Travis the Band

In the summer of 1971 Albert "Red" Travis, Instrumental Music Director at Omaha South High School, had the idea of forming

a brass rock band that could perform covers of some of the most contemporary music of the time. Artists like Chicago, Blood Sweat and Tears, Tower of Power, Earth Wind and Fire, Cold Blood, Wayne Cochran, Chase and many more.

His idea stemmed from the current OPS curriculum of the times in modular scheduling. This type of scheduling allowed students numerous free "mods", during the course of the school day. The format provided students to spend their free time in classes that they enjoyed and truly had a passion for. Hence, students that had a passion for music spent the majority of their free mods in the band room. Mr Travis had noticed that many of his students had developed far and beyond what the average instrumental music student would have, primarily based on the additional time they were spending developing their prowess on their particular instruments.

Mr. Travis had the perfect training grounds for testing his idea. He utilized his Stage/Lab band, the equivalent of the Big Bands of previous generations. The difference was, that instead of focusing the majority of the repertoire on the classics of Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Stan Kenton and others, he arranged and scored the charts of the modern contemporary artists aforementioned. The proof of his successful idea was affirmed by the recognition of the OSHS Stage band in state wide competitions from 1970 through 74. It became one of the most decorated Stage Band projects in Nebraska High School History.

Essentially, the Stage Band became the recruiting pool and audition process for the Brass Rock Band Travis. Many of the original members came from classes dating from 1969 through 1980.

TRAVIS Generation 1, consisted of 9 members, Bass, Guitar, Drums, 4 trumpets, tenor sax, and Front person and Vocalist. Mr Travis was undecided as to who would front the band. He held auditions with very talented males and females and when consulting with the bands agent Bob Belitz and some of the senior members, it was determined that a female would front the group.

TRAVIS assembled approximately 90 minutes

of music and was entered into the 1972 Omaha Battle of the Bands, an open air event in downtown Omaha featuring some of the most popular area bands of the era. This was Travis's first ever performance and its inaugural opening as a new Omaha area band. At the end of the day, the public voted Travis as the winner of the competition and thus began a 10 year history in the Omaha music scene.

ROMANCE WITH THE JUKEBOX

"There she is again standing over by the record machine. Lookin' like a model on the cover of a magazine." Those lyrics from Chuck Berry's "Little Queenie" go back to 1959, a mere 62 years ago. I'm guessing the jukebox was as fascinating as the girl Chuck had his eye on. The evolution of the jukebox began in 1890 with the invention of a "nickel-in-the-slot phonograph". In 1918 an apparatus that automatically changed records was patented. Jukeboxes produced in the late 1920's were wide and bulky. Seeburg's "Audiophone" machine had eight sepa-

rate turntables and their "Selectophone" machine had 10 turntables. Each turntable would hold a 78 rpm record.

Around 1940 the word "jukebox" came into use in the United States, apparently derived from the term "juke joint". The production of jukeboxes came to a near halt when the United States entered World War II, after the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. Jukeboxes were considered "nonessential", as metal and plastic were needed for the war effort. Rock-Ola and Wurlitzer produced models in 1942 and a limited number of those models exist today. The 1942 Rock-Ola "President" is the rarest. Only one is known to exist and its value is close to \$150,000.



Production of jukeboxes resumed in 1946 and that's when the fun

began. Some models had visual attractions such as bubbles, waves, and circles of changing color that came on when the music started. Wallboxes

became popular, such as the one shown from Leo's Diner in the Benson area of Omaha. What could be better than being able to order music from your table or booth?

In 1950, Seeburg introduced the first commercial jukebox, designed to play 45 rpm vinyl records. The revolutionary 45's were first rolled out in 1949. Their seven-inch size meant more storage capability for a jukebox. Up to 100 45's could be stored, which meant 200 song selections. Seeburg eventually settled on 50 or 80 per machine.



As expected, technology continued to improve. The importance of the "traditional" jukebox started its decline. Portable radios and portable cassette tape decks made it easy for people to have music with them, wherever they were. Compact Disc jukeboxes provided a bit of a revival, and that was followed by digital jukeboxes, using an MP3 format. Now you are just a few clicks away from hearing your favorite music on your computer, cell phone, or personal listening device.

I like the convenience of listening to music today, but the old-time jukeboxes evoke

special memories. As a kid I remember asking my parents or my grandparents for a quarter to play three songs on the jukebox. Some of my favorites from my pre-teen years included Bobbie Gentry's "Ode to Billie Joe", The Drifters' "Under The Boardwalk", "Lemon Tree" by Trini Lopez, and the ever popular "Down In The Boondocks" by Billy Joe Royal. The list could go on forever.

No doubt you have your own special jukebox memories. As the saying goes, "music is the medicine". It can cure what ails you. Foghat's Lonesome Dave Peverett says it best in the song "Stone Blue". When he was blue and needed some therapy, this was his solution, "Put on a 45 and let the needle ride, jukebox jumps and I'll be satisfied."



Johnny Rawls is a soul blues legend. In fact, the term "soul blues" was invented to describe his music. With a career spanning more than 50 years, he's done it all. He's an internationally recognized recording artist, music producer, and songwriter who tours extensively throughout North America and overseas.

The Blues Music Awards, Blues Blast Awards, Living

Blues Awards, and the W. C. Handy Awards have all acknoawledged Johnny with multiple awards and nominations, including Soul Blues Album of the Year and Soul Blues Artist of the Year. Living Blues Magazine described him as a "soulblues renaissance man" when he was featured on the cover in 2002. Johnny is honored to be mentioned on two markers along the Mississippi Blues Trail – one in Hattiesburg, MS marking the Hi-Hat Club, and another in Rocklin ME marking the migration of blues from Mississippi to Maine.

The Blues Music Awards (and its predecessor, the W.C. Handy Awards) frequently recognize Johnny's work. To date, ten of Johnny's albums have been nominated for Soul Blues Album of the Year, with "I'm Still Around" winning in 2019 and "Ace of Spades" winning in 2010. Johnny has been nominated for Soul Blues Male Artist eleven times, and received one nomination for Song of the Year. Roots Music Report declared Johnny's 2017 release, "Waiting for the Train," one of the top 50 blues albums of the year. Johnny also has multiple nominations/awards from Blues Blast Magazine and Living Blues Magazine.

Johnny is extremely proud to have won the Soul Blues Album of the year at the 2019 Blues Music Award for this release.

A true "road warrior," Johnny tours extensively throughout the US, and internationally, playing approximately 200 dates every year. He's performed at major blues festivals, including the Chicago Blues Festival and the Waterfront Blues Festival multiple times. Whether he's playing in a small intimate club or at a large blues festival, Johnny always delivers a high-energy show to the delight of audiences everywhere.
