

Chris O'Leary cut his teeth for six years as singer, harp player and front man for Levon Helm's Barnburners and seven years in the U.S. Marine Corps (infantry squad leader in the Gulf War) — you've got to be pretty tough and competent to handle either of those assignments, and Chris came through with flying colors.

International tours with the Barnburners and an extended musical residency in New Orleans' French Quarter bring a wealth of influences to his singing, playing and songwriting. The Chris O'Leary Band's 2010 VizzTone debut, **Mr. Used To Be**, garnered critical raves, international airplay, a prestigious Blues Music Award nomination, and a "Best New Artist Debut CD" victory at Chicago's Blues Blast Music Awards

Now, after two acclaimed studio albums, O'Leary and band are touring in support of their sizzling live album Live at Blues Now!

Chris has appeared on stage with: Legendary Rolling Stones sideman Bobby Keys, The Fabulous Thunderbirds, Jimmy Vivino, Jeff Healy, Dan Akroyd, Albert Lee, Dave Edmunds, Dave Maxwell and the great James Cotton to name just a few. Chris has also recorded with Bill Perry and Hubert Sumlin among others.

"Neon Highway Blues", Gary's latest release, carries its 11 tracks with the confidence and assuredness of a veteran, and the freshness of someone who's still in the process of

discovery and refinement — with the help of famous friends such as Eric Gales, Lance Lopez, Josh Smith and Hoey's 17-year-old son Ian Hoey. The release of "Neon Highway Blues" will, of course, take Gary Hoey back on the highways and byways for plenty of touring and playing, well, the blues — and more. He can't yet predict where the next road will take him, but Hoey is confident it will be an adventure.

In 2012, he produced and co-wrote The Queen Of Metal, Lita Ford's latest release "Living Like Runaway" for SPV records to rave reviews. As Music Director for Rock 'n' Roll Fantasy Camp, he's worked with legends like Joe Perry, Roger Daltrey, Yes, blues icon Johnny Winter, Robben Ford, Leslie West, and KISS drummer, Peter Criss. And he has toured and traded licks with the likes of Jeff Beck, Brian May of Queen, Ted Nugent, Joe Satriani, Steve Vai, Peter Frampton, and Dick Dale.

With a collection of 21 albums it's no wonder Gary Hoey is listed as one of

the top 100 guitarists of all time. The world renowned rock guitarist's first break came in 1987 when **Ozzy Osbourne** liked Hoey's tape enough to fly him to LA for an audition and encouraged him to move to the West Coast.

Whether he's playing scorching originals or classic rock covers, his solos are thrilling and reminiscent of Clapton or Stevie Ray in their fiery youth. One thing that remains consistent is Hoey's impassioned command of the guitar. He can attack his instrument with feral intensity and then play something very soft and achingly beautiful. This ability to mix feeling, phrasing, technique and tone is the true mark of a master guitarist.



As most artists will attest, the most unexpected circumstance can spark artistic inspiration. That's a fact that hasn't been lost on singer, songwriter and guitarist extraordinaire Albert Castiglia. With his latest album, the aptly named Masterpiece, he celebrates an unforeseen triumph — a connection with a daughter he never knew he had. The result is a work that's both personal and provocative all at the same time.

Castiglia calls this the most meaningful album he's ever made. "My daughter finding me and opening up my world to an additional family, including two grandchildren, brought out the deepest material I've ever created," he notes, "along with my wife, they were my muses." Indeed, songs such as "Keep On Swinging", "Masterpiece" and "Bring on the Rain" address the unexpected emotions that infused his psyche with the discovery of a family he never knew.

"Prior to my daughter finding me, my entire adult life felt incomplete," Castiglia reflects in the song "Bring On the Rain." "I never knew why I felt that way. I could never put my finger on it. Then when I discovered my daughter, my heart was suddenly overflowing."

The title track echoes the same sort of sentiment. "After my daughter and I connected for the first time, I submitted my DNA sample to the lab to confirm that I was indeed her father," Castiglia recalls. "I knew she was my kid the second I saw her picture, but my daughter wanted closure and by me taking the test, it would put all the speculation to rest. On the day my results came up positive, I wrote a letter to my daughter telling her how happy I was to be her father. At the end of the letter I wrote, 'I've been an artist for thirty years, but you're my masterpiece!' I ran with that line and made it the perfect song to express my love. As the lyric

says, I loved her before I even knew her."

Co-produced by longtime friend and colleague Mike Zito, and released on Zito's own label, Gulf Coast Records, on May 24th, the album also finds Castiglia reflecting on the disappointment and discontent that's gripped the nation in the past several years.

"I think blues is a wide open net," Castiglia once told a reporter. "There are a lot of different ways to do it...I've taken a lot of heat for what I do. Some people think I'm too edgy to be considered a blues artist. On the other hand, I don't think that people like Muddy Waters and Howlin' Wolf would have wanted me copying them and redoing their stuff. There's no point in doing that. They would want me to do my own stuff."



THREE-TIME MAPLE BLUES AWARD-NOMINATED GUITARIST, SINGER AND SONGWRITER

Toronto-based Chris Antonik was nominated for Best New Artist in 2011 at Canada's Maple Blues Awards after the release of his debut album, and has since become one of Canada's fastest-rising blues artists. Blending innovative, thoughtful songwriting with stunning blues guitar work, some music critics have drawn comparisons to Eric Clapton.

In its 2010 year-end review, Chris was named the "future of the blues" by Canada's Blues Underground Network. In 2013, Chris' sophomore album Better for You was hailed by critics as "a masterpiece," "the best Canadian blues-rock album of

2013," and "the sound of someone taking the blues to a new place."

The album spent three weeks at #1 on DAWG FM (Canada's only all blues FM station), attained significant airplay across Canada, the US and Europe, including on Sirius XM Bluesville, and was nominated for Best Blues Album by the German Record Critics' Association. Oregon's Cascade Blues Association called it "one of the finest releases from the Great White North in many a year."

Guests on Better For You included two-time Grammy



award-winner Mike Mattison (The Derek Trucks Band, The Tedeschi-Trucks Band), Blues Music award-nominee Shakura S'Aida, and Steve Marriner (MonkeyJunk).

Antonik's 2017 release Monarch was nominated for Recording of the Year at the 2018 Maple Blues Awards, and Chris was nominated for both Producer and Songwriter of the Year.

Chris has performed at major blues festivals across Canada, and has toured the US extensively, including performances at Buddy Guy's Legends in Chicago (for the 2015 Buddy Guy's Legends Blues

Festival), and Biscuits & Blues in San Francisco. In 2016, Chris returned to Buddy Guy's Legends in Chicago, and also undertook his first UK tour. Chris released his third studio record "Monarch" in April 2017, which was nominated for Recording of the Year (and Chris as producer) at the 2018 Maple Blues Awards. Chris was also nominated for Songwriter of the Year.



Lil' Ed & The Blues Imperials released eight Alligator albums between 1986 and 2012. With each one, the band's national and international stature grew as their fan base —known internationally as "Ed Heads"— continued to expand.

The group took home the Living Blues Award for Best Live Performer in 2011, 2012 and 2013. They won the prestigious Blues Music Award for Band Of The Year in both 2007 and 2009. The Associated Press says, "Williams fills Chicago's biggest shoes with more life and heat than anyone on stage today."

Meanwhile, their fiery music has more than stood the test of time. "We're not band members," says Williams, "we're family, and families stay together." JAREKUS SINGLETON

At just 32 years old, Jarekus Singleton is a musical trailblazer with a bold vision for the future of the blues. Springing from the same Mississippi soil as Charley Patton, Muddy Waters and B.B. King, Singleton's cutting-edge sound—equally rooted in rap, rock and blues traditions—is all his own. He melds hip-hop wordplay, rock energy and R&B grooves with contemporary and traditional blues, turning audiences of all ages into devoted fans. With his untamed guitar licks and strong, soulful voice effortlessly moving from ferocious and funky to slow and steamy to smoking hot, Singleton is a fresh, electrifying bluesman bursting at the seams with talent.

Singleton has been tearing up clubs and festivals across the South, and has performed twice at the world-renowned Chicago Blues Festival. He has been featured at South Carolina's Lowcountry Blues Festival and Festival of Discovery as well as many other festivals in the South and clubs throughout Mississippi. With the addition of high-visibility performances including Springing The Blues Festival, Biscuits & Blues in San Francisco, The North Atlantic Blues Festival, The PA Blues Festival, The Cincinnati Blues Festival, and The Festival International du Blues de Mont-Tremblant, Singleton is on the cusp of international stardom.

In 2009 he formed The Jarekus Singleton Blues Band, quickly building a reputation as a tremendously gifted musician and performer. Jarekus self-released his first CD, Heartfelt, in 2011, and fans and media quickly took notice of these brand new original songs. Three tracks from that CD play in regular rotation on B.B. King's Bluesville on SiriusXM Ra-

dio, the most-listened-to blues radio station in the world. But radio wasn't alone in praising the rising blues star, as the rest of the world began paying attention. Singleton was named a "star on the rise" by Blues & Rhythm magazine in the UK. Guitar Center named him the 2011 King of the Blues in Mississippi. He received the Jackson Music Award for 2012 Blues Artist of the Year and for 2013 Local Entertainer of the Year. The Jackson Free Press named him the 2013 Best Local Blues Artist.


Living Blues praised Singleton for his "emotional intensity," saying he "blends styles and elements across genres and generations." Audiences at his shows run the gamut from older blues fans to younger rockers and rap aficionados, all of whom call him their own. "Blues is honest music," says Singleton, who, with Refuse To Lose, is determined to put his own stamp on the genre. "I love the blues tradition, and have always been inspired by the masters. But I want to create something for today's audience that is as original and new as those blues masters were when they first started making records. I want to create blues for the 21st century."

CD Review



Lurrie Bell & the Bell Dynasty • *Tribute to Carey Bell*



Carey Bell was one of the greatest, and most underrated, of the postwar Chicago blues harp players. His progeny do him proud on this tribute and carry on the great blues tradition of the period. The four Bell sons are outstanding musicians in their own right.

Lurrie Bell is probably the best known of the sons. He has been one of the go to guitarists in Chicago for many years, although very underappreciated. But this is an ensemble work, with the other three brothers more than holding their own. There is also some fine work contributed by guests Charlie Musselwhite and Billy Branch on harp and vocals. They were contemporaries of Carey Bell and among the few players alive on Carey's level playing harmonica-although son Steve Bell is approaching his great skill.

There are songs included here that Carey wrote or was known for playing. Billy Branch contributes the heart-felt tribute, "Carey Bell Was a Friend of Mine". The song choices were well thought out.

This is classic post-war Chicago blues of the kind that I have loved for decades. This cd is a must-have for enthusiasts of the genre!
