Award-winning blues and soul artist Janiva Magness, touring in support of her latest Alligator Records CD, STRONGER FOR IT, will give a live performance The at Zoo Bar in Lincoln on Wednesday, September 4, 2013. A charismatic vocalist and songwriter known for her electrifying live shows, Magness

is among the premier blues and R&B singers in the world today; her voice possesses an earthy, raw honesty born from her life experience. Magness recently won the 2013 Living Blues Readers' Award for Blues Artist Of The Year–Female and two 2013 Blues Music Awards: Contemporary Blues Female Artist Of The Year (her fourth win in this category) and Song Of The Year–I Won't Cry (by Janiva Magness and Dave Darling) from STRONGER FOR IT. She also won the 2009 Blues Music Award for B.B. King Entertainer Of The Year (she is only the second woman to ever win this award, Koko Taylor being the first).

It's been a good while since I have written an update concerning **David "Kid" Ramos'** condition. As you may know, Kid has spent the major part of the last 20 months battling a rare form of cancer. After undergoing radiation treatments, major surgery and intense Chemo Therapy, Kid is finally coming up on his last 3 five day sessions of Chemo. Although Kid is a positive and serious fighter and has been reaching deep for the faith to beat this extremely serious condition, the battle has been debilitating to say the least. The doctors have convinced Kid and his family that this is his only window of opportunity to try and kill this thing forever. So Kid fights on but it is becoming increasingly harder to recuperate from the Chemo and it takes longer each time.

We all pray that with the medical help Kid is receiving, his strong faith and his ability to fight, he will come out the other end of this disease and continue to live a good life supporting his family and kids through college. Kid has given us so much wonderful music over the years from his early days with The James Harman Band and Hollywood Fats, to his solo albums and work with his pal Lynwood Slim, The Fabulous Thunderbirds, Los Fabulocos and most recently The Mannish Boys. The Kinsey Report will play its energetic, rocky blues sound at the 21st Saloon Thursday concert series on September 26th.

The three Kinsey brothers; Ralph, Donald and Kenneth are the heart and soul of the band. The musicians are the sons of the late Chicago blues man, Lester "Big Daddy" Kinsey, and their careers as members of Big Daddy Kinsey's Fabulous Sons. The three brothers are joined by long time friend Nick Byrd, who also plays in Kenneth Kinsey's group, Funky Mojo Daddy.

The Gary, Ind. natives formed their band over 25 years ago. Donald is on guitar, Ralph kills the drums, Kenneth plays bass and Nick Byrd plays guitar; the entire group sings. Donald Kinsey, the leader of the group, said playing with his brothers has made all of them musically in sync with one another.

Donald Kinsey said artists such as The Three Kings, BB Freddie and Chuck Berry have a big influence on him. However, he said his church and his father are his two biggest inspirations. Donald Kinsey has an impressive resume in the music industry as he has played with artists like Peter Tosh, Albert King and reggae superstar Bob Marley.

The Kinsey Report has its unique sound down to a science in each of their five albums: "Edge of the City,"



Like the title of his irresistible new song (that dares you to not sing along on the chorus), the 31-year-old harp blower sounds "Too Good To Be True."

And like a magnet, Nemeth pulled in some major talent — none other than famed guitarists Elvin Bishop, Junior Watson and Anson Funderburgh — to assist in the studio for his two critically–acclaimed CDs on the Blind Pig label: 2007's Magic Touch and his 2009 release Love Me Tonight. Piano, organ, acoustic bass and a Memphis style horn section round out Nemeth's soulful vocals and harmonica on his discs.

When the blues world mourned the passing of Magic Slim this past spring at a tribute at Buddy Guy's Legends in Chicago, Bill Dahl of the *Chicago Blues Guide* wrote, "A Night For Magic' commenced in true torch-passing fashion with Slim's guitar-wielding son,



Shawn Holt, leading a second–generation lineup of Teardrops that proved conclusively he has what it takes to maintain the family legacy."

Magic Slim & the Teardrops have probably been nominated for the Blues Foundation's "Blues Band of the Year" award more times than any blues band playing today – including eight times in the last ten years. You can't become a Teardrop until Magic Slim says you're good enough. Shawn Holt became a Teardrop last year shortly before his dad died.

The high energy, hard-driving sound of the Teardrops is still alive and well with Shawn, a chip off the old block, fronting his old man's band. Shawn's booming vocal presence is more than a little reminiscent of his father's, and his guitar playing, while similar to Slim's, exhibits a broader mix of classic and contemporary influences. Combining a couple of his Dad's songs and other songs associated with him with five of his own originals, Shawn shows himself more than capable of leading the Teardrops into a new era.
