

Braille Blues Daddy Bryan Lee and the Blues Power Band

Thursday, November 29th, 5:30pm • The 21st Saloon

Eric Clapton once said, "Bryan Lee is one of the best Blues Men I have ever heard." Born on March 16, 1943 in Two Rivers, Wisconsin, Bryan Lee lost his eye sight and was legally blind by the age of eight. Bryan Lee had an avid interest in early Rock and Roll Music and Blues Music, was fostered through the 1950's late night listening sessions from the Nashville Music radio stations such as WLAC-AM, This is where Lee was first introduced to the sounds of Elmore James, T-Bone



Bryan, stay with this. One day you will be a living legend."

- I went home and I cried" says Lee. Although his accep-

tance in the Chicago Blues Scene didn't come until later



in his career, Bryan Lee is now great friends with Buddy Guy and packs the Legend's house every time up. He has also played and toured with another local, Lonnie Brooks. This period also had him on tour with the late great Albert King, who has influenced many of todays and past blues greats. The late 1970's had Bryan fall in love with Music of New Orleans and eventually moved to the Crescent City in the early 1982. Bryan Lee has been a fixture of the French Quarter Music scene ever

since his arrival. His guitar brings the Chicago styled blues of Luther Allison, as well as Albert King and Albert Collins, down to the Crescent City.

What's New with BluesEdâ


Latest Gigs and News

Wanda Jackson toured regularly, was twice nominated for a Grammy, and was a big attraction in Las Vegas from the mid-'50s into the '70s. She continues to tour all over the world to sold out venues. In 2009 Wanda was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. Bob Dylan, Elvis Costello, and Bruce Springsteen were just a few of the high-profile artists that encouraged the Hall to induct the Queen over the last few years. That year it was also announced that Jackson would start work on new recordings with Jack White. The resulting album, The Party Ain't Over, was released on January 25, 2011. It included a cover of the Bob Dylan rockabilly song, "Thunder on the Mountain" as well as a fiery cover of Amy Winehouse's hit song "You Know I'm No Good". "The Party Ain't Over" was well-received by many critics and fans all over the world.





The 44's are a Los Angeles-based band who play blues-roots-rock music. The 44's are one the brightest rising stars on the American blues roots scene. Make no mistake about it. The raw rough and tough sounds generated by these four expert musicians during live performances and in the making of their Sophomore album Americana, on the Rip Cat label, demands to be heard by Blues music fans World Wide.



The 44's seem to be literally exploding across the Blues scene as a fully formed and functional unit commanding audiences with their in your face, yet highly contagious musical sound. Their first Release "Boogie Disease", Was self produced for \$800 with the Help of Guitar Great Kid Ramos (The Fabulous



Thunderbirds, The Mannish Boys) and was quickly snatched up and issued on Rip Cat Records, hitting a peak position of No. 12 on the national Living Blues radio charts and No.2 on BB King Bluesville Sirius/XM Satellite Radio. Critical praise and industry recognition from the blues community soon followed. American Blues News Awarded the Band with The Best Blues Band of 2011 and Blues Under-

ground Network Awarded the Band with Best Debut Album.

They play vintage instruments and channel a blues style of days past, but there is a distinct Rawness to this blues award winning quartet. Each band member is in fine form. Johnny Main grounds his outstanding singing and guitar playing in real experience—his talent's as honest as the day is long. Tex Nakamura has forged his own stirring voice from studying Little Walter and other legendary harmonica mentors. Bassist Mike Turturro with his Gut String Bass and drummer J. R. Lozano's Vintage Ludwig Kit are as solid a team as any you'll hear, calibrating rhythmic flow with alertness and intelligence, never calling undue attention to themselves. For their one–of–a-kind blues, The 44's successfully mine the tension.

Kid Ramos say's of his experience with The 44's "They play like their life depends on it and you can quote me" American Blues News Says "One of the Hardest working, hardest playing blues outfits anywhere."

Touring Non-stop since 2010, they've garnered a whole new generation of first-time young blues- roots fans, as well as older ones who recognize the talents of these four musicians. The 44's are at the top of their game and with the much anticipated Sophomore Release "Americana" on Rip Cat Records. They have brought together a top notch cast of characters. Kid Ramos joins the band in the producer's chair and Guest Guitar

Appearances. The Mixing Chair is being filled by the Legendary David Z (Credits Include Buddy Guy, Etta James, John Mayall).

The 44's were awarded the hardest working band of 2011 for a reason. Playing 200 Club and festival Dates in 2011. They will be continuing the same in 2012 in support of "Americana".



Thanks for your body of work Magic, and here is too many more days just like today!



























CD Reviews



Michael Burks · Show Of Strength

Alligator

I just got my copy of the newest Michael Burks CD, "Show Of Strength," in the mail today. The first pass through, I lis-

tened with mixed emotions. It is so hard to imagine that this will be his last. The people at Alligator said they were going to market this CD as it was intended to be, and not as some kind of final tribute. I will find it difficult to review it in the same way.

"Show of Strength" is a showcase for Michael Burks' virtuosity and his style in delivering modern electric guitar driven delta blues. His guitar work

here, as always, is slashing and raw on one track and soft and musical on the next. His deep and powerful vocals are heartfelt and emotive. The band is primarily his normal touring group of Wayne Sharp on keyboards, Terrance Grayson on bass, and Chuck "Popcorn" Lauden on drums. Michael is credited as a co-writer for five of the twelve tracks.

Mac Arnold's Blues Revival



Blues Revival was recorded live at the Grey Eagle Club in Asherville, NC on April 28, 2010 to kick off the 4th Annual Corn Bread & Collard Greens Festival, a benefit for Mac's ICANDOANYTHING Foundation.

Mac was a long time 60's and 70's bass player for Muddy Waters, A.C. Reed, Buddy Guy, and Tyrone Davis. He then formed his own group "Plate Full O'Blues". If you like old time Chicago blues, the first five tracks are a treat with original songs by Mac and his band like "Gitty Up"," Back Bone and Gristle" about growing up young in Mississippi, "True to You", "Drivin' Wheel", and my favorite "Ghetto Blue", about Mac's days playing with Muddy and Buddy in Chicago.

The second five tracks were done by a collection of musicians who made up the "Muddy Waters' Reunion Band"; Mac on bass, "Steady Rollin" Bob Margolin on lead guitar, "Fabulous" Kim Wilson of the Thunderbirds on harmonica, and Willie "Big Eyes" Smith from Mac's band on drums. Sadly Willie passed away soon after the making of this CD. Mac sings lead on Track 6 "Screamin' and Cryin'" and a great rendition of "Got My Mojo Workin'" on Track 10. Track 7 "Sloppy Drunk" was my least favorite. Track 8 was my favorite "Love Attack" sung by Kim Wilson. Track 9 Willie sings lead on "Big Boss Man".

If you like old Chicago blues, great instrumentals, and helping a worthy cause I recommend buying this CD because you can never have too much Blues in your music collection.

The CD opens with an attention grabbing guitar intro to **Count On You** - as in "I can always count on you to let me down". It is an up-tempo song with Michael's voice and

guitar, coupled with Wayne's B3 organ backing, guaranteeing that once they have your attention they keep it. It is followed by the slow, intimate and danceable **Take a Chance On Me, Baby**. The blending of the instruments with Michael's vocal reminding you of just how tight a group they were. Next comes **Storm Warning**, another power ballad, followed by a fun and funky tune - **Can You Read Between The Lines**.

This really is a marvelous album with too many highlights to detail. But, if you go to the closing track you will find the best. It is the eerily predictive "Feel Like Going Home". It was written and originally recorded by country music star Charlie Rich. Its gospel feel and the prophetic lyrics of the chorus left me with a very uneasy feeling – "Lord I feel like going home/I tried and I failed and I'm tired and weary/And everything I done was wrong/And I feel like going home."

These words are clear and straight forward but anything but accurate. Michael Burks did a lot of things "right" in his life. The man and his music are, and will be, missed.

Zac Harmon • Music Is Medicine Urban Eagle

Originally hailing from Jackson, Mississippi, Zac Harmon was raised where the blues began. He plays a sort of soul/blues not unlike Johnny Rawls- a favorite of mine. Harmon is reminiscent of the great Stax and Atlantic artists of the '60's and '70's, but is very much a contemporary musician.



"Music Is Medicine" is a very entertaining cd. Harmon sings in a soulful tenor. He is an excellent guitarist playing in a restrained manner that is nuanced without a lot of histrionics. He wrote, or co-wrote, all of the eleven songs.

"I'd Rather Be With You" is an uplifting song that has a light reggae feel. "Blue Pill Thrill" is a contemporary song, I really like, that is about – you know what it's about! Another song I enjoyed is an up tempo soul tune titled "Miss American Girl". "Running From the Devil" has some very cool keyboards. The song has the familiar theme of a bluesman's temptations.

Zac Harmon has produced another winner that should appeal to listeners that have a penchant for soul/blues. It is very tastefully done, and I predict that it will be on soul/blues award's lists at the end of the year.
