vocalist and performing artist. Most of all, a God fearing hard working family man. Castro has over 125 credits to his name and has played on over 50 national recordings





BluesEd Season Ends on a High Note

The BluesEd Season Finale at Sumtur Amphitheater on August 3 was a smashing success. All six BluesEd bands showed off their talents for an enthusiastic crowd on a beautiful summer evening. Eight seniors made their official last appearances with the bands as well; the eight seniors represented nearly 30 years of combined experience in the BluesEd program. Seven of the eight seniors (Grace Bydalek was receiving an award elsewhere after her performance) rounded out the evening with the Senior Jam.

The BluesEd bands have also been invited to the Walter Trout benefit on August 31. Some BluesEd bands will continue to perform throughout the fall.

Bill and Barb Fisher will be staying on for a third and final

year as BluesEd directors. They will be joined for the 2015 season by new codirectors Kevin and Chris Shouse. The Shouses will then take over the director position for 2016. The Shouses have been quite involved already, with Kevin running the sound at several of the all-band events. A big thanks to students, parents, directors, and clinicians who have worked hard in 2014 "Keeping the Blues Alive"!

Auditions will begin soon for the BluesEd 2015 season. If you have some talent for the Blues, or if you know a talented teen who would be a good fit for the program, contact Bill or Barb Fisher at admin@bluesed.com to find out about scheduling an audition. The 2015 season will kick off in January.

Janiva Magness' new album Original stretches the artistic boundaries of roots, rock and soul music. Its 11 songs seamlessly weave all three genres into a highly original approach defined by nakedly honest storytelling and the live-wire emotionalism of Magness' two-and-a-half octave range, buoyed by arrangements that effortlessly blend traditional sounds with edgy experimentation. "Let Me Breathe" opens Original with the amplified chunk of an electric guitar and the chime of a glockenspiel followed by the confessional lines, "Nobody's perfect/Nobody knows that more than me," setting a tone of frank self-assessment that resonates throughout the entire set, from the Stax-

influenced celebration of dignity "Mountain" to the wanton "I Need A Man" to the concluding "Standing," which confronts insecurity with true survivor's resolve.

Magness had much to overcome in making this adventurous album. Since 2010 she's endured the dissolution of a 17-year marriage, the deaths of eight friends and relatives including her foster mother, and an operation for a serious neck injury that could have ended her accolade-filled career. But *Original* finds the Los Angeles-based artist undefeated — turning in her finest recorded vocal performances, co-writing a majority of tracks for the first time and testing herself by taking risks along with her production foil Dave Darling, whose credits



include Glen Campbell, Brian Setzer, Mötley Crüe's Nikki Sixx and Stray Cats, and whose instincts compelled Magness to tap her deepest creative powers and led the songs to sonically unpredictable places. "I always want to push myself," she explains, "but this album demanded a high level of vulnerability to tell the absolute truth in every song, holding nothing back. It was frightening, at times, to be so raw in public. Dave drove me and even tricked me when he needed to. This is also an album that couldn't be made with another record company, because we needed to be able to go wherever we wanted musically to tell its stories."

So Magness parted ways with Alligator Records after a six-year period that included 2012's Stronger For It, 2010's The Devil Is An Angel Too and 2008's What Love Will Do, all produced by Darling. During her tenure on the internationally respected blues and roots imprint Magness also won her fourth Blues Music Award for "Contemporary Blues Female Artist of the Year" plus the "B.B. King Entertainer of the Year" and "Song of the Year" (for "I Won't Cry," co-written with Darling) awards, even as she became a fixture of the Americana music scene alongside such similar tough 'n' edgy roots-based artists as Sharon Jones and the Dap Kings and St. Paul and the Broken Bones.

JOHN PRIMER & THE REAL DEAL BLUES BAND

2013 Blues Music Awards Nominee for Traditional Blues Male Artist of the Year & Best Acoustic Album of the Year for Blues On Solid Ground

By any yardstick, Chicago guitarist John Primer has paid his dues. Prior to making The Real Deal for Mike Vernon's Atlantic-distributed Code Blue label, Primer spent 13 years as the ever-reliable rhythm guitarist with Magic Slim & the Teardrops. Before that, he filled the same role behind Chicago immortals Muddy Waters and Willie Dixon.

All that grounding has paid off handsomely for Primer. His sound is rooted in

the classic Windy City blues sound of decades past: roughedged and uncompromising and satisfying in the extreme. He's one of the last real traditionalists in town.

By the time he came to Chicago in 1963, Primer was thoroughly familiar with the lowdown sounds of Waters, Wolf, Jimmy Reed, B.B. and Albert King, and Elmore James. He fronted a West Side outfit for a while called the Maintainers, dishing out a mix of soul and blues before joining the house band at the Southside blues mecca Theresa's Lounge for what ended up being a nine-year run. Elegant guitarist Sammy Lawhorn proved quite influential on Primer's maturing guitar approach during this period.

Always on the lookout for aspiring talent, Willie Dixon spirited him away for a 1979 gig in Mexico City. After a year or so as one of Dixon's All-Stars, Primer was recruited to join the last band of Muddy Waters, playing with the Chicago blues king until his 1983 death. Right after that, Primer




joined forces with Magic Slim; their styles interlocked so seamlessly that their partnership seemed like an eternal bond.

But Primer deserved his own share of the spotlight. In 1993, Michael Frank's Chicago-based Earwig logo issued Primer's debut domestic disc, Stuff You Got to Watch. It was a glorious return to the classic '50s Chicago sound, powered by Primer's uncommonly concise guitar work and gruff, no-nonsense vocals. With the

1995 emergence of The Real Deal — produced by Vernon and featuring all-star backing by harpist Billy Branch, pianist David Maxwell, and bassist Johnny B. Gayden, Primer's star appeared ready to ascend. He soon transferred back to the Wolf label for sets such as 1997's Cold Blooded Blues Man, 1998's Blues Behind Closed Doors, and 2000's It's a Blues Life.

"The carefully selected covers are songs that I have held





THE CHIRIS DUARIND GROUP

The 21st Saloon Sept. 11th, 6pm • \$12



Austin-based guitarist, songwriter, and singer Chris Duarte has often been compared with the late Stevie Ray Vaughan. It's heady stuff for the musician, who plays a rhythmic style of Texas blues-rock that is at times reminiscent of Vaughan's sound, and at other times reminiscent of Johnny Winter. The truth is, Duarte has his own sound that draws on elements of jazz, blues, and rock & roll. Although he is humbled by the comparisons with the late Vaughan, the San Antonio-raised musician began playing out in clubs there when he was 15 years old. After Duarte moved to Austin when he was 16, he

began taking his guitar playing much more seriously, and at that time, Vaughan was still around playing in Austin-area clubs. Duarte was one of those lucky few thousand who got to see Vaughan at the Continental Club before the late guitarist got his first break with David Bowie. After a short stint in an Austin jazz band, Duarte joined Bobby Mack & Night Train and began getting heavily into blues at that point. He traveled all over Texas with that band before a big break came his way in 1994, when New York-based Silvertone Records released his critically praised debut album, Texas Sugar/ Strat Magik. Tailspin Headwhack followed in 1997 and Love Is Greater Than Me appeared three years later. Romp from 2003 featured a cover version of Bob Dylan's "One More Cup" and was followed by the 2007 album Blue Velocity, 2008's Vantage Point, 2009's 396 and 2010's Infinite Energy. My Soul Alone showed up early in 2013.


SEEKING BSO MEMBERSHIP COORDINATOR

Deanna Bogart · Just A Wish Away

Blind Pig Records

For those who might not be familiar with Deanna Bogart, she is a singer, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist with super star, pro level chops on both keyboards and saxophone. She is excellent with her own band and is the consummate sideman for other projects. Two of her side jobs that immediately come to my mind are her performances with The Blues Broads and Tommy Castro's Legendary Rhythm and Blues Review.

"Just A Wish Away" is a genre-busting collection of performances that offer a taste of her prowess in a lot of styles. Deanna wrote seven of the eleven tracks. She has pulled together a fine group (or actually several fine groups) of musicians for this recording

The CD opens with a "country rock" song **If It's Gonna Be Like This**. It is followed by a horn enhanced trip to New Orleans for **Fine By Me If It's Good Bayou**. Track three is the soft country ballad **If You Have Crying Eyes** penned by J D Souther. And so the musical buffet continues through the 46 minutes – a horn-rich, jazz-infused **Collarbone** followed by Stevie Ray Vaughan's **Tightrope**.

While it may seem like you could suffer from whiplash from the rapid changes in direction, the quality of the songs, the artists and the tone of the arrangements hold it all together. Just forget about trying to classify this recording by which


