviews have been outstanding.



Legendary blues-rock guitarist and vocalist Coco Montoya will celebrate the release of his new Alligator Records album, *Coming In Hot*, with a live performance on Wednesday, October 16, 2019 in Omaha. Taught by the "Master of the Telecaster," Albert Collins, and schooled by a decade on the road with John Mayall, Montoya has a hard-edged sound and style all his own. He delivers instantly memorable songs, powered by his forceful, melodic guitar playing and passionate vocals.

Coming In Hot features 11 songs by writers including Montoya and Dave Steen, Tom Hambridge and Richard Fleming, Warren Haynes, Frankie Miller, Jeff Paris, and Albert Collins. The tracks range from blistering, hard-rocking blues to potent shuffles to fervent, moving ballads. Montoya delivers each song with uncompromising, dynamic energy. His unpredictable guitar playing and smoking, soulful vocals are inspired by a backing band featuring renowned musicians including bassists Bob Glaub (Bob Dylan, Bruce Springsteen, Jerry Lee Lewis) and Mike Mennell (Jimmy Buffett, John Fogerty), keyboardist Mike Finnigan (Jimi Hendrix, Etta James, Taj Mahal), rhythm guitarists Billy Watts (Eric Burdon) and Johnny Lee Schell (Bonnie Raitt), and Tony Braunagel (who produced the album) on drums.

When Montoya launched his solo career in 1993, he already had an instantly recognizable burning-hot sound and style all his own. His debut album solidified his stature as the blues' newest rising star. Over the course of his nine previous solo albums, Montoya has consistently delivered piping hot blues, rock and soul. His new album (his fifth for Alligator), *Coming In Hot*, is another instant classic. Montoya's fiery, melodic guitar playing and passionate vocals fuel one memorable song after another. *Guitar Player* says Montoya plays "stunning, powerhouse blues with a searing tone, emotional soloing, and energetic, unforced vocals."

Powerhouse Chicago blues group The Nick Moss Band will celebrate the release of their new CD, *Lucky Guy!*, with a live performance at The Jewel in Omaha on Saturday, October 5, 2019. UK tastemaker magazine *MOJO* says, "Moss shows the world his fearsome guitar chops and his complete familiarity with the great tradition of Chicago blues music." In 2019, Moss won the coveted Blues Music Award for Traditional Blues Male Artist Of The Year. For this performance, the band's featured harmonica player, Dennis Gruenling, is unavailable. Instead, Moss will be joined for some six-string fireworks by legendary Texas blues guitarist Anson Funderburgh. *No Depression* calls Funderburgh "a master of the Telecaster."

Anson's contributions to modern blues guitar cannot be denied. His influence on so many from my generation is evident by every guitarist from; Christoffer Lund Andersen, Mike Welch, Doug Deming, Joel Paterson, Mike Keller, Jeremy Johnson, myself and sooooooo many others around the world!!!

In a few weeks I'll have the pleasure and honor of having Anson Funderburgh as a special guest on two special shows in St. Paul, MN. at The Hook and Ladder & in Omaha, NE at The Jewell. Please come out and please help spread the word about these two special shows!

Lucky Guy! is a foot-stomping showcase featuring the classic Chicago blues sound the band is known for. But, as Moss himself notes, there are also "a few other flavors," including Louisiana swamp pop, West Coast blues, New Orleans funk, and even some proto-rock and roll. All but one of the 14 songs are originals, delivered by the band with uncompromising skill and authority.

Growing up in Chicago and standing tall at 6'2", Moss dreamed of playing both music and sports. His mother was

a huge blues fan, even taking a young Nick to see Muddy Waters live in concert. Kidney surgery sidelined his athletic hopes. To lift his spirits, Nick's brother snuck the 18-year-old Nick out of the hospital soon after his surgery and took him across the street to see Alligator artists Little Charlie & The Nightcats perform. It was there and then that Nick dove headfirst into the blues, deciding that a career as a bluesman was for him. Originally a bass player, Moss got his first professional break touring and playing with legendary West Side Chicago guitarist Jimmy "Fast Fingers" Dawkins. He next toured with Willie "Big Eyes" Smith (longtime Muddy Waters' drummer), leader of the Legendary Blues Band. Finding himself in need of a guitarist, Smith insisted Moss switch instruments. Combining his natural talent with non-stop woodshedding and playing every jam session, Moss guickly became one of the city's most sought-after players. Bluesman Jimmy Rogers (famous for his pioneering guitar work with Muddy Waters and for his solo hit "Walking By Myself") hired Moss to join his touring band and became his mentor. Moss' other influences include B.B. King, Freddie King, Earl Hooker, Magic Slim and other groundbreaking players.

Moss formed his own band in 1997 and released the first of his 13 albums a year later on his own independent Blue Bella label. Since then he's earned legions of fans around the world, playing over 100 shows a year. Moss has shared stages with Buddy Guy, Kenny Wayne Shepherd, Gary Clark, Jr., David Hidalgo and many others, and is an in-demand guest, always welcome to sit in with his musician friends around the world.

With *Lucky Guy!*, The Nick Moss Band proves it's not luck but talent that earns them standing ovations night after night as they barnstorm clubs, concert halls, roadhouses and festival stages. "When the band and I get on stage," says Moss, "the music takes over. We can't hold back and the energy just comes pouring out. We get carried away and the audience gets carried away with us."



From The President

To the Blues Society of Omaha

By the time you read this I will be just over halfway done with my cancer treatments. Jon Pearson has graciously consented to recording pictures of my 15 minutes of radiation, which are Monday thru Friday every day for six weeks. From the time in the clinic door to out the clinic door is pretty much right on 15 minutes. This machine cost over three million dollars and they schedule patients all day long thru the week. It takes longer to drive to the Jennie Edmundson Hospital than to get the treatment, but the daily dose of radiation is starting to add up in my throat and mouth. Constant dry mouth and problems swallowing are now present after two weeks. The doctors tell me it will get worse before it gets better-oh joy. My meals now consist of oatmeal, pudding, eggs, anything soft. Food has lost all taste, unless you consider cardbord tasty. Not fun or delicious.

There are two reasons I am making my treatments public. The first is to urge everyone that is eligible to get the HPV vaccine shot. Most kids are getting this shot now but please make it a point to see if your children and grandchildren are taken care of. Adults are now being vaccinated up to 45 years old. Believe me, if I had the choice I would take that shot in a heartbeat.

The second reason is for all my friends that smoke, I would like you to take a minute and reconsider that next cigarette, or cigar, or chew of tobacco. BELIEVE ME, YOU DO NOT WANT TO GO THROUGH THIS! Make the choice now before the doctor looks you in the eye and says,"We need to talk", and you know it is not going to be good.

I arrive at the Oncology Center just before 8, walk in and greet the other patients that are on the same schedule, and scan my bar coded card to let them know I am there. Shortly I am called back to the radiation room, where the door is eight inches thick and filled with lead, weighing two tons. The shell of the room consists of lead lined concrete 8 feet thick all the way around to contain any radiation and protect everyone else from harm.

I walk in, peel my shirt and lie down on the table. Nurses then center a line on my chest to the laser and proceed to clamp the mask over my head and shoulders to ascertain the radiation has a steady target. The mask is so tight my eyelashes rub on it when I blink. The nurses then rubber band my feet together and give me a rubber ring to hold onto with both hands to keep my shoulders still. Then the nurses are gone in a flash to the control room to kick start the machine into motion. The arms fold forward and back as the unit rotates around me for a period of time taking x rays while delivering the doses of radiation to the needed areas. It usually lasts for 2-1/2 to 3 songs on the radio and then the nurses are there to free me from the mask. It is as if I am being released from prison every day when that mask comes off.

Then I am done by 8:15 and off to a day of drinking lots of water and combating a sore throat and mouth. My saliva glands are producing less so spit is decreased and is very stringy, "ropey" in their terms. I have to use a special mouthwash for dry mouth many, many times a day. I will also have to apply flouride to my teeth daily for the rest of my life because of damage done to the saliva glands.

At this writing I have 19 treatments left and doctors have warned me it is an increasing discomfort level as we go on through this battle. Thanks for all your hugs, thoughts and prayers. The final chapter will appear in the November issue. Thanks for listening, and caring.

Heather Newman had picked up a bass guitar only six months prior to her bands first on stage appearance at Knucklehead's Saloon Kansas City, MO March 17th, 2017, where she introduced her music to the stylings of Keith Ladd on the guitar, bringing on a unique mixture of American roots genres. The Heather Newman Band immediately began to

captivate audiences with their powerful performances and Heather's dominant yet pixie-like stage presence.

The trio played locally around the Kansas City area before adding a brand new layer to their groove when Ryan Matthew joined the band that July on piano and keys. Only one month after bringing on a fourth member, the group hit the studio to record their first album "Burn Me Alive", which was set to release Dec. 1st 2017 through Vizztone Label Group. Heather's debut album reached #9 on B.B. King's Bluesville top 15 Countdown in November

2017 before the official release, and continued to make the charts on various radio stations around the world.

Their raging success with their first album landed them some amazing performance opportunities in 2018 including opening for the legendary Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons, Walter Trout, Tommy Castro, and Delbert McClinton. The Heather Newman Band and their album went on to win two 2018 Blues Blast Music Awards for "Best New Artist Debut Album" and the "Sean Costello Rising Star Award". They were also nominated for a 2019 Blues Music Award for "Best Emerging Artist".

Now, with 2019 in full swing, the Heather Newman Band has released their second Vizztone album, Rise From the Flames, which reached #4 on iTunes Top Blues Albums.

MIKE MORGAN and the CRAWL COMEBACK TOUR

"When guitarist Mike Morgan and his band, The Crawl, released their 1990 Black Top debut, Raw & Ready, the band quickly went from local Texas phenomenon to nationally recognized blues stars. With each subsequent release, Morgan's powerful guitar playing and The Crawl's road-proven stage shows made for one of the blues' great success stories.

Mike Morgan and The Crawl's fiery stage shows drew rave reviews from critics and left fans open-mouthed in amazement. With a healthy dose of hard driving Texas blues, a touch of horn-fat Southern soul, and a splash of old-fashioned roots rock, Mike Morgan and The Crawl are back and ready to take their aggressive, innovative blues to fans from coast to coast. The Crawl kicks out some lethally propulsive rhythms behind Morgan's barbwire-jagged guitar."

The history of Mike Morgan and the Crawl began in the late 80's when Mike teamed up with vocalist Darrell Nulisch. Blues was experiencing a strong resurgence and the band quickly took off, becoming one of the Lone Star State's premier blues acts. Nulisch's stint was short-lived but Mike found the perfect replacement in Lee McBee, a fiery singer/harmonica player from Kansas City. Between Morgan's blistering guitar work and McBee's captivating stage presence it was only a matter of time before The Crawl would get their big break. That break came in 1990 when Black Top Records signed them to a deal resulting in a ten year, eight CD relationship. He eventually found his way to Severn Records and put out three great CDs with us: Texas Man, Live in Dallas and Stronger Every Day.

As Mike and Lee's collaboration proved popular with blues aficionados, appearances at the Benson & Hedges Blues Festival, the Dallas Blues Festival, the Atlantic City Blues Festival and the Mississippi Valley Blues Festival soon followed. Shortly before a performance at the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival, Morgan's old pal Anson Funder-

burgh took Black Top owner Hammond Scott to a gig. Scott was so stunned by the band's talent and originality that he signed them to the label immediately following the Jazz Fest appearance.

Mike Morgan and The Crawl found a national audience with the release of their debut recording, Raw & Ready, in 1990. Backed up by extensive national and international touring, Mike Morgan and The Crawl continued to amaze their fans throughout the 1990s by releasing five highly regarded albums, Mighty Fine Dancin, Full Moon Over Dallas, Ain't Worried No More, Looky Here!, The Road and I Like The Way You Work It. Morgan even kept a high profile during some down time away from the band in 1994 by recording Let The Dogs Run, a highly acclaimed record that paired him with fellow Dallas guitarist Jim Suhler.


CD Review



Jontavious Willis Spectacular Class

Kind of Blue Music

"Spectacular Class" is the major label debut from Willis. Taj Mahal is the executive producer and Keb' Mo' produces and plays on the cd. Having these talented artists contribute is both a blessing and a curse. At times, the album sounds like a hybrid of the two musicians' music with Willis' voice not being heard.



I have seen Willis, and he is an incredibly gifted artist. He very charismatic and a lot of fun. Willis has an old-school feel. I wish more of this live touch were present on this cd.

Having said that, this is still a very good recording. The cd is very short with the ten originals coming in at just over 30 minutes.

I like the opening cut, "Low Down Blues". It has a Muddy Waters vibe to it. My favorite song is "Daddy's Dough". It is stripped down with Willis singing and playing acoustic guitar and with some fine Sonny Boy the first styled harp supplied by Andrew Alli. This is the old style blues I was hoping for more of.

This is a nice effort that will be enjoyed by most blues enthusiasts. I hope that on Willis' next album he gives us more of the basic blues I have heard from him in concert.
