JASON ELMORE & HOODOO WITCH

Based out of Dallas, TX, "Jason Elmore & Hoodoo Witch" is an original high-energy trio that blends hard-hitting rock, jump/swing blues, vintage soul/r&b, and traces of 60's country into a unique-but-familiar sound that maintains the essence of American roots music while simultaneously offering a fresh take on its various genres and sounds. Jason Elmore is uncommonly seamless in his ability to tailor his

performance to suit the venue and demographic, without compromising the integrity of the band's mission, which is to give 110% with every single performance, whether performing for a crowd of 2 or 2,000.

Having grown up with an obsession for all genres of western music, Elmore is remarkable in his ability to appeal to fans of any type of music with his virtuoso-level guitar playing, soulful and powerful old-school vocals, and keen sense of songwriting. It is common to see an artist excel at one of those three things, but Jason is uncanny in his ability to express himself with an original and unique voice as a guitarist, singer, and songwriter. All one needs to do is watch him play live one time in order to have a good understanding of how all of these different genres of music have a common thread when it comes to eliciting an emotional response from the listener and taking them to that special place where only the music exists and the troubles of the



world are temporarily put on hold.

The band released their 3rd full album, titled 'Champagne Velvet' in September 2016 on the Underworld Records label. The album debuted at #13 on the Billboard Blues Charts, #3 on the Roots Music Report blues charts, and held the #1 chart position on the Texas music chart for 6 consecutive weeks! It is currently receiving international acclaim

and airplay, as is the band's 2010 album "Upside Your Head" and 2013's "Tell You What", all of which showcase the band's eclectic sound and versatility. In October 2017, the Dallas Observer named Jason Elmore & Hoodoo Witch "best blues act" in their 'Best Of Dallas' series and the band was also voted "best blues act" at the Dallas Observer Music Awards in 2012. However, this is not a blues act in the traditional sense of the word. The band's sound is original and eclectic but is at times similar to 70's-era rock such as Cream, Led Zeppelin, Black Sabbath, and Grand Funk Railroad. They convey a fresh sense of excitement and fire that is uncommon in the contemporary blues scene. This is a high-energy act that excels at bringing unrestrained boogie to the party while simultaneously showcasing all 3 band members' mastery of instrument and voice. So get ready to groove with Jason Elmore & Hoodoo Witch, baby!! These boys can flat GET it!



DWAYNE DOPSIE AND THE ZYDECO HELLRAISERS

Dwayne (Dopsie) Rubin hails from one of the most influential Zydeco families in the world. Although inspired by tradition, Dwayne has developed his own high energy style that defies existing stereotypes and blazes a refreshingly distinct path for 21st century Zydeco music. This singer/songwriter and accordionist has performed all over the world since debuting his band, Dwayne Dopsie and the Zydeco Hellraisers, at age 19.

As a tribute to his late father, Rockin' Dopsie, Sr., Dwayne will record an album of his Dad's greatest zydeco hits. Dwayne and the Hellraisers are currently in the studio wrapping up their 6th studio album, a follow up to Up In Flames, their second album to be prenominated for a Grammy Award. The Louisiana native writes both the lyrics and music for his songs and describes the upcoming album as soulful with a touch of blues and old time zydeco feel. The new album will receive additional air time on Sirius XM satellite radio. The band plans to promote their album by touring both nationally and abroad and appearing on late night talk shows. 2015 will mark their 7th summer promotional tour in Eu-

rope, adding to the 70+ international festivals they have performed in the last 2 years.

Dwayne Dopsie grew up in Lafayette, Louisiana as well as four of the Hellraisers. Dwayne has created the perfect band of hand picked musicians. The washboard player, Paul Lafleur, possesses skill and timing that are unmatched, making him a true musician, not just a marvel holding a washboard. Combined, the band has over 100 years of experience playing Zydeco music and it shows in every performance. The energy, true talent, and exuberance that Dwayne Dopsie and the Zydeco Hellraisers emit from stage makes it obvious that there is no competition for this band.

Not only has Dwayne's band mastered zydeco music, they also add a bit of rhythm and blues, funk, rock and roll, reggae and pop to their performances, making them a very versatile choice for any audience. This Indie artist was named "The Hottest Accordionist" in America for his ability to both work the crowd and pump out musical harmony in grandiose fashion. Dwayne doesn't confine himself to the stage; he interacts with the crowd, blurring the barrier between performer and audience. Audiences jump to their feet energized by Dwayne's musical innovation, charismatic performance and sheer, raw talent. His ability to capture the imagination, heart and soul of his audience makes Dwayne one of today's most dynamic performers.



Over the past 10 years, Seth Walker has become recognized as one of the most revered modern roots artists in the United States, a 3D talent with a gift for showcasing melody and lyric through his rich, Gospel-drenched, Southern-inflected voice, supported by a true-blue knack for getting around on the guitar. Walker's latest studio album, Gotta Get Back, (produced by Jano Rix of The Wood Brothers), is yet another masterwork that further enhances the artist's reputation.







King, Robert Cray, Jimmie Vaughan, and Aaron Neville, Walker has established himself in the music world as a unique and compelling performer.

Walker impressed Taj Majal when he opened up for the blues legend in 2005. "He's playing some hip music, with changes and soul" he commented. "A little white Ray Charles."

The rest is history.

Seth Walker has released seven albums between 1997 and 2015, breaking into the Top 20 on the Americana charts and receiving praise from NPR, American Songwriter, No Depression and Blues Revue, among others.

In addition to extensive recording and songwriting pursuits, Walker is constantly touring and performing at venues and festivals around the world. Along with headline shows, he has opened for The Mavericks, The Wood Brothers, Raul Malo, Paul Thorn and Ruthie Foster, among others.

A superb songwriter and great storyteller, Jones plays what he knows and lives...and enjoys every minute of it, a fact that is evident in every note."

Dennis's feet are firmly rooted in the past, yet his heart and soul are connected to the present. He writes songs that seamlessly blend the best of both worlds, presenting a unique and contemporary style of American rock and blues.

Born and raised in Baltimore, Maryland, and now based in Los Angeles, Jones continues to pursue his musical goal of becoming a top entertainer in his field. With five well regarded CD releases to date, Jones' vision has never been more in focus.

Dennis Jones also writes songs for other notable artists; he wrote Temporary Man for Guitar Shorty's 2010 Alligator release, Bare Knuckle.

In January, 2014, Dennis Jones was honored to accept an invitation from the Blues Foundation to serve as a Judge at the International Blues Competition in Memphis, TN, as well as to host its annual All Star Jam on Beale St. Previously, in May, 2012, Dennis served as an onstage Awards Presenter at the Blues Music Awards. Back in 2004, Dennis Jones played in the Zac Harmon Band when they won the IBC!

Dennis Jones Band performances included the Pacific Coast Legendary Rhythm & Blues Cruise, Simi Valley Cajun & Blues Festival, San Marcos Rock, Blues & BBQ, Folsom Rhythm & Brews Festival, and Mammoth Bluesapalooza Festival.

It had to be a train. The name of Victor Wainwright's new band – and the sleeve image of their debut album – is also the most fitting of metaphors. In music folklore, the train might have associations with the freight-hopping bluesmen of yore, but with this restless boogie-woogie innovator stoking the furnace, this latest project is a charging locomotive – surging forward, crashing through boundaries of genre, sweeping up fresh sounds and clattering headlong past the doubters. As the man himself hollers in the ivory-pounding title track: "If you wanna boogie get aboard this train/Get yourself a ticket or get out of the way..."

At a sweet-spot in his career, where most established stars

would rest on their laurels, Victor Wainwright & The Train instead rips up all that has gone before. These twelve tracks are originals in every sense, written by Wainwright, pricking up ears in a sterile music industry and stretching the concept of roots in bold directions. "I wanted to write this new music mostly on my own," he explains, "as it was coming and speaking to me. I believe that for roots music to grow, and reach out to new audiences, we have to push it forward."

The result is an album that walks a tight-rope between scholarly respect and anarchic irreverence. You'll hear Wainwright twist boogie-woogie tradition on barrel-house thrillers like Healing and Boogie Depression, both driven by his visceral piano style. But you'll also hear him fearlessly explore the gamut of genre, from the Latin flavors and New Orleans horns of Wiltshire Grave, to the mellow near-psychedelia of Sunshine.

It's a musical cocktail served up by Wainwright's inimitable gravel-flecked vocal. His words can be hilarious, as on I'll Start Tomorrow, on which he postpones his doc-



tor's clean-living advice. But they can also be heartfelt, on the gospel-tinged kiss-off of That's Love To Me. "I've tried to write songs that remind us to love ourselves," he considers. "It doesn't matter who voted for who, what your religion is, who you love..."

On this white-knuckle ride, only The Train could keep the material on the tracks. "I ended up with a hit-squad of downright amazing musicians," he reflects, "that

shared my curiosity for all corners of the roots genre. We wanted to capture how we feel performing, right smack-dab on this record, and I believe we've done that. Now I just try to keep up."

In truth, Wainwright has always been an artist that sets the pace. Born into a musical family in Savannah, Georgia, the formative influence of his father's vocals and grandfather's rolling boogie-woogie piano compelled him into a life of music. By 2005, he'd announced his talent with solo debut, Piana' From Savannah, while his central role in Southern Hospitality and partnership with Stephen Dees in WildRoots has seen him ignite stages and stereos for over a decade. "Looking back on your career is a tough thing to do," he says. "Challenges are many, and frequent, but when you get it together, it can also be extremely rewarding."



AJ Ghent plays lap steel, pedal steel, slide, and resonator guitar. In fact, Ghent plays all the instruments- except the percussion - on this cd. The songs are sparse and basic with no bass or drums. It is designed to push the limits of the blues, as the title implies.

This neo blues approach is very interesting. Ghent has five originals and one cover on this cd. The cover is Junior Kimbrough's "Do the Rump". This is a hypnotic groove that I

like a great deal. The album is a mix of funk, blues, soul, and rock.

Another song I enjoy is the final cut entitled "Gonna Rock". It has a bit of a rocking early rock and roll vibe. It exemplifies the diversity of this project.

This cd will not be for everyone. It does not fit neatly into a category, but for those listeners that are more adventurous, it might be worth a try.
