In January 2018, The Keeshea Pratt Band won 1st place in the band division of the 34th Annual International Blues Challenge (IBC) held in Memphis, TN. The polished, professional, soul-stirring, toe-tapping performances assured the judges that The Keeshea Pratt Band was primed and ready to headline major festivals and concert stages as a noteworthy authority on the blues scene, nationally and internationally.

BRANDON MILLER BAND



Music has always been a part of Brandon Miller's life. From an early age, his dad would let him explore his record collection of Led Zeppelin, Genesis, Aerosmith and other classic rock legends. Miller spent countless days and nights trying to recreate the sounds of his musical heroes. After sculpting his sound for years, he formed the Brandon Miller Band, a powerful, guitar-driven blues-rock trio. Having released two, full-length albums and sharing the stage with artists like Jonny Lang, Foghat, Night Ranger and Eddie Money; Brandon Miller brings a fiery passion to the guitar that is unlike any other.

Brandon grew up listening to classic rock from the 60s and 70s because of his parents love for music. Listening to the rock n roll stories of disc jockeys from a famous Kansas City radio station just stirred the fire of his love for music even more. When he first began elementary school, his older brother had begun playing guitar. Brandon would sneak into his brothers room to grab his guitar just to play around with it. Driving his brother mad because of his always wanting to play, Brandon received his first guitar for Christmas when he was seven. His love for music quickly turned to dedication and devotion after he started attending concerts at a very young age. Seeing idols such as Kenny Wayne Shepherd, Eric Clapton, Joe Bonamassa, Tom Petty, Aerosmith, KISS, Rush, Fleetwood Mac, and Lynyrd Skynyrd, he wanted to take it to the next level of playing. He was learning very quickly and could start playing songs he was listening to. However, when he was around the age of 11, his frustration began to show. He couldn't recreate the solos and difficult guitar work which made him sit his guitar down and didn't want to touch it. He didn't play as much as what he used to and the music bug hadn't completely bit him yet.

Shortly after he turned thirteen in seventh grade, the music bug bit him deeply and over the summer his talent exploded. He would sit and practice for hours upon hours. Some days he would practice up to ten hours, and soon he was recreating what before he couldn't. He began going to blues jam sessions around Kansas City where he began to gain popularity with his audiences in large part due to his young age and immense talent. Quickly he realized that his age always presented some problems when clubs and bars would not let him into play until they witnessed his precocious ability first hand. At these jams, he met some of the most influential musicians in his career. With these musicians, he discovered his true love blues. He could be found during his middle school years not listening to what was popular at school dances or on the pop radio stations, but listening to legendary blues artists such as Robert Johnson, Albert King, Freddie King, Howlin Wolf, Muddy Waters, John Lee Hooker, and many more. One artist stuck out the most, Stevie Ray Vaughan. Listening to how he put all of his emotions into his playing inspired Brandon to do the same to spread the blues and bring it back to Kansas City.

Over the next few years, audiences would come from throughout the Kansas City area to see this young gui-



tar-slinger play the blues. He was playing every weekend and spreading his music and the Blues in particular. After achieving popularity, he experienced the unique opportunity to perform at Verizon Wireless Amphitheater prior to such acts as Aerosmith, Def Leppard, Motley Crue, and Journey as well as share the stage with Eddie Money at the Uptown Theater, and open for national touring acts Jonny Lang, Royal Southern Brotherhood, Leann Womack and Jo Dee Mesina.

Brandon currently performs with his own band, Brandon Miller Band, as well as the Danielle Nicole Band.

GUY KING

2017 Blues Music Award Nominee Guy King's music is fresh and unique while maintaining a strong link to the musical masters that came before him. His natural musical abilities and his one of a kind blend of Blues, Jazz, Soul, and R&B, are some of what makes Guy King so special in the music world.

Born and raised in a small rural town in Israel, Guy first arrived in the US, on tour at the age of 16. Five year later he returned to the United States. After a short stay in Memphis and a stint in New Orleans, Guy headed North to Chicago in pursuit of greater things and a musical career.

In Chicago, Guy quickly gained recognition, and joined Willie Kent's band, serving as his lead guitarist and band leader for a period of six years, until Kent's passing in 2006, when Guy started his solo career, performing at the city's top venues, such as: Buddy Guy's Legends, Andy's Jazz Club, House of Blues, The Green Mill, S.P.A.C.E., B.L.U.E.S., Rosa's Lounge and others.

Playing at a pace of 250–300 shows a year; Guy had the pleasure and honor of opening the shows of B.B. King, Buddy Guy, and touring the world; performing in Japan, France, Belgium, Switzerland, England, Italy, Mexico, Argentina, Chile and Brazil.

In 2009, Guy released his first solo album Livin' It which was very well received by the public and media alike, and that has opened the doors for two more albums since; I Am Who I Am And It Is What It Is and By Myself.

In 2015 Guy was signed by Chicago's Delmark Records to record TRUTH, which was released in February, 2016. TRUTH reached #1 at the Roots music report -Contemporary Blues Chart, #5 at the Living Blues Chart and have been receiving rave reviews worldwide.

Some of his appearances include the Montreal Jazz Festival, Chicago Blues Festival, King Biscuit Festival (Helena, Arkansas), Blues on the Fox, The Paramount Theatre, Polanco Blues Festival (Mexico City, Mexico), Mississippi Delta

Festival (Caxias Do Sul, Brazil), Basel Blues Festival (Switzerland) and many more.

Named as Chicago's Latest Royalty by Vintage Guitar Magazine, he continues to perform, write and record new material with an ear sensibly tilted toward producing great music: taking the varied music he loves and recasting it in new directions.

Guy King was nominated for a 2017 Blues Music Award in the "Best Emerging Artist Album" category.

ATTENTION ALL NEBRASKA MUSICIANS 9th Annual Nebraska Blues Challenge Entry Deadline September 6, 2019

It is time to register yourself, your duo, or your band to compete in the 9th Annual Nebraska Blues Challenge to compete for the opportunity to represent Nebraska at the 36th Annual International Blues Challenge Jan. 28 – Feb. 01, 2020 in Memphis, Tennessee!

The International Blues Challenge represents the worldwide search for those Blues Bands and Solo/Duo Blues Acts ready to perform on the international stage, yet just needing that extra big break. Each Affiliate of The Blues Foundation has the right to send a band and a solo/duo act to represent its organization at the IBC. Performing at the IBC's in Memphis is a fantastic opportunity for artists looking to further their professional careers by competing and networking with other artists and professionals. Artists competing in Memphis perform in front of blues label executives, promoters, booking agents, publicists and journalists.

The IBC is a judged "Battle of the Bands" in which competitors take the stage and play a short set judged by blues professionals. The acts are judged based on an established set of criteria. The Nebraska Blues Challenge will follow a very similar set of criteria.

Solo Artists/Duos & Bands interested in possibly competing should send an email to:

NebraskaBluesChallenge@OmahaBlues.com to obtain

all pertinent information and entry forms. The registration deadline is September 6, 2019.

Terry O'Halloran will be coordinating the NBC entries and competition events. All Solo, Duos, and Nebraska bands are eligible to enter. Acts must include one band member who is a current member of the Blues Society of Omaha. Additionally, all bands must have 50% of their members living in Nebraska, OR, within a 50-mile radius of Omaha.

The Blues Society of Omaha will be sending both a Solo/Duo winner AND a Blues winner to Memphis for the International Blues Challenge. Depending on the number of acts entering the competition, acts will compete on one, and possibly two, Sunday afternoons during October. Location, dates and performance times

will be announced soon after the deadline to enter (September 6, 2019).

The "Solo/Duo" winner will receive \$400 per person in travel expenses to compete in the 2020 International Blues Challenge in Memphis. The winning Blues "Band" will receive \$1500 for travel expenses to Memphis. As the Nebraska Blues Challenge Winner in the Band Competition, that act will also receive high exposure, paying gigs at both the Central Iowa Blues Society's Winter Blues Fest in Des Moines, the Soaring Wings Wine, Beer, Blues and Balloon Festival, and possibly more!

Industry professionals say that winning the International Blues Challenge gives the top band the equivalent of \$100,000 in blues industry awareness and publicity. Phoenix, AZ, bluesman Bob Corritore, Blues Music Award winner and Keeping the Blues Alive Award recipient, says of the IBC's "I once thought that going to the IBC's (International Blues Challenge) was all about the band competition, and perhaps for some it is. But, for a number of years now, I have chosen to attend to be a part of what I feel is the bigger picture of this event. To me this event is a family gathering of blues people who come to get the feeling of community that is so powerfully demonstrated in these few days. Everyone is there for the blues, and that's a powerful thing."



Don't try to snatch him back and hold him, he's a man on the move. John Németh continues to be one of the hottest stars in the musical firmament, touring nationally and internationally with his Memphis band, taking the world by storm.

Németh had already established himself

among the very top ranks of blues musicians and modern soul singers when he decided to break the mold with his new record, FEELIN' FREAKY. Németh fearlessly crushes all barriers of style and genre with an album of original songs that defies all the usual pigeonholes. Drawing from his strong influences in blues and R&B, as well as contemporary sounds in hip hop and rock & roll, John creates music that is personal as well as universal, and owes its origin to no one but John Németh. John's songs are groove and melody-driven, laced with thoughtful lyrics and nuanced humor, and cover themes from social issues of gun violence and class values to the pure hedonistic joy of dancing, sexuality and marijuana. He creates his songs from melodies and phrases he draws from the sounds of life, from early-morning Memphis songbirds to the din of the city. For this album John brought his new songs to his great touring band, the Blue Dreamers – Danny Banks on drums, Matthew Wilson on bass and guitar, and Johnny Rhodes on guitar - so they could hone the groove and finish building the album as a group. Under the simpatico guidance of Grammy-nominated producer Luther Dickinson (North Mississippi Allstars), FEELIN' FREAKY emerges as a modern personal masterpiece.

This album is a testament to power with taste and restraint, dramatic dynamics through the use of space. Németh's striking tenor vocals are already legendary, with a pitch-perfect purity of range and power that has drawn comparisons to soul singers from O.V. Wright to James Brown. He keeps that power under a tight leash, letting it rip at just the right places, using his voice to deliver and serve the song. Németh is also a very accomplished harmonica player who can boogie with the best of them, in various diatonic positions as well as on the mighty Chromatic harp, yet he plays relatively little on this record. What he plays are largely horn lines, trumpet-like staccato blasts that serve to create dramatic dynamic shifts, tension and release, all in service to the song, not the ego of the player. The few solos he delivers are concise, tasty and powerful.

From The President

To the Blues Society of Omaha,

To confirm to all what I have spoken about to a few, I have been found to have cancer in my neck and throat. It was caused by Human Papillomavirus, or HPV. HPV is a virus that over 80% of the human population carry. In most cases it passes through the body or lies dormant forever. Other times it finds an area to attack, in my instance, a tonsil. It is a highly treatable cancer and the cure rate is in the 85 to 90% range, which means no cancer after five years. I will take that percentage any day.

I was given the option of robotic surgery or radiation. Robotics offered a one time surgery with a quicker overall recovery than radiation so I chose that route. They do a trial run under anesthesia a few days before the actual operation is scheduled to make sure they can access the cancerous area, which in my case unfortunately they could not. The spot is at the base of my tongue and they could only get a partial visual, so I lost the chance to use robotics.

Radiation will begin sometime in early September. It will be Monday thru Friday with weekends off (woo hoo!) for a period of six weeks. Side effects will be similar to a sunburn on the outside of neck and inside of my throat. The treatment itself is under five minutes each day which is less than the time spent to get there. They have warned me that the treated areas will be very tender and I won't be able to shave my neck, so I guess I will soon have a full beard, cheeks, neck and all. No chemo is planned at this time so have dodged that bullet for now.

Many of you know I have been dealing with this lump on my neck for over 18 months or so. Went to family doctor that did a scan, then passed me to another doctor who did a scope who then passed me to another specialist for an ultrasound then to the Med Center for a needle biopsy, with a week to ten days in between each procedure. The last doctor stated that it was an infection, gave me some antibiotics and sent me on my way saying the lump would be gone in a few weeks. It never changed at all until I was directed to Boy's Town and Dr. Tempero. After an exam and a PET scan, the lump was removed within four days and a road map for recovery was put in place. All further treatments were at Estabrook Cancer Center at Methodist Hospital, where I have the highest regard for the doctors and staff. They have been very thorough and patient and have answered almost all our questions before we asked. Radiation will take place at Jennie Ed in Council Bluffs where they just installed a brand new state of the art machine about eighteen months ago.

So all in all, I am prepared to kick this cancer's ass. If you have any questions, ask. If you want to talk, we will. Hugs are always accepted.



Willie Buck may not have been born in Chicago, but he certainly sounds a lot like Chicago, at least the one made famous by the likes of fellow Mississippi natives such as Muddy Waters, Jimmy Reed, and Howlin' Wolf. While there are plenty of Chicago musicians who continue to help to preserve and move the genre in new directions, you can probably count on one or two hands those who still deliver the music true to the sound and style that Muddy and the other giants did, with the likes of Pinetop Perkins and Willie "Big Eyes" Smith, for example, having moved on to the big blues gig in the sky in recent years.

Regardless of what other living Bluesmen one might choose to include on such a short list (John Primer, Billy Branch, and real-life sons of the blues such as Lurrie Bell and Mud Morganfield being perhaps some of the most obvious selections), octogenarian Willie Buck also deserves a spot, still going strong some 50 years after he first began fronting his own bands on the Windy City scene.

With a smooth, straight ahead Chicago blues approach, Buck is one of those guys we could easily listen to all night, every night. But for those of us for whom moving to Chicago probably isn't much of a reality, it's a real treat to be able to get to hear Buck on recordings such as this most recent, titled after a Chicago street named in Buck's honor, Willie Buck Way (Delmark Records).

Buck was born in 1937 in the small town of Houston, Mississippi. When he was a boy, Willie spent most of his tme working at a local paper mill making \$5 during the day and honing his voice by night. He began his craft singing in the most popular form of the day, "Rock & Roll."

In spite of his vigor for the newly developing art form, his passions began to lean towards the more traditional sound of the delta... Blues. Believe you me, it didn't take him long to develop his sound. While still in "Da South," Willie performed on what became known as the "Chittlin Circuit" bouncing between Mississippi, Georgia, Louisiana, North & South Carolina, Tennessee and Texas. Shortly after developing a reputation, Willie did like a lot of Southerners during that time by migrating to Chicago in 1954.

Once here, he truly immersed himself in the Chicago Blues scene and became a real force in the "Maxwell Street" Blues Legacy which boasts of the raw blues talent that it has produced.

Southern Avenue Keep On

Concord Records

Soulsville, U.S.A. band Southern Avenue has released their much anticipated second cd, and it is even better than their initial effort. This Memphis group's music sounds like classic soul, but simultaneously sounds quite modern.



The music is a group effort with a wonderful synergy. There are

no long drawn out solos. They are an ensemble at its best. The word that keeps coming to mind for me is tasteful when trying to describe this cd.

Tierinii Jackson is the incredible lead singer with her sister Tikyra laying down the beat on drums and adding equally striking background vocals. I am also very impressed with guitarist Ori Naftaly. His playing is strong without being overpowering.

I really like the sixth cut on the cd intitled "Lucky". This song has some tremendous vocals. I am also fond of the seventh track "Jive". It has some outstanding guitar that is very nuanced, proving once again that you don't have to stuff as many notes as possible into a song to demonstate what an outstanding guitarist you are.

But truth be told, there are no weak songs on this cd. This should be on most lists for blues cd of the year. It is my favorite cd of the year so far.




THE BEGINNINGS
