A century ago, blues was born in the fields of the South, played on porches and in little backwoods bars by kerosene lamp. The times have changed, and it's a rare blues musician who grew up picking cotton and going home to learn to play by the light of a kerosene lamp.

Polly O'Keary certainly didn't. Well, that is, she didn't pick cotton. She picked apples. But she learned to read music by kerosene lamp, in a log cabin in a remote part of Washington State. She started playing in ex-pat bars in Mexico at 16, and Eastern Washington watering holes for rural farm workers at the age of 17. She dropped out of school with an 8th grade education, married a prison-bound man at the age of 18 and by the time she was 21 had logged more stage hours than most musicians twice her age. She'd drunk as much as a fair number of them as well.

At 28, upon seeing Jeff Healey at a friend's bar in Canada, she became obsessed with blues, studying and practicing the genre until carpel tunnel syndrome temporarily rendered her hands nearly immobile, and she quickly came to the attention of the Pacific Northwest blues scene with her powerful and emotional voice and her frenetic stage presence.

Today, she's a PhD student, a world-traveled bassist, one of Washington State's most highly-awarded female blues singers and songwriters (six-time Washington Blues Society Best Female Vocalist, four-time Best Blues Songwriter, etc.), doesn't drink at all, and no longer visits lovers in prisons. But her music reflects the life of a modern blues woman; she's seen the river rise and take everything more than once, and lived to laugh, sing, and write music about it.



Polly O'Keary is today's blues woman, rooted in tradition, but informed by the 21st Century. Pulling in influences from zydeco, country, funk, jazz, rockabilly, surf and rock and roll, she and her trio, Polly O'Keary and the Rhythm Method, bring a searing and joyful performance of today's blues to audiences across the U.S. and Canada.

Polly O'Keary and the Rhythm Method is the trio she built with her husband and drummer Tommy Cook, also a highly sought touring drummer and winner of the 2017 Washington Blues Society Blues Drummer award, with whom she shared rhythm section duties for international touring act Too Slim and the Taildraggers for four years.

Rounding out the trio is David Miller, who grew up listening to blues in Texas. At 17, then living in California, Miller met a piano player who was then working for Tommy Castro. The older musician recruited Miller to come play at several bars, and assured the young man that he could get him in, underage though he was. Miller became a regular in clubs in the Bay Area, sitting in with local and touring acts night after night. At 25, then living in San Luis Obispo, he assembled The Dave Miller Band, and for the next 18 years, he and the group went on to become one of Southern California's most popular blues bands, leading one reviewer to describe his "jaw-dropping guitar licks" and praise his "extraordinary mixture of inspiring virtuosity both vocally and instrumentally."

CURTIS SALGADO

The 2018 Blues Music Awards once again awarded the BMA for Soul Vocalist to Curtis Salgado, his ninth BMA award and seventeenth nomination overall.

Curtis Salgado released the first of his 10 solo albums in 1991. He joined Alligator Records in 2012, debuting with the award-winning, critically acclaimed SOUL SHOT followed by THE BEAUTIFUL LOWDOWN in 2016. The albums earned Salgado Blues Music Awards for B.B. King Entertainer Of The Year, Soul Blues Album Of The Year, Song Of The Year and Soul Blues Male Artist Of The Year, the same award he won in 2018.

His latest album (with guitarist Alan Hager), ROUGH CUT, is a stripped-down affair featuring a potent mix of newly written, timeless originals and carefully chosen blues covers. "We did it for the love of the music," says Salgado. "This is where our hearts are. These are deep songs that we love to play."

Born in Eugene, Oregon, Salgado found his calling early on. By his 20s he was already making a name for himself in Eugene's bar scene with his band The Nighthawks, and later as co-leader of The Robert Cray Band. Salgado quickly developed into a player and singer of remarkable depth, with vocal and musical influences including Otis Redding, O.V. Wright, Johnnie Taylor, Muddy Waters, Little Walter, Sonny Boy Williamson I and II, Lightnin' Hopkins, Howlin' Wolf, Otis Spann and Magic Sam.

In 1977, comedian/actor John Belushi was in Eugene film-

ing Animal House. During downtime from production, Belushi caught a typically ferocious Salgado performance and introduced himself during a break. Once Salgado started sharing some of his blues knowledge, a fast friendship grew. Salgado spent hours playing old records for Belushi, teaching him about blues and R&B. Belushi soaked up the music like a sponge and used his new awareness to portray "Joliet" Jake Blues in The Blues Brothers, first as a skit on Saturday Night Live and then a best-selling record album (which was dedicated to Curtis) and finally as a major motion picture (Cab Calloway's character was named Curtis as an homage).

Once Salgado joined forces with his friend Robert Cray and began playing together as The Robert Cray Band, Salgado found himself sharing stages with many of his heroes, including Muddy Waters, Bobby Bland, Albert Collins and Bonnie Raitt. After Salgado and Cray parted ways in 1982, Curtis went on to front Roomful Of Blues, singing and touring with them from 1984 through 1986. Back home in Oregon, he formed a new band, Curtis Salgado & The Stilettos, and was once again tearing it up on the club scene, where he honed his band to a razor's edge before releasing his first solo album in 1991. Salgado signed with Shanachie Records in 1999, putting out four critically acclaimed albums.

Along with his accolades, Salgado is no stranger to adversity. During his career, he has overcome multiple health challenges, battling back from liver cancer in 2006 and lung cancer in 2008 and 2012. In March 2017 he underwent quadruple bypass surgery. Now he is back on the road, revved up and firing on all cylinders, performing with his band as well as a duo with Hager. His resilience can be heard – and felt – on I Will Not Surrender, ROUGH CUT's lead track.

Salgado has performed at Portland's Waterfront Blues Festival, The Chicago Blues Festival, The Tampa Bay Blues Festival and Canada's Tremblant Blues Festival and on The Legendary Blues Cruise. He has also performed at The San Francisco Blues Festival, Memphis' Beale Street Music Festival, Denver's Mile High Blues Festival, as well as in Canada, England, throughout Europe, Brazil, Chile, Panama, The Philippines, Thailand and Hong Kong. Blues Revue, describing Salgado's performances, declares, "He starts at excellent before segueing into goose bumps, ecstasy, and finally nirvana."



AWARD WINNING BLUES ROCKER

The Toronto born singer/songwriter/guitarist, named 'One of the Top Ten Guitarists' in the world by Music Tasters Choice, has released 12 albums and performed concerts in 17 countries. In November 2017 Gomes won 'Best Musician (Live Performance)' at the 37th Annual European Blues Awards. Anthony has opened for B.B. King, Buddy Guy, Robert Plant, Alice Cooper, Joe Bonamassa, Heart, Jonny Lang, Sammy Hagar, 38 Special, Robert Cray, Kenny Wayne Shepherd and Gretchen Wilson.

Gomes has released eleven full length albums, five of the most recent have appeared in the TOP 10 on the BILLBOARD BLUES CHART, including LIVE (2008) which debuted at #1. His latest album, Electric Field Holler has earned highly acclaimed recognition; reaching #1 on both Roots Music Report's Blues Rock Chart and ReverbNation's Global Blues Chart.

Gomes' skill as a performer is matched by his knowledge of and dedication to blues history. He is an award winning blues history scholar, earning the University of Toronto's C.P. Stacey Prize for the highest overall academic grade point average by a history student. Anthony also completed his master's degree thesis on the racial and cultural evolution of blues music, graduating with high distinction. In 2014, his thesis was published and nominated for the Best



Blues Book of the Year by Blues 411.

Anthony founded the Music Is the Medicine Foundation in 2010. This non-profit organization is dedicated to changing the lives of others through the healing power of music. Through private donations and winning sizable grants from State Farm Insurance and CVS Pharmacy, the foundation has funded songwriting scholarships, offered music education programs, and donated musical instruments to those in need.

It is time to register your band to compete in the 8th Annual Nebraska Blues Challenge! Paul Gerber will be coordinating the NBC entries and competition events. Please send an email to nebraskablueschallenge@omahablues.com to obtain entry forms and all other specific information. Registration deadline will be September 9, 2018. All Nebraska bands are eligible to enter. Bands must include one band member who is a current member of the Blues Society of Omaha. In regards to Western Iowa bands, any Iowa band must have 50% of their members living in Nebraska OR within a 50-mile radius of Omaha.

Competition rounds will be held on Sunday afternoons during October at the Chrome Lounge in Omaha. Actual dates and performance times will be announced soon after the entry period is complete. All participating bands have the opportunity to build their fan base by showcasing their music to new listeners during the NBC performances. The BSO invites all live music fans to attend in support of their favorite band and to enjoy this celebration of Nebraska blues music and our amazingly talented musicians from the area. Highest scoring band from each preliminary round will advance to the final round. Highest scoring band overall will receive \$1500 in travel expense money to represent Nebraska at the 35th International Blues Challenge held January 22-26, 2019 in Memphis, Tennessee, on historic Beale Street.

Performing at the IBC's in Memphis is a huge opportunity for artists looking to further their professional career. The IBC is an annual event sponsored by the Blues Foundation and it has become the world's biggest blues gathering and the most respected showcase for blues musicians ready to be crowned from amongst other bands representing affiliated blues societies from around the world. Artists competing in Memphis perform in front of blues labels, promoters, booking agents, publicists and journalists. They also have the opportunity to network with other artists and professionals. The IBC is a judged "Battle of the Bands" in which competitors take the stage and play a short set judged by blues professionals. The acts are judged based on an established set of criteria. The Nebraska Blues Challenge will follow a similar set of criteria. Competing in the IBC's in Memphis can be a stepping stone for musicians serious about a professional career. Industry professionals say that winning the International Blues Challenge gives the top band the equivalent of \$100,000 in blues industry awareness and publicity. Phoenix, AZ, bluesman Bob Corritore, Blues Music Award winner and Keeping the Blues Alive Award recipient, says of the IBC's "I once thought that going to the IBC's (International Blues Challenge) was all about the band competition, and perhaps for some it is. But for a number of years now I have chosen to attend to be a part of what I feel is the bigger picture of this event. To me this event is a family gathering of blues people who come to get the feeling of community that is so powerfully demonstrated in these few days. THE CATE BROTHERS

Thursday, August 30th @6 pm (\$15 cover) • Chrome Lounge, Omaha



The Cate Brothers, identical twins Earl and Ernie (born Ernest), once exemplified the country-style rock and roll that flourished in the Ozark Mountains area of northwestern Arkansas, before adding rhythm and blues (R&B), soul, and funk to their approach in a distinctly unpretentious way.

The Cates have remained close to the northwestern Arkan-

sas clubs and festival activities, which revolve around the University of Arkansas (UA) in Fayetteville and have expanded to accommodate the booming regional commercial developments related to the growth in the area. But the Cates are also true to their musical roots in that theirs is a "country soul" unit, and they are masters of a kind of rhythmic eclecticism that is native to the cultural territory from which it emerged, bounded generationally by Bob Wills's western swing and the Band's blend of hillbilly simplicity and blues depth.

In 1970s, the Cates released four major-label albums (three on the Asylum label—a powerful force in rock music at the time—and one on Atlantic): Cate Bros. (1975), In One Eye and Out the Other (1976), Cate Bros. Band (1977), and Fire on the Tracks (1979). The group, which toured around the world, earned critical acclaim for its distinctive sound and a solid reputa—

tion for expert musicianship. Cate Bros. and In One Eye and Out the Other were produced by legendary Memphis, Tennessee, guitarist Steve Cropper, a member of Booker T. & the MG's and a mainstay of the celebrated Stax label throughout the company's 1960s heyday. Fire on the Tracks was produced by Tom Dowd, a renowned longtime producer and engineer for Atlantic Records.

During the 1970s and 1980s, the Cates toured nationally and internationally with the likes of Heart, Fleetwood Mac, and Queen. The Cates have earned a devoted following of their own and have continued to release albums, including Radioland (1995), Struck a Vein (1997), Cate Brothers Band Live (1999), and Play by the Rules (2004). These later albums have been described as hybrids of blues, rock, soul, and country.

Though they have never achieved the kind of far-flung success that was eventually accorded the Band (the Cates' most famous recording is probably "Union Man" from the 1975 Cate Bros. album), the Cates remain a well-respected band among their peers in the music world and have carried their style of classic rock into the twenty-first century.



Austin embraces a deliciously wide range of roots styles: She belts the blues with sass, swings nimbly on R&B, and fires off some rousing gospel. For good measure, she also shows she can take it uptown with a sultry, soulful ballad.

Maybe you saw her on Morgan Freeman's Blues Diva's on PBS? Or, you may have caught her singing live for a season opener for the WWE SmackDown with 6 million viewers? Six-time Minnesota Music Award Winner and WC Handy Best New Artist Nominee, Reneé Austin, calls her new music a mix of Soul/ Gospel/R&B with a hint of Texas. The Texas Hill Country raised multi-instrumentalist and singer-songwriter rose to national attention in 2003 with her first international release, "Sweet Talk" which included the spine-tingling duet "Pretend We Never Met" with 3-time Grammy Winner, fellow Texan and friend Delbert McClinton.

Austin released 3 CD's between 1997-2005: "Dancin' With Mr. Blue", "Sweet Talk" and "Right About Love", opening for respected artists such as Los Lobos, Delbert McClinton, Blues Traveler, Big Head Todd & The Monsters, Keb Mo and Robert Cray. Sadly, just two short weeks after the release of "Right About Love", Reneé's singing career was halted just as her star was rising. Tragedy struck when during a surgical procedure, Austin's left vocal nerve became paralyzed. Unable to sing or speak above a whisper, Austin began a new life without music.

But, after years of struggle and heartache, Austin experienced a series of true miracles and her voice has returned. Her new CD, "Songbirds & Angels", hit the streets April, 2018 with a sold-out Album Release show at the world renowned Dakota Jazz Club. She also just signed a worldwide digital distribution deal with The Orchard, a division of Sony Music. processed each new member application & renewal, reminded members when time to renew annual dues each


year, and handled the details that allow other volunteers to mail and email our monthly newsletter to current members.

JP Soars · Southbound I-95

SOARS HIGH PRODUCTIONS

This is Soars' fourth studio release. It has a generous fifteen tracks. There are a great many featured musicians, but Soars is definitely the focus.

Soars is a past winner of the prestigious Albert King Award. His influences are quite varied ranging from heavy metal to country. Soars is a student of the varied styles he incorporates and does not simply play the genre in a superficial manner.

Soars singing style would not sound out of place on the back porch of a Mississippi delta shack. His gravelly voice gives the blues songs a very authentic feel.

This is particularly true of the first number entitled Ain't No



Dania Beach that has a country blues flavor. The third cut, Southbound I-95, would not seem out of place on a Brian Setzer album with its jumping style. Terry Hanck contributes some wonderful sax on Shining Through the Dark. It has a very cool soul vibe. My favorite song is the instrumental Across the Desert. Lee Oskar adds some exceptional harp soloing to the tune.

This is a cd that will appeal to listeners that like a little variety to their music. There is

outstanding musicianship throughout. It will not be for the consumer that is a strict traditional blues enthusiast.
